Executive Letter

To the Citizens of St. Clair County:

On behalf of the St. Clair County Board of Health and Health Department staff, we are pleased to submit the 2021 Annual report to the St. Clair County Board, Illinois Department of Public Health, our community partners and the residents of St. Clair County.

In 2021, the <u>COVID-19 PANDEMIC</u> continued to have public health impacts on a global scale. The response in the United States involved widespread testing, phased vaccinations and tiered mitigations. These campaigns continued throughout 2021 in response to the numerous SARS-CO-V2 variants.

The response in St. Clair County began with the establishment of multiple testing sites, including an IDPH-led mass testing site, first hosted at the Jackie Joyner Kersee Center and then at the St. Clair Square mall. A mass vaccination site was established during February 2021 at the Belle-Clair Fairgrounds. This site was hosted in conjunction with Illinois Department of Public Health and the Illinois National Guard. It was one of the only a few large-scale drive through operations in Illinois. In addition, it was one of the largest sites in terms of vaccine administration in the State, with over 103,000 shots administered from February to May. The site was reopened from October through November of in order to assist in the administration of booster doses. The St. Clair County Health Department operation also hosted a smaller (drive through) vaccine clinic at 330 West Main Street in Belleville, Illinois. This site operated six days per week during the 2021 calendar year. Vaccine for children ages 5-11 was provided at the Health Department once it became available.

The size and scope of the response operations in St. Clair County necessitated the establishment of a call center to assist residents with registration for vaccine and general questions. The call center was made possible with the assistance of St. Clair County Emergency Management Agency (EMA) and IEMA/FEMA. A COVID-19 specific webpage and vaccine registration portal was created to provide current information to the public and assist in the provision of COVID-related services. A live Facebook briefing/question and answer session was routinely held and hosted by the SCC EMA, the Health Department and the County Board Chairman to aid in the dissemination of current information to Public. Social media was utilized to provide the public with

24/7 access to current statistics and resources. County officials participated in numerous media interviews and hosted the Governor's press conference on more than one occasion. St. Clair County Health Department, in conjunction with East Side Health District, BJC Memorial, St. Elizabeth's Hospital, Touchette and Southern Illinois Healthcare Foundation (SIHF) launched a Back-to-School media campaign during the Fall of 2021 to promote childhood immunizations, including COVID vaccinations.

The Health Department was the primary agency for contact tracing St. Clair County residents. Contact tracing staff were responsible for advising cases and their close contacts of current isolation and quarantine protocols and providing referrals for necessary resources to residents. IDPH began the transition to a State-centralized contact tracing system during December 2021. The Health Department continues to assist schools and long-term care facilities with outbreak situations.

We wish to extend our gratitude to all of the County agencies and community partners that assisted in the pandemic response. We would also like to extend a sincere and heartfelt thank you to the employees of St. Clair County Health Department for their dedicated service to the residents of St. Clair County. The residents and businesses of St. Clair County persevered despite the pandemic.

As we move into 2022, our priority is to continue to provide COVID-19 vaccinations and to disseminate the most current COVID information to St. Clair County residents, while maintaining our other core programs and expanding clinical services. The staff of the St. Clair County Health Department has and will continue to provide the utmost professional and dedicated services to protect our citizens.

Overview of SCCHD activities:

COVID-19 Response

- The St. Clair County Health Department facilitated the establishment of a St. Clair County Health & Medical Alliance, consisting of East Side Health District, BJC/Memorial, St. Elizabeth's Hospital, Touchette Hospital and Southern Illinois Healthcare Foundation (SIHF), to direct the COVID Pandemic Response.
- St. Clair County Health Department, in partnership with St. Clair County Emergency Management Agency, the St. Clair County Health and Medical Alliance, the Illinois Department of Public Health, and the Illinois EMA and Illinois National Guard, opened a drive-through mass vaccination site at Belle Clair Fairgrounds on Feb. 1, 2021, in response to the COVID pandemic. The site provided Pfizer, Moderna and the Janssen vaccine. More than 103, 000 doses of vaccine were administered at this site between February 1 and May 30, 2021. The site served as a model for drive thru operations. The Fairgrounds location was reopened in from October-November 2021 to administer booster doses.
- A second drive through location at 330 W. Main, Belleville, Illinois was established for vaccine administration and operated six days per week throughout 2021.
- A Back-to-School Vaccination media campaign was led by the Health Department in conjunction with the Health and Medical Alliance. Vaccine clinics for the 5–11-year-old population were held at the Health Department.
- The St. Clair County Health Department and MedStar ambulance service provided vaccine services to homebound populations and community-based vaccine clinics
- The Health Department, St. Clair County EMA, and IEMA/FEMA established a COVID call center to assist residents with COVID-related questions and vaccine registration appointments.
- The St. Clair County Medical Reserve Corps assisted in the pandemic response; 361 volunteers served a combined 1,486.25 hours
- The Health Department distributed 11,371 Binax test kits to community partners. The Health Department and the St. Clair County EMA continued to distribute COVID supplies to long term care, other medical providers, schools and municipalities throughout 2021.
- The Health Department and the call center provided 24/7 contact services for medical providers, schools and general public to assist with COVID-related questions, responding to tens of thousands of phone calls and emails concerning COVID-19.
- SCCHD staff routinely participated in the 3:30 daily/weekly St. Clair County Emergency Management Agency COVID LIVE briefing, providing current COVID information to residents
- Health Department social media was utilized to provide statistical updates to the community on a daily basis.
- The Health Department maintained routine services and programs during 2021, while responding to the COVID pandemic. A new division was created, Clinical Services and Systems, to facilitate the future expansion of clinical services.

In response to the surge of COVID-19 across the United States, Illinois and the St. Clair County region, St. Clair County Health Department (SCCHD), St. Clair County Emergency Management Agency (SCCEMA) and St. Clair County (SCC) – in conjunction with St. Clair County Health & Medical Alliance – East Side Health District, Memorial/BJC Hospital, HSHS St. Elizabeth's Hospital, SIHF/Touchette Hospital – Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA), Illinois National Guard (ILNG) – opened a COVID-19 Mass Vaccination Drive-Thru Site at Belle Clair Fairgrounds in Belleville, Illinois Monday, February 1, 2021. The site was open six days a week. Vaccinations were originally given by appointment only. St. Clair County Transit District (SCCTD) provided free public transportation. Moving through all phases of the COVID Vaccine, this site operated from February 1, 2021, through May 30, 2021.

As booster shots were approved and rolled out, the Mass Vaccination site at Belle-Clair Fairgrounds was re-opened October 5, 2021, and operated through November 10, 2021, with the goal of distributing COVID booster vaccines to all eligible residents.

A drive-thru vaccine clinic at 330 West Main Street, Belleville, Illinois was operational, ready and waiting to distribute vaccine by the end December 2020. Vaccine for the "1b" population began January 25th, 2021. Operations at 330 West Main ran six days a week throughout 2021, into 2022.



COVID-19 Pandemic The *Public's Response...*



January 1 - December 31, 2021

Overview of SCCHD Activities by Division

Environmental Programs

- The Environmental Health staff continue using the CDP system for Food Service inspections. Field use of tablets has been very helpful and reduces the time spent writing the report and increases legibility.
- As required under our Intergovernmental Agreement with IEPA for solid waste management in St. Clair County, staff conducted 77 landfill/compost/open dump inspections, 75 complaint investigations/recheck investigations and 184 public consultations.
- Continued a medication free drop off program located at the St. Clair County Sheriff's Department through the coordinated efforts of Illinois American, Southwestern Illinois College, the St. Clair County Health Department and Veolia, Inc.
- ➤ Earth Day celebration and Awards were cancelled due to COVID -19.
- ➤ Worked with IEPA to offer a Government ONLY used tire collection in October totaling over 99 dump truckloads or approximately 110.22 tons of tires to be recycled.
- ➤ Conducted over 1673 smoking/tanning/vector consultations, 11 smoking complaint investigations at facilities.
- Conducted 2,226 sanitary food inspections, 11,203 consultations, 31 foodborne illness investigations and 3 educational training with 26 participants.
- Conducted 2 food safety training classes for the volunteers participating in the Belleville Chili Cook-off, Oktoberfest, Art on the Square.
- ➤ Permitted and inspected 111 Private Sewage Disposal systems and conducted 1,253 consultations via on-sites or telephone; and 1 home loan inspection.
- ➤ Made numerous contacts to local providers of food items being recalled because of possible bacterial contamination, for example; E. coli 0157:H7, Listeria monocytogenes, Salmonella and others. Posted 50 food recall notifications on website and social media.
- Conducted mosquito surveillance throughout the county, with 2 sites positive for West Nile Virus and we have had NO human cases of WNV.
- Assisted in running several mobile vaccination clinics throughout the county and the 1 permanent location at 330 West Main Street in Belleville, and the temporary location at the Belle-Clair Fairgrounds.

Health Promotion & Wellness

➤ Provided breast and cervical cancer screening and diagnostic services for 376 women in St. Clair and 9 surrounding counties through the Illinois Breast and Cervical Cancer Program (BCCP) in 2021. We are very proud that we were able to serve these women despite BCCP staff being pulled into COVID-19 duties. BCCP staff members continue to participate in a coalition with Washington University. Our BCCP Community Navigator actively participated on two workgroups, the Community Navigator Database Workgroup to help create a new navigator database and the Employer Policy Change Workgroup to help establish protocol for navigators to use while addressing employers to change policy on health and wellness.

January 1 - December 31, 2021

Health Promotion & Wellness (Continued)

- > Applied for a new competitive grant for Genetics and was one of only two health departments selected in our region to receive grant funding to carry out new initiatives for the genetics program. We will be a part of an Illinois Regional Genetic Services Workgroup to review, revise and revitalize the former Genetics Education and Follow-up program.
- ➤ Partnered with the Metro East Diaper Bank and with funding from Healthier Together, started a Diaper Depot Program at St. Clair County Health Department for active WIC participants. Eligible participants receive diapers at no cost, monthly, until the child reaches age 3.
- > Provided breast and cervical cancer screening and diagnostic services for 376 women in St. Clair and 9 surrounding counties through the Illinois Breast and Cervical Cancer Program (BCCP) in 2021. We are very proud that we were able to serve these women despite BCCP staff being pulled into COVID-19 duties. BCCP staff members continue to participate in a coalition with Washington University. Our BCCP Community Navigator actively participated on two workgroups, the Community Navigator Database Workgroup to help create a new navigator database and the Employer Policy Change Workgroup to help establish protocol for navigators to use while addressing employers to change policy on health and wellness.
- > Applied for a new competitive grant for Genetics and was one of only two health departments selected in our region to receive grant funding to carry out new initiatives for the genetics program. We will be a part of an Illinois Regional Genetic Services Workgroup to review, revise and revitalize the former Genetics Education and Follow-up program.
- ➤ Partnered with the Metro East Diaper Bank and with funding from Healthier Together, started a Diaper Depot Program at St. Clair County Health Department for active WIC participants. Eligible participants receive diapers at no cost, monthly, until the child reaches age 3.
- ➤ Maternal/child preventive health services provided to families were decreased this year due to the COVID pandemic, though the clinic never ceased operations during this time.
- > Some services in the clinic were either reduced or offered remotely via phone due to the COVID 19 pandemic. Home visiting services were put on hold. The WIC program has COVID waivers to continue to be able to provide services remote through April 2022.
- ➤ Administered 1,481 immunizations for vaccine preventable childhood illnesses.
- > Screened children and 129 pregnant women for lead exposure
- Screened 79 children for developmental delays.
- > Screened 209 women for genetic risk factors and 865 for postpartum depression.
- > Provided 726 supportive services to promote breastfeeding.
- Conducted 869 case management contacts for pregnant women and infants.

Clinical Services & Systems

➤ The Clinical Services and Systems Division was established late in 2021. This Division is currently in a research and development phase.

January 1 – December 31, 2021

Infectious Disease Prevention Programs

- ➤ Was awarded the Illinois Department of Public Health Ryan White Part B grant for FY21 and FY22 in the amount of \$1,694,107 each year. Funding provides core medical and supportive services for Persons Living with HIV/AIDS (PLWHA).
- Successfully completed two (2) Requests for Proposals to provide Medical Case Management and Oral Health Care services through the Ryan White Part A grant with the City of St. Louis Department of Public Health. SCCHD received \$412,000 to provide these services, including food bank/home delivered meals and health insurance continuation.
- Continued to subcontract with ten (10) agencies and six (6) vendors to provide Ryan White Part A and B services over to 697 unduplicated PLWHA.
- Established a new Business Agreement with Lyft for the transportation of eligible clients to needed HIV related services.
- ➤ Began providing cellular phones to PLWHA in need with no or limited income to assist in medical appointment and as a result, treatment compliance.
- Secured an MOU with Southern Illinois University Edwardsville to provide HIV testing, education, and safer sex materials to reduce HIV transmission.
- Since January 1, 2021, 717 Persons Living with HIV/AIDS received Ryan White Case Management services across the 12 County region. 177 clients received emergency financial assistance, 426 received food bank/home delivered meals, 69 received medical transportation, 179 received oral health care, 79 received assistance with out-of-pocket HIV related medical costs, and 134 received supportive transportation.
- ➤ Established (2) new housing contracts with the Intergovernmental Grants Department (IGD) to provide tenant based rental assistance for 24 PLWHA. The programs are designed to assist individuals who are homeless or at imminent risk of homelessness.
- ➤ In partnership with SIHF Healthcare and Madison County Health Department, SCCHD provided HIV/STI education and HIV testing at the Metro East LGBT Pride Festival on October 2nd, 2021.
- ➤ Provided 33 HIV tests, notified two (2) individuals of HIV positive status and opened 137 surveillance cases.
- ➤ Provided Gender Diversity Training on July 1, 2021, for subcontracted HIV program staff, clients and SCCHD personnel.
- Conducted disease investigation, partner services, monitoring, and/or provided education and mitigation strategies for the following cases: 942 Chlamydia, two (2) E-Coli, 448 Gonorrhea, 14 Invasive Streptococcal, one (1) Hepatitis A, 15 Hepatitis B, 54 Hepatitis C, 11 HIV, one (1) influenza, 23,516 COVID-19, 11 Salmonella, and 81 Syphilis.
- Conducted 308 Tuberculosis related field visits for Directly Observed Therapy and 482 Video Observed Therapy sessions. There were 987 TB related clinic visits, 40 referrals were made for diagnostic chest x-rays, and 439 TB skin tests were completed, with 30 positive tests. Twelve TB positive patients were seen by the Medical Director.
- ➤ Conducted 12,670 illness investigation consultations.
- ➤ Provided CPR certification for 29 St. Clair County staff at Adult and Juvenile Probation and the Juvenile Detention Center. Ensured AED equipment across county departments were replenished and in working condition.

January 1 - December 31, 2021

Infectious Disease Programs (Continued)

- ➤ Distributed PPE and/or Binax test kits to long term care facilities, medical providers, and other county partners.
- ➤ Participated in 130 emergency preparedness related partnership meetings (HOPE Coalition, schools, Emergency Management Systems and meetings with other community partners)
- Established 94 new Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) volunteers, who assisted with providing vaccinations, drawing vaccine, office support, call center tasks, and stats. The MRC unit is comprised of 115 volunteers who served a total of 1,303 hours.
- Successfully completed an application for the Medical Reserve Corps Operational Readiness Award and received \$5,000 to expand outreach events, purchase a volunteer management program, and provide members with uniform shirts.

Administration

- In addition to the health department's main location at 19 Public Square, the health department's Information Technology (IT) Manager supported the data and equipment needs for both the Mass Vaccination Site and 330 West Main Site, seven days a week between all locations through May 30, 2021, and again in October of 2021. The IT manager also provided IT support for all facets of COVID-19 response including virtual meeting platforms and remote worker configuration and support.
- ➤ The Accounting Staff, in addition to normal health department activities, navigated equipment rentals and supplies for the vaccine sites and provided oversite for grant monies related to the COVID Pandemic.
- The Administrative staff assisted in navigating COVID activities and communications with the public on all aspects of COVID from testing to vaccine.
- The Organizational Communications Manager (OCM) sent 255 daily press releases over the course of 2021 outlining COVID information for St. Clair County, Region 4 and the State of Illinois. In addition, OCM onboarded several temporary and regular health department employees to meet the staffing needs of the COVID pandemic.





2022 SCCHD PRIORITY GOALS

- ➤ Ensure all residents of St. Clair County have COVID-19 vaccine availability and assist with and promote vaccine administration. Work with our community partners to achieve this as soon as vaccine becomes available, prioritizing those individuals who are at highest risk for SARS CoV-2 morbidity and mortality.
- ➤ Continue conducting COVID-19 contact tracing activities for Long Term Care (LTC) facilities and report, monitor, and ensure mitigation strategies are in place for outbreaks in schools, LTC facilities, and other jurisdictional entities.
- ➤ Incorporate routine HIV testing into SCCHD clinical services.
- Implement 3rd party billing for HIV testing.
- Implement rapid gonorrhea and chlamydia testing
- ➤ Work toward the establishment of a comprehensive STI clinic.
- Establish MOUs with colleges, middle schools, and high schools in SCCHD jurisdiction to provide comprehensive sexual health education and HIV testing/safer sex supplies where applicable.
- Improve data collection and monitoring efforts to inform quality improvement projects and social media marketing activities.
- Target individuals and communities most at risk for acquiring communicable diseases, including HIV/STIs, to reduce the rates of transmission.
- ➤ Identify and apply for funding opportunities to provide Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) services at SCCHD.
- Continue to ensure revenues exceed expenses
- Secure additional funding to support added covid-19 programs and services.
- Reduce infant deaths caused by unsafe sleep habits.
- Expand on-site garden and cooking demonstrations to promote healthy cooking and eating with fresh fruits and vegetables, especially in food desert areas.
- Expand private insurances as payment source for both children and adults.
- ➤ Reduce disparities in breast cancer screening, and maternal morbidity and mortality in our African-American women.
- ➤ Achieve PHAB reaccreditation and complete Community Health Assessment/IPLAN.
