The regular meeting of the Environment Committee of the St. Clair County Board was called to order on Tuesday, August 25, 2015 in the St. Clair County Board Conference Room, #10 Public Square, Belleville, Illinois, by Dave Tiedemann.

Environment Committee Report, August 25, 2015

From EDG meeting, August 18, 2015

- 68 Environmental contacts were made during the month of July
 - 1 Open Dump site was initiated
 - 2 Open Dump site were closed
 - 4 Landfill Inspections were conducted
 - 1 Compost Site Inspection was conducted
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- SB 2042 Passed House and headed to Senate on the 19th. Bill approves release of federal funds which supports several Health Department programs.
 - Flu vaccines will be delivered soon to SCCHD for the upcoming season. Notices will be sent when flu shot clinics are available for employees and dependants.
 - A joint news release (SCCHD, Madison County Health Department & East Side Health District) on West Nile Virus was sent out to all media outlets.
 - The St. Clair County Health Department is sponsoring a campaign during October to urge people to Go Green and practice the 3R's – Reduce, Reuse & Recycle. Residents are asked to voluntarily fill out cards pledging to recycle their solid waste. The cards will be collected by the Health Department and used in a live drawing on Friday, November 13, 2015 at 11:00 AM. Prizes TBA.
 - The Environmental Protection Annual Report was given to EDG members.
 - Discussion was held about Water Supply Code changes. Motion carried to send to Environment Committee for approval.
