9-c-3 ORDINANCE - AMENDING CHAPTER 36 "TAXATION" OF REVISED CODE OF ORDINANCES.

ORDENDANCE NO. 15-1120

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED \$39,820,000 TAXABLE GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BOINGS (ALITERNATE REVENUE SOURCE). SERIES 2015, OF THE COUNTY OF ST. CLAIR, ILLINOIS, PROVIDING FOR THE FAYMENT OF CERTAIN OUTSTANDING ALTERNATE BONDS OF SAID COUNTY, PROVIDING FOR THE LBVY OF A DIRECT ANNUAL TAX SUFFICIENT TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST THEREON. AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE EXECUTION OF AN ESCROW AGREEMENT IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS.

The following words and terms used in this ordinance shall have the following meanings unless the context or use clearly indicates another or different meaning is intended:

SECTION 2. INCORPORATION OF PREAMBLES.

The Board hereby finds that all of the recitale contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and does incorporate them into the Ordinance by this reference.

SECTION 3. DETERMINATION TO ISSUE BOMDS.

It is necessary and in the best interests of the County to refund the Refunded Bonds, and that the Bonda be issued by the County for such purpose and for the purpose of paying the costs of issuing the Bonds.

SECTION 4. BOND DETAILS.

For the purpose of refunding the Refunded Bonda and paying costs associated therewith, there shall be issued and sold the Bonda in an original principal amount of not to exceed \$39,820,000, in one or more series, each designated as a "Taxable General Obligation Refunding Bond (Alternate Revenue Source), series 2015" and bearing auch further aeries designation as may be set forth in the Bond Notification, and shall also bear the date of authentication thereof. The Bonds shall be dated as of the date or dates provided in the Bond Notification, and shall also bear the date of authentication thereof. The Bonds shall be in fully registered form, shall he in the denominatione set forth in the Bond Notification (but no single Bond shall represent principal maturing on more than one date), and shall

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be numbered in such reasonable fashion as may be subject to mandatory redemption per year) and bearing interest at the rates per annum (not to exceed 9.90% per annum), as set forth in the Bond Notification.

Each Bond shall bear interest from the later of its date or from the most recent interest payment date to which interest has been paid or duly provided for, until the principal amount of such Bond is paid or duly provided for, such interest (computed upon the basis of a 360-day year consisting of twelve 30-day months) being payable semi-annually commencing with the first interest payment date as set forth in the Bond Notification, and on April 1 and October 1 of each year thereafter to maturity.

Interest on each Bond shall be paid by check or draft of the Bond Registrar, payable upon presentation in lawful money of the United States of America at the principal corporate trust office of the Bond Registrar.

SECTION 5. EXECUTION AUTHENTICATION.

The Bonda shall be executed on behalf of the County with the manual or facsimile signature of the Chairman of the County Board and attested with the manual or facsimile signature of the County Clerk and shall have impressed or imprinted thereon the corporate seal of the County. In case any officer whose signature shall appear on any Bond shell cease to be such officer before the delivery of such Bond, such signature shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes, the same as if such officer had remained in office until delivery.

All Bonds shall have thereon a certificate of authentication substantially in the form hereinafter set forth duly executed by the Bond Registrar as authenticating agent of the County and showing the date of authentication. No Bond shall be valid or obligatory for any purpose or be entitled to any security or benefit under the Ordinance unless and until such certificate of authentication shall have been duly executed by the Bond Registrar by manual signature, and such certificate of authentication upon any such Bond shall be conclusive evidence that such Bond has been authenticated and delivered under this Ordinance. The certificate of authentication on any such Bond shall be conclusive evidence that such Bond has been authenticated and delivered under this Ordinance. The certificate of authentication on any Bond shall be deemed to have been executed by it if signed by an authorized officer of the Bond Registrar, but it shall not be necessary that the same officer sign the certificate of authentication on all of the Bonds issued hereunder.

SECTION 6. REGISTRATION OF BONDS; PERSONS TREATED AS OWNERS.

GENERAL.

The County shall cause the Bond Register to be kept at the principal corporate trust office of the Bond Registrar, which is hereby constituted and appointed the registrar of the County for the Bonds. The County is authorized to prepare, and the Bond Registrar or such other agent as the County may designate shall keep custody of, multiple Bond blanks executed by the County for use in the transfer and exchange of Bonds.

Any Bond may be transferred or exchanged, but only in the manner, subject to the limitations, and upon payment of the charges as set forth in the Ordinance. Upon surrender for transfer or exchange of any Bond at the principal corporate trust office of the Bond Registrar, duly endorsed by or accompanied by a written instrument or instruments of transfer or exchange in form satisfactory to the Bond Registrar and duly executed by the registered owner or an attorney for such owner duly authorized in writing, the county shall execute and the Bond Registrar shall authenticate, date and deliver in the name of the transferee or transferees or, in the case of an exchange, the registered owner, a new fully registered Bond or Bonds of like tenor, of the same maturity, bearing the same interest rate, of authorized denominations, for a like aggregate principal amount.

GLOBAL BOOK-ENTRY SYSTEM.

The Bonds shall be initially issued in the form of a separate single fully registered Bond for each of the maturities of the Bonds as provided in Section 4 hereof, and the ownership of each such Bond shall be registered in the Bond Register in the name of Cede & Co., or any successor thereto ("Cede"), as nominee of The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York, and its successors and assigns ("DTC"). All of the outstanding Bonds shall be registered in the Bond Register in the name of Cede, as nominee of CTC, except as hereinafter provided. The Chairman of the County of the Board and the County Clerk are hereby authorized to execute and deliver on behalf of the County such letters to or agreements with DTC and the Bond Registrar as shall be necessary to effectuate such book-entry system (any such letter or agreement being referred to herein as the "Representation Letter").

SECTION 7. REDEMPTION.

OPTIONAL REDEMPTION

The bonds due on and after the date specified in the Bond Notification, if any, shall be subject to redemption prior to maturity at the option of the County from any available funds, on and after October 1 of the year specified in the Bond Notification, in whole or in part on any date, and if in part, from such maturity or maturities as the County may determine, and if less than an entire maturity, in integral multiples of \$5,000, selected by the principal amount redeemed, but not in excess of 103%) plus accrued interest to the date fixed for redemption as set forth in the Bond Notification.

FINANCIAL REIMBURSEMENT INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE ST. CLAIR COUNTY TRANSIT DISTRICT AND THE COUNTY OF ST. CLAIR AND SHERIFF OF ST. CLAIR COUNTY.

WHEREAS, the County and Sheriff are joint employers of sworn deputy sheriffs; and

WHEREAS, the County and Sheriff contract with the Bi-State Development Agency of the Miasouri-Illinois Matropolitan District ("Bi-State") to provide police services upon MetroLink trains and properties; and

WHEREAS, The District contracts with Bi-State to reimburse Bi-State for the costs of obtaining police services upon MetroLink trains and properties from the County and Sheriff; and

WHEREAS, the District, the County and the Sheriff have each determined that it is in their bast interest, and the beat interest of their respective citizens, to provide sworn St. Clair County deputy aheriffs upon MetroLink trains and properties to better protect their citizens, and

WHEREAS, the agreements in place among the District, the County, the Sheriff and Bi-State provide for reimbursement to the County and Sheriff for the wages and benefits of the sworn deputy sheriffs performing work upon the MetroLink; and

WHEREAS, the agreements in place among the District, the County, the Sheriff and Bi-State do not currently provide for reimbursement to the County and Sheriff of the salf-insured retention costs associated with workers' compensation claims of the sworn deputy sheriffs performing work upon the MetroLink: and

WHEREAS, the District, the County, and the Sheriff agree that is necessary and proper for the District to reimburse the County and Sheriff for the self-insured retention costs associated with workers compensation claims of the sworm deputy sheriffs performing work upon the MetroLink to ensure the continued viability of the arrangement providing for sworn deputy sheriffs performing work upon the MetroLink; and

WHEREAS, the District has agreed to reimburse the County and Sheriff for the self-insured retention costs associated with workers' compensation claims of the sworn deputy sheriffs performing work upon the MetroLink; and

WHEREAS, the District, the County, and the Sheriff believe it is in the best interest of their respective bodies to enter into this Intergovernmental Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE THE DISTRICT, THE COUNTY, AND THE SHERIFF HEREBY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. PREAMBLES

The preambles set forth above are true and correct and are hereby incorporated by reference.

2. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Intergovernmental Agreement is to provide for full reimbursement to the County and Sheriff of the self-insured retention costs associated with workers' compensation claims of the sworn deputy sheriffs performing work upon the MetroLink by the District to ensure the continued visbility of the MetroLink patrol, and to better protect their citizens.

3. LEGAL BASIS

This Agreement is executed pursuant to the provisions of Article VII, Section 10, of the Constitution of Illinois of 1970 and pursuant to the provisions of the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1. It is the intent of the parties to exercise to the fullest extent permitted by law the authority granted them under the constitutional and statutory provisions.

4. COUNTY AND SHERIFF OBLIGATIONS.

- (a) Exercise good faith in defending workers' compensation claims brought by sworn deputy sheriffs performing work upon the Metrolink, provided that the County and Sheriff may opt in their sole discretion to resolve and/or settle any such claims; and
- (b) Submit written requests for reimbursement to the District for self-insured retention costs associated with workers' compensation claims of the sworn deputy sheriffs performing work upon the MetroLink; and
- (c) Upon request from the District, provide non-privileged documentation, to the extent allowed by privacy laws, concerning the workers' compensation claims that are the basis for the reimbursement request.

S. DISTRICT OBLIGATIONS.

Provide for full reimbursement to the County and Sheriff of the self-insured retention costs associated with workers' compensation claims of the sworn deputy sheriffs performing work upon the MetroLink pursuant to the Police Services Agreement entered into between Bi-State and the County and Sheriff.

6 COOPERATION

The District, the County, and the Sheriff agree to cooperate and take all action necessary to effectuate the terms of this Intergovernmental Agreement including but not limited to executing all documents or other writings necessary thereom.

7. GENERAL PROVISIONS AND ENTIRE AGREEMENT.

Thie Agreement represents the entire Agreement of the parties and may only be amended in writing and by mutual agreement of the parties. The execution of any amendment to this Agreement shall be authorized only by the passage of a resolution or ordinance of the corporate authorities of each party.

8. SEVERABILITY

If any part of this Agreement is adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of this Agreement as a whole or any other part thereof.

9. NON-ASSIGNMENT.

This Agreement shall not be assigned or transferred by any party hereto without the prior written consent of the other party.

10. TERMINATION.

Any party may terminate this Agreement by providing written notice to the other parties 90 days in advance of termination. Otherwise, this Agreement shall terminate when sworn deputy sheriffs cease to work upon the MetroLink pursuant to the Police Services Agreement with Bi-State.

11. CONTINUING EFFECT

The District shall have a continuing obligation to make reimbursements as set forth in Paragraph 5 for any workers' compensation claims of sworn deputy sheriffs performing work upon the MetroLink in which the date of injury precedes the date of termination of this Agreement.

Mr. Neiligenatein inquired if Metro Counties is lobbying for us to defeat NB695 so we are not under a PTEL umbrella? Dr. Moore advised they are actively lobbying. Chairman Kern further advised that Metro Counties is also lobbying against unfunded mandates.

Mr. Tiedemann inquired as to the progress on the Migh Speed Rail study in East St. Louis. Chairman Kern advised that he was recently in Springfield and fully expects to be included on one of the two alignments with a station in St. Clair County. We believe that is the best spot.
