# # 9-a-1 RESOLUTION - FURTHER AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION TO THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ADMINISTRATION (EDA) OF THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE.

RESOLUTION NO. 2111-15-R

A RESOLUTION FURTHER AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION TO THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ADMINISTRATION (EDA) OF THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE

WHEREAS, St. Clair County submitted a grant application to EDA on June 12, 2015, in the original amount of \$3,168,000, as part of an infrastructure project for the proposed River Bridge District in East St. Louis; and

WHEREAS, the revised EDA funding shall now be \$3,537,052 (with a project total of \$8,788,755 of which \$8,038,755 is tied to EDA eligible project activities and costs); and

WHEREAS, EDA in a letter dated July 31, 2015, asked for additional documentation and assurances which were submitted to EDA on August 13, 2015 and/or August 14, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the County wishes to designate the Southwestern Illinois Regional Planning Commission as the administrative organization for the EDA grant working in conjunction with the County Intergovernmental Grants Department (IGD); and

WHEREAS, the County designates Terry W. Beach, Executive Director of St. Clair County IGD, as the authorized representative of St. Clair County and further authorizes Mr. Beach's execution of the EDA grant application and grant agreement under the terms set forth herein; and

WHEREAS, the County has secured local funding and commits fully to the required matching funds and hereby confirms that St. Clair County is responsible for the implementation of this project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that St. Clair County supports the River Bridge District Project, supports the EDA application submission for funding, designates Southwestern Illinois Planning Commission as the administrative organization, and is responsible for fully implementing the project.

# # 9-b-2 ORDINANCE - AMENDING CHAPTER 19, ARTICLE VI, WATER SUPPLY CODE, REVISED CODE OF ORDINANCES.

ORDINANCE NO. <u>15-1133</u>

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 19, ARTICLE VI, "WATER SUPPLY CODE" OF THE REVISED CODE OF ORDINANCES OF ST. CLAIR COUNTY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS, THAT:

SECTION I: AMENDMENT. Chapter 19, Article VI "WATER SUPPLY CODE" is hereby AMENDED to read as follows:

SEE ATTACHED

SECTION II: INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES REPEALED. All Ordinances or parts of other Ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance shall, to the extent of the conflict, be, and are hereby repealed, provided that nothing herein shall in any way excuse or prevent prosecution of any previous existing violation of any Ordinance superseded hereby.

Nothing in this Ordinance hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any SECTION III: SAVING CLAUSE. suit or proceeding pending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed by this Ordinance, nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by the Ordinance.

SECTION IV: PASSAGE AND PUBLICATION. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from its passage of publication by the County Clerk as provided by law and shall continue in effect and operation until lawfully repealed by the St. Clair County Board.

### # 9-c-4 ST. CLAIR COUNTY LINGUISTIC AND CULTURAL COMPETENCY PLAN.

ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS Linguistic and Cultural Competency Plan 10 Public Square, Belleville, IL 62220

The Linguistic and Cultural Competency Plan (LCC) has been developed to address St. Clair County's (County) responsibilities as a recipient of federal assistance as they relate to the needs of individuals with limited English language skills, low literacy, visually impaired or deaf or hard of hearing.

Executive Order 13166, titled Improving Access to Services for Persons with Limited English Proficiency; (LEP) indicates that differing treatment based upon a person's inability to speak, read, write or understand English is a type of national origin discrimination. This order applies to all state and local agencies that receive federal funds.

St. Clair County has prepared this Plan, which defines the actions the County will take to ensure reasonable meaningful access to services, programs and activities for persons who have limited English proficiency, are visually impaired or are deaf or hard of hearing and may require the services of an interpreter or translator.

This plan has been prepared in accordance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 42 U.S.C. 2000d, et seq, and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, American With Disabilities Act 2008, the Illinois Human Rights Act and the 1970 U.S. Constitution of the United States, which prohibits discrimination on grounds of race, color, sex, religion, national origin, age, ancestry, marital status, disability, or inability to speak or comprehend the English language.

The plan was completed after the County conducted a Limited English Proficiency Self-Assessment (attachment 1).

# PURPOSE

The purpose of this plan is to ensure clients of the County have meaningful access to services, programs and activities although they may be limited in their English language proficiency, visually impaired, low literacy or deaf or hard of hearing. Limited English Proficiency is defined as the inability to speak, read, write or understand the English language at a level that permits the client to fully understand the nature of the services they are receiving.

DESCRIPTION OF ST. CLAIR COUNTY
St. Clair County is the oldest county and one of 102 counties in Illinois. The County government center is located at 10 Public Square, Belleville, IL, 62220. According to the 2010 census, the population of St. Clair County is 270,064, residing in 22 townships located in urban, suburban, and rural areas. St. Clair County is the eighth most populous county in Illinois and the most populous in the Southern part of the State. Belleville is the County Seat.

# CC DEMOGRAPHICS

St. Clair County is located east of St. Louis, Missouri. It has a budget of more than \$175,218,000 million annually, receives federal grants and employs fewer than 1,000 people. According to 2012 census estimates, 65.5 percent of the population of the County is white alone, 30.6 percent is black alone, and 3.5 percent is Hispanic or Latino alone. About 3.9 percent of the population is identified as Asian, American Indian, Alaskan Native, Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander or two or more races. Approximately 15,300 LEP residents are eligible to be served by the County, according to the 2014 St. Clair County Health Department Limited English Proficiency Self-Assessment.

The 2014 U.S. Census information indicates that for "Language Spoken at Home for the Citizen Population 18 Years and Over Who Speak English less than 'very well' for St. Clair County breaks down as follows:

- Speak Spanish or Spanish Creole 855 people
- Speak other Indo European language 605 people
- Speak Asian or Pacific Island language 390 people
- Speak other language 80 people

The top languages in St. Clair County are English, Spanish, Mandarin and Arabic. The primary language of the individuals served by the County is English. Only 2.7 percent of St. Clair County residents speak Spanish.

# ACCESS TO SERVICES

St. Clair County will ensure access to timely, quality language assistance services to individuals with Limited English Proficiency that are deaf, hard of hearing, visually impaired or low literacy. Marilyn Vise, Communications Manager, 618-233-7703, is the staff member responsible for overseeing the overall St. Clair County LCC plan. Each department is responsible for administering, on a daily basis, requests for interpreter/translator services.

### PLAN SHMMARY

St. Clair County developed this plan to help identify reasonable steps for providing language assistance to persons with Limited English Proficiency who wish to access services provided by the County. This plan outlines how to identify a person who may need language assistance, the ways the assistance may be provided and how to notify LEP persons that assistance is available.

We believe this is a good thing having multiple eyes looking at things in the various departments. If you were to go to this recommendation, the Federal looking at things in the various departments. Then we would be forced to use the small pool of people that they pick rather than going out and finding an auditor. The St. Clair County Board shall post the national flag of the United States of America at every location to which this provision applies.

SECTION 3: Conflicting Ordinances. Any conflicting ordinances, code provisions or pertinent portions thereof in effect at the time this Ordinance takes effect are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, Effective. approval, and publication as provided by law.
