IT WAS MOVED BY JERRY DINGES AND SECONDED BY C. DAVID TIEDEMANN TO APPROVE THE MINUTES. MOTION CARRIED.

FRANK BERGMAN READ ALL THE CORRESPONDENCE FOR THE MONTH. IT WAS MOVED BY C. DAVID TIEDEMANN AND SECONDED BY ANGELA GROSSMANN-ROEWE TO ACCEPT AND PLACE ON FILE ALL CORRESPONDENCE AND REPORTS. MOTION CARRIED.

HERBERT SIMMONS PRESENTED A WRITTEN REPORT FOR THE SEPTEMBER ACTIVITIES OF EMA. HERB ALSO REPORTED THE BIGGEST ACCOMPLISHMENT WAS A NEW RADIO TOWER IN MILLSTADT IS UP AND RUNNING. IT WAS MOVED BY ROY MOSLEY AND SECONDED BY JERRY DINGES. MOTION CARRIED.

MAJ. TOM KNAPP REPORTED THAT THE JAIL POPULATION WAS 383 AS OF 2:00PM TODAY WHICH IS GOOD BECAUSE THE LAST COUPLE OF MONTHS THE POPULATION WAS IN THE 420'S. MAJ. TOM KNAPP ALSO REPORTED THE ROLL OUT OF THE NEW TIME KEEPING SYSTEM TO THE SUPERVISORS IS STILL IN TEST MODE AND THE TRAINING SESSIONS ARE GOING WELL. PLANS ARE TO GO LIVE IN ABOUT SIX WEEKS. HE ALSO REPORTED ABOUT THE FOP. MAJ KNAPP THE SHERIFF AND THE LABOR ATTORNEY MEET WITH DAN MAHR AND DEBRA MOORE LATE LAST WEEK AND WE ARE IN A POSITION NOW TO MAKE A BEST AND FINAL OFFER TO THE UNION TO SETTLE THE CONTRACT WITH THE CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS. WE HAVE BEEN TOLD BUT NOT ASSURED BUT TOLD THAT THE OFFER WILL STAND WHEN THEY ACCEPT IT. IT HAS BEEN RECOMMENDED BY THEIR REPRESENTATIVE TO ACCEPT IT. THE GOOD NEWS IS HOPEFULLY WE CAN AVOID ARBITRATION AGAIN. DIXIE SEIBERT ASKED MAJ KNAPP, YOU HAVE A TOTAL OF HOW MANY MEN. MAJ KNAPP STATED APPROXIMATELY BETWEEN 15 TO 18 SERGEANTS, LIEUTENANTS AND CAPTAINS AND THE SUPERINTENDENT, 55 CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS WHEN WE ARE FULL. DIXIE SEIBERT ALSO ASKED IF WE WERE OVER CROWDED. MAJ KNAPP REPLIED NO

WE ARE UNDER CAPACITY. CAPACITY IS 418 AND WE HAVE A POPULATION OF 383. IT WAS MOVED BY JERRY DINGES AND SECONDED BY ANGELA GROSSMANN-ROEWE TO APPROVE THE MINUTES. MOTION CARRIED.

FRANK BERGMAN REPORTED TO THE COMMITTEE THAT HE REVIEWED THE ACCIDENT REPORTS WITH ALL REPORTING OFFICES HAVING TAKEN THE APPROPRIATE ACTIONS. IT WAS MOVED BY ANGELA GROSSMANN-ROEWE AND SECONDED BY ROY MOSLEY JR. TO ACCEPT ALL REPORTS. MOTION CARRIED.

THERE BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS, IT WAS MOVED BY JERRY DINGES AND SECONDED BY ANGELA GROSSMANN-ROEWE TO ADJOURN. MOTION CARRIED.
