9-b-3 ORDINANCE - AMENDING CHAPTER 36, "TAXATION", ARTICLE XV, CIRCUIT CLERK, DIVISION V-CRIMINAL FEES.

ORDINANCE NO. _16-1146_

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 36, "TAXATION", ARTICLE XV,
"CIRCUIT CLERK" DIVISION V-CRIMINAL FEES
OF THE REVISED CODE OF ORDINANCES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS, THAT:

SECTION I: Amendment. Chapter 36, Article XV, Section 36-15-__ and Section 36-15-__, "TAXATION" is hereby AMENDED and new sections added to read as follows:

Division V - Criminal Fees

36-15-__ County Drug Court Fee

The Clerk of the Court shall collect a mandatory fee of \$5.00 to be paid by the defendant on a judgment of guilty or grant of supervision for a violation of the Illinois Vehicle Code or a violation of a similar provision contained in a county or municipal ordinance committed in St. Clair County;

or

in addition to any fine imposed under Section 5-9-1 of the Unified Code of Corrections, (730 ILCS 5/5-9-1), the Clerk of the Circuit Court shall collect a mandatory fee of \$5.00 to be paid by the defendant on a judgment of guilty or a grant of supervision for a felony; for a Class A, Class B, or Class C misdemeanor; for a petty offense and for a business offense.

The proceeds of all fees collected under this Section shall be deposited by the Clerk of the Court into an account specifically for the operation and administration of the St. Clair County drug court. The Clerk of the Circuit Court shall collect the fees as provided in 55 ILCS 5/5-1101(f) and this Ordinance and must remit the fees collected to the drug court, less 5% which is to be retained as fee income to the office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court. The Clerk of the Court shall deposit the fees, less the aforementioned 5%, into a fund that is created by the County Board for receipt of funds collected pursuant to 55 ILCS 5/5-1101(f) and this Ordinance.

The Clerk of the Court shall deposit the 5% retained under 55 ILCS 5/5-1101(f) and this Ordinance into the Circuit Court Clerk Operation and Administrative Fund to be used to defray the costs of collection and disbursement of the drug court fee.

(Ordinance No. 16-1146; see 55 ILCS 5/5-1101(f).

36-15- St. Clair County Drug Court Fund Established

A fund is hereby created and designated as the St. Clair County Drug Court Fund. The Clerk of the Circuit Court shall collect the fees assessed pursuant to 55 ILCS 5/5-1101(f) and St. Clair County Ordinance 16-__ and shall monthly remit those fees for deposit in the St. Clair County Drug Court Fund. The Fund shall be audited by the County Auditor. (Ordinance No. 16-1146; see 55 ILCS 5/5-1101(f).

SECTION II: INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES REPEALED. All Ordinances or parts of other Ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance shall, to the extent of the conflict, be, and are hereby repealed, provided that nothing herein shall in any way excuse of prevent prosecution of any previous existing violation of any Ordinance superseded hereby.

SECTION III: SAVING CLAUSE. Nothing in this Ordinance hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding pending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed by this Ordinance, nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by the Ordinance.

SECTION IV: PASSAGE AND PUBLICATION. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from its passage of publication by the County Clerk as provided by law and shall continue in effect and operation until lawfully repealed by the St. Clair County Board.

WHEREAS, the County of St. Clair has previously designated the Public Building Commission of St. Clair County, Illinois, to act as the lead entity for the acquisition of title to and the construction of the civilian airport known as MidAmerica Airport; and

WHEREAS, the County of St. Clair desires that the County's Public Building Commission be the governmental entity that oversees the management of day to day operations of MidAmerica Airport; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq., the County of St. Clair may enter into an intergovernmental contract with the Public Building Commission, whereby St. Clair County may contract with the Public Building Commission for the performance of any governmental service, activity or undertaking provided that such contract shall be authorized by the governing body of each party to the contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ST. CLAIR COUNTY BOARD, as follows that:

- 1. The St. Clair County Public Building Commission shall exercise all the rights, duties, and obligations of the County of St. Clair for management and oversight of the daily operations of the MidAmerica Airport.

The St. Clair County Public Building Commission shall have the authority to enter into contracts with individuals, partnerships, corporations, and other governmental agencies for the operation and management of MidAmerica Airport, subject to the oversight of the St. Clair County Public Building Commission.

- 5. The St. Clair County Public Building Commission shall not award any employee or official attached to the MidAmerica Airport any financial or compensatory bonus without the approval of the St. Clair County Board.
- 6. The Chairman of the County Board is hereby authorized to enter into the attached intergovernmental agreement that is made a part hereof and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A".

EXHIBIT "A"

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the County of St. Clair, a municipal corporation, has entered into an agreement with the United States of America and the State of Illinois to act as a co-sponsor of a civilian airport, known as the Scott Joint Use Project; and

WHEREAS, said Scott Joint Use Project involves the acquisition of real estate wholly within the confines of St. Clair County, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the County of St. Clair has designated that the Public Building Commission of St. Clair County, Illinois, shall act as the lead entity in acquiring title to the lands necessary for the construction and operation of a civilian airport, known as the Scott Joint Use Project; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq., the County of St. Clair may enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Public Building Commission of St. Clair County, Illinois, whereby St. Clair County may contract with the Public Building Commission for the performance of any governmental service, activity or undertaking, provided that such contract shall be authorized by the governing body of each party to the contract; and

WHEREAS, St. Clair County has been granted quick take powers for the purposes of acquiring land for the construction and operation of the Scott Joint Use Project by the State legislature of the State of Illinois.

N⊕W, THEREF⊕RE, WITNESSETH:

THAT in consideration of the benefits to accrue to the parties hereto, St. Clair County, Illinois, a municipal corporation, and the Public Building Commission of St. Clair County, Illinois, a municipal corporation, do hereby mutually agree as follows:

- 1. That the Public Building Commission of St. Clair County shall exercise all the rights and obligations previously acquired by St. Clair County, Illinois, with regard to the acquisition of real estate needed for the construction and operation of a civilian airport, known as the Scott Joint Use Project.
- 2. That the Public Building Commission of St. Clair County shall exercise all the rights previously granted to St. Clair County, Illinois, under the eminent domain and quick take provisions of the Illinois Compiled Statutes.
- 3. That the Public Building Commission of St. Clair County, Illinois, is authorized to take title in its own name to any and all properties acquired for the construction and operation of the civilian airport, known as the Scott Joint Use Project.
- 4. That the Public Building Commission of St. Clair County, Illinois, shall do nothing in violation or contradiction of any of the joint use agreements entered into by St. Clair County, Illinois, with the State of Illinois, and the Federal Aviation Administration, as incorporated in the document known as the Scott Joint Use agreement and its amendments.

 5. That the Public Building Commission of St. Clair County shall not acquire any of the properties as aforementioned without the joint approval of the County Board of St. Clair County, Illinois, and the Public Building Commission.

A motion was made by Mr. Roy Mosley Jr., seconded by Mr. Kenneth Easterley to deny Agenda Item #9-c-3 (Resolution No. 2173-16-R).

Discussion ensued as follows:

Mr. Frank Heiligenstein: Pursuant to a conversation with the State's Attorney prior to this meeting, he has suggested that Item Number 4 in the Resolution...Item Number 5 of the Resolution be added to the Intergovernmental Agreement so there is no question about what is going on so we do not have to delay this decision as number 6 and 7 in the Intergovernmental Agreement. Also, I would like to note in the Intergovernmental Agreement, whoever drafted this thing in 1996 was citing the Illinois Revised Statutes, and they were repealed by the Illinois Compiled Statutes. I do have the correct reference number there of 5/ILCS 220/1. So, that is my motion to amend it so we can move ahead on it.

The Committee denied based upon the reason, one of the reasons that it is inconsistent Chairman Kern: with the Joint Use Agreement. In this Intergovernmental Agreement you are transferring all of the real estate at MidAmerica Airport to the Public Building Commission which is not part of the Joint Use Agreement which is not something that was envisioned at the time and certainly would violate that. It also adds politics to how MidAmerica Airport is operated through the Public Building Commission. That is why the Public Building Commission was created to separate politics from the Airport. If we want talk about the movement of the Airport, in 2015, we were 310 out of 545 airports in this country. 2016, we are going to move up 74 spots, we will be at 236 out of 545. That moved us in the top If we want to Ιn percent in the country of airports. If our projections hold and the rates hold for 2017, we will be at 217 out of 545 airports in this country. We also have to remember that that is not counting the 60 percent of the flights from Scott Air Force Base that land on our runway every day. The day MidAmerica Airport opened, it kept Scott Air Force Base open for this region. That's three billion dollars a year percent of the flights from Scott Air Force Base that land on our runway every day. The day MidAmerica Airport opened, it kept Scott Air Force Base open for this region. That's three billion dollars a year that is put into our economy. This Board hired Colonel Tim Cantwell, a retired Colonel from the United States Air Force to help operate that airport because we need to facilitate the relationship with Scott Air Force Base and he has done that. We work with them, we are co-located with Scott. Every day we wake up we know our number one mission is as a Joint Use Airport. Beyond that, we have Boeing employees on two shifts now operating at MidAmerica Airport. One hundred ten employees, ninety percent of whom live in Illinois and pay taxes in Illinois. North Bay Produce is working and has a lot of in Illineis and pay taxes in Illineis. North Bay Preduce is working and has a lot of ere, but they are working on their charter bids for international flights from Argentina employees there, but they are for blueberries this fall. If you look, and I heard from a couple Board Members, that they saw two Air Cargo 747's on the runway this weekend. That is someone who surveying the airport to see if they can provide air cargo operations there. We sold a million gallons of jet aviation fuel so far this year. As you guys know, because you do the budget, every one of those gallons we get a percentage from to create revenue for that airport. Every day that we operate we are getting closer to breaking even at We had a gentleman in public participation that said: When? Well, we are meving towards that, we are moving in the right direction. To put politics and micromanagement in that would be a mistake and I think largely as a result of an election coming up in November. Mr. Heiligenstein has the opportunity to go to the Economic Development Committee, where Mr. Cantwell presents a vision of the airport, asks for suggestions, discusses things. Every one of the members of the Board can go to that or they can go to the Public Building Commission. Reporters are there, County Board Members are there, questions are asked and that is where decisions are made for the airport. If you remember, before Mr. Cantwell got here, you had hired a consultant to operate the airport for a number of years and it was very expensive to do that. The reason that you brought Mr. Cantwell in with a contract and and it was very expensive to do that. The reason that you brought Mr. Cantwell in with a contract and included a bonus was because you wanted to incentivize him to improve the airport, make the airport grow, bring in revenues to the airport. That what you are incentivizing, revenues, and the contract gave him a piece of those revenues as they came into the airport. He is doing that. We are headed in the right direction there. We now have seventeen flights a week, the parking lot is virtually full. There is a percentage that is really required to have parking so that when two flights come in or one leaves and comes in at the same time, you have to have enough spaces for the people to come in and leave. We have people parking on the grass now. Those are successes and we need to continue that. To bring politics into this would be a big mistake. We need to continue operating at MidAmerica Airport. BRAC is coming up in the next year. I fully believe that and in 2018 when a BRAC Commission convenes, we are going to be very pleased that we have 6,000 acres that St. Clair County owns, not the Public Building Commission, but St. Clair County owns to be able to attract things that may be closing elsewhere and also make sure that we keep control of the properties so we can make sure that Scott is not encroached so that there are not things building along the fence line at Scott that are going to be incompatible uses with the base. So I would ask that Mr. Mosley's motion be approved to deny this in order to keep politics out of MidAmerica Airport.

Mr. Heiligenstein: We need a second on my motion if we are going to have one.

Mr. Cockrell: I thought Mr. C. David Tiedemann did second but it was not recognized. I am sorry, Mr. Chairman, I need to address the chair. I think Mr. Tiedemann did second Mr. Heiligenstein's motion, but you are saying you are not recognizing that motion?

Chairman Kern: It was not recognized.

Mr. Cockrell: May I speak, Mr. Chairman? I have no idea, but I thought I would just follow up the Chairman's remarks. Mr. Chairman, I find it very interesting that politics is not a part of the Public Building Commission. I have sat in a few Public Building Commissions and that is all politics there. But, anyway, the thing is, what we here are trying to do and what we have been trying to do for the last few years, is give some direct authority back to this County Board that some interpretation and, Mr. Chairman, you are welcome to your opinions, but you are not welcome to your version of the facts. The facts are that the taxpayers have little or no say about the airport. I think it is great that it is a great economic engine, I think there is development going on out there, thank Congressman Costello for bringing Boeing in, that was a fantastic land there; but at some point, the taxpayers of St. Clair County are the only ones responsible for the debt there. That's not an opinion, that's a fact. So, it is great that we can project how high the airport is going to climb, and I do not know what that means, you were saying upper forty-three percent or whatever, and I do not know what that means. I do not know if that is by passenger or by funding. My point is this County Board and its taxpayers that are represented by the Members of this County Board deserve some say so about what goes on at MidAmerica Airport. If it is taxpayers' money, Mr. Chairman, politics is always going to be involved at the local, state, and national level. That is my only point, and I would like to see some type of participation by this County Board. When that agreement in 1996 was passed, I was here, I voted for it. I was glad to. We had a quarterly meeting every quarter where the Director of the Airport, Mr. Cantwell, who by the way has been very well compensated over the years just with bonuses as public employee. I am not saying he is doing a bad or a good job, I am saying he has been well compensated. My point is that this Board deserv

Chairman Kern: Anything further?

Mr. Roy Mosley Jr.: The Trustee Committee (Judiciary Committee) voted to deny the motion and I ask the Board to follow suit.

Mr. Heiligenstein: I noticed there was a lot of discussion at the Trustee Committee (Judiciary Committee) just like here at these meetings where most of you have not said anything in one year. We have never done it, it is not in the Code and he is supposedly an employee of the County. The second thing is if these Members here look at the minutes of the Economic Development Committee you would say Mr. Tim Cantwell said nothing and neither did Mr. Terry Beach, Director of Intergovernmental Grants Department & Economic Development. It is not in the minutes that you can glean from. Some of you people in here have committees that are very good minutes, pages that you can understand what the hell is going on and we are not seeing that in those minutes. It is time for us to step up and do the damn right thing.

Chairman Kern: You know, Frank, looking at the minutes is not really the way you should go about it. You did not come to the last Economic Development.

Mr. Heiligenstein: Yulletu always ulletring that shit uullet. Nulletw culletme ulletn man...

Chairman Kern: You were not there.

Mr. Heiligenstein: I knew.

Chairman Kern: You don't come.

Mr. Heiligenstein: I got situations with the leg and then everything else that I do.
