IT WAS MOVED BY ROY MOSLEY, JR. AND SECONDED BY PAUL SEIBERT TO APPROVE THE FEBRUARY 27, 2017 MINUTES. MOTION CARRIED.

FRANK BERGMAN READ ALL THE CORRESPONDENCE FOR THE MONTH. IT WAS MOVED BY KEVIN DAWSON AND SECONDED BY STEVE GOMRIC TO ACCEPT AND PLACE ON FILE ALL CORRESPONDENCE AND REPORTS. MOTION CARRIED.

HERBERT SIMMONS PRESENTED HIS EMA REPORT TO THE COMMITTEE. MR. SIMMONS SPOKE OF HIGHLIGHTS OF LAST MONTHS SERVER STORM THEY MONITORED. THEY ALSO PUT TOGETHER A 5 DAY SERIES FOR OUR SOCIAL MEDIA PAGE FOR "NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS WEEK" CONSISTING OF A VIDEO FROM THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER ON A TUG BOAT FOR FLOODING, OUTDOOR WARNING SIRENS, LIGHTENING, NOAA WEATHER RADIO AND OTHER WARNING SYSTEM.

KEVIN DAWSON COMMENDED HERBERT SIMMONS ON THEIR SOCIAL MEDIA. HE ENJOYED SEEING THE VIDEO THEY PUT OUT THERE. GOOD JOB.

IT WAS MOVED BY ROY MOSLEY, JR. AND SECONDED BY KEVIN DAWSON TO ACCEPT THE EMA REPORT AND PLACE IT ON FILE. MOTION CARRIED.

TOM KNAPP STATED THE JAIL POPULATION THIS AFTERNOON AT 2:00 WAS 378 THE DOC RATE IS 418 WE ARE DOWN FROM LAST MONTH. FEBRUARY, WE BOOKED 148 FEMALES, 453 MALES OF THOSE MISDEMEANORS 249 AND FELONIES 184. ON THE ROAD FOR THE MONTH, 341 TRAFFIC STOPS, ISSUED 185 CITATIONS, 15 FELONY ARREST, 30 MISDEMEANOR ARREST, 37 WARRANT ARREST. COURTHOUSE CHECKS 279, PARK PATROL UP, 601 WITH A TOTAL POINTS OF CONTACT WITH THE GENERAL PUBLIC 6796. THE ENVIORNMENTAL OFFICER MADE 102 CONTACTS WITH THE GENERAL PUBLIC ISSUED 11 ENVIORNMENTAL CIATIONS. THE REST OF THE DEPARTMENT HAD 60 CONTACTS WITH ENVIORNMENTAL ISSUES AND ISSUED 4 CITATIONS. THE ACCIDENT REVIEW BOARD MET TO DISCUSS THE PREVIOUS QUARTER ACCIDENTS. FOUND 8 ACCIDENTS IN ALL 4 CHARGEABLE AND 4 NONCHARGEABLE.

ROY MOSLEY ASKED WHAT DOES CHARGEABLE VS. NONCHARGEABLE MEAN?

TOM KNAPP STATED CHARGEABLE MEANS THE OFFICERS WAS AT FAULT AND NONCHARGEABLE NOT THE OFFICERS FAULT. CHARGEABLE ACCIDENTS ARE SUBJECT TO DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS.

ROY MOSLEY ASKED SO IS THAT'S THE NEXT STEP WITH THE CHARGEABLES?

TOM KNAPP REPLIED, YES.

IT WAS MOVED BY ROY MOSLEY AND SECONDED BY STEVE GOMRIC TO ACCEPT HIS REPORT AND PLACE IT ON FILE. MOTION CARRIED.

FRANK BERGMAN REPORTED ON THE ACCIDEDNT REPORTS THERE WAS ONE MORE ACCIDENT ADDED TO THE REPORT.

ROY MOSLEY ASKED ABOUT THE HIGHWAY MAINTENANCE GUY WITH THE SIGN TRUCK. I SEE THE ACTION TAKEN YOU CAN'T KEEP HIM OUT OF THE TRUCK.

FRANK BERGMAN STATED HE RECEIVED THE REPORT TODAY AND ASKED FOR CLAIFICATION OF THE REPORT.
