AUGUST 27,2018 PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE MEETING ROLL CALL.

THERE WERE NO COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC REGARDING THE MEETINGS AGENDA.

IT WAS MOVED BY ROY MOSLEY, JR. AND SECONDED BY PAUL SEIBERTTO APPROVE THE JULY, 2018 MINUTES. MOTION CARRIED.

FRANK BERGMAN READ THE DETENTIONS POPULATION REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF JULY. THERE WHERE NO QUESTIONS, IT WAS MOVED BY PAUL SEIBERTAND SECONDED BY MICHAEL O'DONNELL TO ACCEPT AND PLACE ON FILE ALL CORRESPONDENCEAND THE REPORTS. MOTION CARRIED.

HERBERT SIMMONSPROVIDED HIS JULY/AUGUST 2018, E.M.A. REPORT TO THE COMMITTEE. THERE WHERE NO QUESTIONS,IT WAS MOVED BY MICHAEL O'DONNELL AND SECONDED BY JOAN MCINTOSHTO ACCEPT THE EMA REPORT AND PLACE IT ON FILE. MOTION CARRIED.

TOM KNAPP REPORTED OUR DOC RATE OF CAPACITY WAS 418 AND OURAVERAGE DAILY POPULATION WAS 344 FOR JULY. THE JAIL BOOKED 667 INMATES, LONGEST LENGTH OF STAY WAS FOUR DAYS, AND OLDEST PERSON WAS 75 YEARS OF AGE. OF THE 667INMATES, 174WERE FEMALES, 493MALES OF THOSE254 WHERE MISDEMEANORS 221 FELONS, 12FEDERALS INMATES, AND 95FUGITIVES.

ON THE PATROL SIDE OF THINGS FOR JULY WE HAD317TRAFFIC STOPS,141 CITATIONS ISSUED,20 FELONY ARRESTS, 27 MISDEMEANOR ARRESTS, 48 WARRANT ARRESTS,

347COURTHOUSEPATROL CHECKS, 566PARK PATROLS, 2,907 BUSINESS/RESIDENTS CHECKS FOR A TOTAL OF 8,060POINT OF CONTACT WITH GENERAL PUBLIC.

THE ENVIRONMENTAL OFFICER HAD 90 ENVIRONMENTAL CONTACTS MADE,9 ENVIRONMENTAL CITATIONSISSUED, 10 VIOLATION NOTICES LEFT AT RESIDENTS.

THE SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER THAT WAS APPROVED BY THE BOARD LAST MONTH IS UP AND RUNNING, AND THEPEOPLE OF CAHOKIA ARE VERY HAPPY TO HAVE HIM THERE.

LASTLY,IT WAS A TEDIOUS PROCESS BUT WE JUST FINISHED REVAMPING AND RETOOLING ALL OF OUR POLICIES AND PROCEDURES AT THE JAIL FOR PATROL AND CORRECTIONS. WE DID THAT IN CONJUNCTION WITH IPMG WHO IS OUR INSURANCE CARRIER. AS YOU CAN IMAGAIN IPMG HAS A POLICY FOR EVERYTHING THAT WALKS ARE CURLS. SO WE INCORPORATED THAT INTO OUR NEEDS AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR THE JAIL AND PATROL. WE ALSO IMPLEMENTED RECENTLY WHAT IS CALLED THE GUARDIAN TRACKING SYSTEM. IT TRACKS OUR TRAINING THAT WAS DONE MANUALLY BEFORE BY OUR TRAINING DIRECTOR MRS. MOORE, PROACTIVE AND IT KEEPS TRACK OF US AS A DEPARTMENT AS OPPOSE TOO INDIVIDUAL BY INDIVIDUAL. SO WHEN LAW SUITES COME AROUND WE ARE IN A STRONGE POSITION AS FAR AS TRAINING POLICY AND PROCEDURES GO.

MICHAEL O'DONNELL ASK IF ANYONE SAW CHANNEL 2 LAST NIGHT REGARDING THE ST. LOUIS POLICE OFFICERS PATROLLINGTHE METRO LINK.

CHAIRMAN KERN STATED HE WAS IN A MEETING WITH THE SHERIFF IN ST. LOUIS. THE CITY ST. LOUIS IS UNDER STAFFED BUT THEY ARE MAKING PROVISIONS TO FREE UP SOME PERSONNEL TO WORK WITH US. THE OUR OFFICER CAN DETAIN BUT A ST. LOUIS OFFICER HAS TO SHOW UP TO MAKE THE ARREST.

IT WAS MOVED BY JOAN MCINTOSHAND SECONDED BY ROY MOSLEY, JR. TO ACCEPT HIS REPORT AND PLACE IT ON FILE. MOTION CARRIED.

FRANK BERGMAN REVIEW OF THE ACCIDENT REPORT STATED THERE WHERE NO ACCIDENTS ONLY A DEER INCIDENT, AND THAT THE PROPER PAPERWORK WAS FILED. THERE BEING NO QUESTIONS,IT WAS MOVED BY STEVE GOMIRC AND SECONDED BY ROY MOSLEY, JR.TO ACCEPT THE ACCIDENT REPORT AND PLACE ON FILE.
