HERBERT SIMMONS READ HIS EMA REPORT OF ACTIVITIES FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY/MARCH 2018.

ROY MOSLEY, JR. STATED, I SEE YOU MET WITH THE EAST ST. LOUIS CITY MANAGER AND POLICY CHIEF. HOW THAT'S GOING?

HERBERT SIMMONS STATED IT GOING WELL IT WAS THE FOLLOW UP FOR THE OPENING OF CENCOM WEST.

ROY MOSLEY, JR. ASKED DEBRA MOORE IF THEY ARE PAYING ON TIME.

DEBRA MOORE STATED THEY HAVE MADE ONE PAYMENT WHICH WAS THE AMOUNT WE REQUESTED; WE WON'T KNOW HOW THEIR COST UNTIL THE END OF THE YEAR.

ROY MOSLEY, JR. THANKED DEBRA MOORE AND APOLOGIZED FOR NOTMAKING IT TO THE GRAND OPENING. I HEARD IT WAS WELL RECEIVED AND THANK YOU FOR YOUR HARD WORK.

THERE BEING NO FURTHERQUESTIONS, IT WAS MOVED BY ROY MOSLEY, JR. AND SECONDED BY STEVE GOMRICTO ACCEPT THE EMA REPORT AND PLACE IT ON FILE. MOTION CARRIED.

TOM KNAPP REPORTED ON THE JAIL SIDE OF THINGS FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY THE DAILY AVERAGE POPULATION WAS 352. FOR THE RECORD IN FEBRUARY OUT OF A 28 DAY CYCLE WE ADMITTED 639 INMATES; AVERAGE LENGTH OF STAY 4 DAYS, OLDEST PERSON 66 YEARS OLD. OUT OF THE 639, 130 WERE FEMALES, 509 MALES, 231 MISDEMEANORS 202 FELONS, 9 FEDERALS, 90 FUGITIVES AND A HAND FULL OF OTHER MISDEMEANORS. ON THE ROAD SIDE OF THINGS FORFEBRUARY, 443 TRAFFIC STOPS, 305 CITATIONS ISSUED 18 FELONY ARRESTS. 30 MISDEMEANORS ARREST AND 39 WARRANT ARREST.

WE DID 305 COURT HOUSE CHECKS, 553 PARK PARTORLS FOR A GRAND TOTAL OF 7407 POINTS OF CONTACT WITH THE GENERAL PUBLIC.

THE ENVOIRNMENTAL OFFICER HAD 93 CONTACTS MADE 10ENVIORNMENTAL RELATED CITATIONS CONTACT MAKE; ISSUED 7 ENVIORNMENTAL CITATIONS AND 13 CITATIONS NOTICES LEFT AT THE RESIDENTS WHEN THEIR NOT HOME.

THERE BEING NO QUESTIONS, IT WAS MOVED BY MICHEAL O'DONNELL AND SECONDED BY ROY MOSLEY, JR.TO ACCEPT HIS REPORT AND PLACE IT ON FILE. MOTION CARRIED.

FRANK BERGMAN REVIEW OF THE ACCIDENT REPORT AND STATED THERE WAS A COUPLE OF FENDER BENDER, BROKEN REAR VIEW MIRROR.THERE ARE 3 INTO THE ACCIDENT REVIEW BOARD.

TOM KNAPP STATED WE ARE SETTING A MEETING AND WILL HAVE A REPORT FOR THE NEXT MEETING. THERE BEING NO QUESTIONS, IT WAS MOVED BY STEVE GOMRIC AND SECONDED BY KEVIN DAWSON TO ACCEPT THE ACCIDENT REPORT AND PLACE ON FILE.
