# AGREEMENT BETWEEN ST. CLAIR COUNTY AND ST. CLAIR SPECIAL EMERGENCY SERVICES ASSOCIATION

The St. Clair Special Emergency Services Association (hereinafter "SCSESA") and the County of St. Clair (hereinto after "the County") enter into and execute this quasi-intergovernmental Agreement. The parties hereby agree as follows:

#### I. AUTHORITY

This Agreement is entered into pursuant to the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq as SCSESA qualifies as a Fire Department in accordance with the office of the State Fire Marshall as well as maintaining its status as not-for-profit corporation. This agreement is subject to all applicable State, Federal, and local statutes and regulatory requirements.

#### II. PARTIES TO THE AGREEMENT

- 1. The SCSESA is a not-for-profit corporation formed for the purpose of developing, establishing and administering a Technical Advisory Group and well trained membership group. SCSESA is intended to provide local emergency responders with hazardous materials training, response advise, equipment, and such other needs as may be identified for the County, Illinois community, including hazardous material response, technical rescue, and further technical services, that may be needed in the future to lessen the burden of Government in our community, and to further engage in charitable, educational, civil, and benevolent purposes.
- 2. The County is organized and existing under the law of Illinois.

#### III. PURPOSE OF THE AGREEMENT

The purpose of this Agreement between SCSESA and the County is for the County to assist SCSESA in appropriately responding to situations involving hazardous materials by providing financial assistance and to help defray operational cost for a building intended to be used for the housing of emergency response vehicles and equipment, as a meeting place for training; and for other purposes consistent with corporate charter and SCSESA. The County also agrees to provide funding for workman's compensation insurance and insurance on the vehicles and equipment subject to each of these expenditures as described in Section V and is to be for one year only.

#### IV. NEGATION OF RELATIONSHIP

Nothing contained in this agreement shall be construed to create, either expressly of by implication an agency relationship between SCSESA and the County. The County including its employees, agents, and contractors, is not authorized to represent or act on behalf of SCSESA in any matter relating to this Agreement and SCSESA (including its employees, agents and contractors) is not authorized to represent or act on behalf of the County in any matter relating to this agreement.

## V. PAYMENT IN SUPPORT OF ASSOCIATION ACTIVITIES

- 1. Payments are in support of activities to provide technical assistance for incidents involving hazardous materials, technical rescue, water rescue, regional emergency response, and K-9 search.
- Monthly payments of \$3,000 to help defray insurance on building, equipment, workman's compensation, and maintenance cost of equipment and building.

## VI. BUILDING DESCRIPTION

The building intended to house the SCSESA including vehicles and equipment is on three acres of land located at 2900 Falling Springs Road, Sauget, Illinois. The building includes approximately 10,200 square feet of warehouse space and 2,100 square feet of office space.

## VII. THIRD PARTIES

- This agreement benefits only Illinois SCSESA and the County. It extends no benefit or right to any third party not a signatory of this Agreement.
   By Entering into this Agreement, the County does not assume any liability to third
- 2. By Entering into this Agreement, the County does not assume any liability to third parties with respect to losses due to bodily injury or property damage occurring in conjunction with SCSESA activities.

## VIII. TERMINATION

St. Clair County at its sole discretion may terminate this agreement upon 60 days notice, SCSESA may terminate this agreement upon 60 days notice. St. Clair County may recover any termination costs from SCSESA.

## IX. LIMITATION OF RENEWAL OF AGREEMENT (IEPA)

This agreement is effective for one year only and any renewal shall be subject to prior approval of IEPA pursuant to the provision of 415 ILCS 5/22.15

## X. LIMITATION ON COUNTY FUNDING SOURCES IN SUPPORT OF THIS AGREEMENT

This agreement with the exception of expenditures described in Section V(3) is limited to County funding derived only from monies generated pursuant to 415 ILCS 5/22.15 and expenditure of no other County funds is authorized.

## XI. LIMITATION OF TERM OF AGREEMENT

This agreement is limited to one year. Renewal/continuation of any provision of this agreement requires a new agreement, review, and approval by the St. Clair County Board and its committees.

## XII. AMENDMENTS

This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties. No amendment to this agreement shall take effect until executed by the County and SCSESA in writing and approved by the County Board and its Committees.

Dear Messrs. Nations and Sharkey:

The Bi-State Development Agency of Missouri-Illinois Metropolitan District ("Bi-State") has a service agreement with St. Clair County, Illinois, for services provided by the St. Clair County Sheriff's Department ("St. Clair County Sheriff's Department"). The parties to that agreement desire to add an additional three (3) officers to the agreement to provide a higher sense of security to riders on the MetroLink light rail system.

The St. Clair County Sheriff's Department agrees to provide an additional three (3) officers to Bi-State for law enforcement protection and presence on MetroLink trains and Bi-State is interested in obtaining an additional three (3) officers for law enforcement protection and presence. For the Sheriff to hire those officers and pay them the appropriate rates, it will cost \$17,432.92 per month. The St. Clair County Sheriff's Department will bill Bi-State for the additional three (3) officers and Bi-State agrees to pay \$17,432.92 per month on a continuing basis. The parties hereby agree that at the next contract negotiations these positions will be added to the contract and this temporary agreement will be terminated.

The same terms and conditions apply to these employees as those outlined in the Law Enforcement Service Agreement currently in effect. Further, the parties agree and incorporate the terms and conditions of the Law Enforcement Service Agreement to this Letter Agreement.

Parties to this agreement understand that the Sheriff is authorized to immediately employ three additional full time officers and submit the cost of these officers to Bi-State for reimbursement. Should Bi-State not approve reimbursement for these three officers, St. Clair Co. Transit District will reimburse St. Clair Co. for the cost of employment as indicated above and will continue to do so until reimbursement from Bi-State is received.
