THERE WERE NO COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC REGARDING THE MEETINGS AGENDA.

IT WAS MOVED BY STEVE GOMRIC AND SECONDED BY PAUL SEIBERT TO APPROVE THE **AUGUST, 2018 MINUTES. MOTION CARRIED.** 

FRANK BERGMAN READ THE DETENTIONS POPULATION REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF August 2018. THERE WHERE NO QUESTIONS, IT WAS MOVED BY PAUL SEIBERT AND SECONDED BY MICHAEL O'DONNELL TO ACCEPT AND PLACE ON FILE ALL CORRESPONDENCE AND THE REPORTS. MOTION CARRIED.

HERBERT SIMMONS PROVIDED HIS AUGUST/SEPTEMBER 2018, E.M.A. REPORT TO THE COMMITTEE. THERE WHERE NO OUESTIONS, IT WAS MOVED BY STEVE GOMRIC AND SECONDED BY KEVIN DAWSON TO ACCEPT THE EMA REPORT AND PLACE IT ON FILE. MOTION CARRIED.

TOM KNAPP REPORTED OUR DOC RATE OF CAPACITY WAS 418, WE DID NOT EXCEED THAT. OUR AVERAGE DAILY POPULATION DURING AUGUST 2018 WAS 351. INMATES ADMITTED WAS 696, LONGEST LENGTH OF STAY WAS FOUR DAYS, OLDEST PERSON WAS 68 YEARS OF AGE; OF THE 696 INMATES, 194 WERE FEMALES, 502 MALES OF THOSE, BOOKING TYPES 242 WERE MISDEMEANORS 241 FELONS, 5 FEDERALS INMATES, AND 93 FUGITIVES.

ON THE PATROL SIDE OF THINGS FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST WE MADE 290 TRAFFIC STOPS, ISSUED 167 CITATIONS, 13 FELONY ARRESTS, 28 MISDEMEANOR ARRESTS, 28 WARRANT ARRESTS, 375 COURTHOUSE PATROL CHECKS, 601 PARK PATROLS, 2,906 BUSINESS/RESIDENTS CHECKS.

THE ENVIRONMENTAL OFFICER HAD 85 ENVIRONMENTAL CONTACTS MADE, 5 ENVIRONMENTAL CITATIONS ISSUED, 12 VIOLATION NOTICES LEFT AT RESIDENTS.

FINALLY, IN CASE YOU DIDN'T SEE IT, THERE IS AN ARTICLE IN THE BELLEVILLE NEWS DEMOCRATE (BND) BY BETH HUNDSDORFER. IT TALKS ABOUT CRIME IN ST. CLAIR COUNTY IS DOWN ACCORDING TO THE ARTICLE. I WOULD LIKE TO READ A COUPLE OF SENTENCES THAT WAS CITED BY LOYOLA UNIVERSITY CENTER RESEARACH STUDY. AND I QUOTE "THE BIG TAKE AWAY IS THAT REPORTED CRIME IS DOWN OVER THE PAST FIVE TO TEN YEARS FOR BOTH VIOLENCE AND PROPERTY CRIMES, AND THAT WHILE VIOLENT CIRME, AND IN PATICULAR, HOMICIDE, GENERATES A LOT OF ATTENTION, AND RIGHTLY SO, MOST CRIME IN ST. CLAIR COUNTY DOES NOT INVOLVE VIOLENCE," SAID DAVID OLSON, A PROFESSOR. PROPERTY CRIME, SUCH AS THEFT BURGLARY AND AUTO THEFT, DECREASED BY 24 PERCENT DURING THAT TIME FRAME. THE REPORT FURTHER FOUND THAT DURING THE SAME TIME PERIOD FELONY CASES INCREASED 35 PERCENT WHILE THE NUMBER OF VIOLENT CRIMES DECREASED BY 41 PERCENT." SO THAT IS GOOD NEWS FOR EVERYBODY.THERE BEING NO QUESTIONS. IT WAS MOVED BY STEVE GOMRIC AND SECONDED BY TO ACCEPT HIS REPORT AND PLACE IT ON FILE. MOTION CARRIED.

FRANK BERGMAN STATED REVIEWING ALL THE REPORTS WITH OUR NEW COMMITTEE MEMBER LAURA FREDRICK THEY APPEAR TO BE IN ORDER FOR AUGUST 2018. THERE WAS THREE OTHER CLAIMS THAT WAS DEINED BECAUSE IT WAS OUTSIDE OF OUR RESPONSIBILITY. THERE BEING NO QUESTIONS, IT WAS MOVED BY STEVE GOMIRC AND SECONDED BY JOAN MCINTOSH TO ACCEPT THE ACCIDENT REPORT AND PLACE ON FILE.

THERE BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS, IT WAS MOVED BY PAUL SEIBERT AND SECONDED BY MICHAEL O'DONNELL TO ADJOURN, MOTION CARRIED.
