A RESOLUTION DENYING A REQUEST FOR A SPECIAL USE PERMIT FOR A PLANNED BUILDING DEVELOPMENT BY JOSEPH G. & JOANN MATY, CO-TRUSTEES, OWNERS & APPLICANTS, AND TRINITY SERVICES, INC., APPLICANTS, FOR PROPERTY LOCATED AT 11858 & 11878 ZIMMERMAN ROAD, MASCOUTAH, ILLINOIS, IN ENGELMANN TOWNSHIP. (2018-36-SP)

WHEREAS, the Zoning Board of Appeals after hearing the testimony and evidence presented at the hearing; after considering all relevant sections of the St. Clair County Zoning Code, and after further consideration of the matter, denied the applicant's a Special Use Permit to modify/amend an existing Planned Building Development that was previously granted pursuant to 40-9-3(H)(3) in that the Applicant desires to modify/amend the site plan submitted in case 2010-01-PD to allow the further division of the existing two parcels of property to be divided into a total of three (3) parcels consisting of 9.22-acres, 6.45-acres and 26.53-acres in an "A" Agricultural Industry Zone District, due to the following: The proposed division would not adequately protect the public's health, safety, and welfare and the physical environment, given the previously granted Planned Building Development (2010-01-PD) and the use of the residences on the properties; the division of the properties to allow for smaller parcels would not be consistent with the Comprehensive Plan, which designates the area as Agricultural; dividing the existing two parcels of property into three smaller parcels of property may have a negative impact on the value of neighboring properties; there will be minimal effect on traffic circulation but allowing further division would allow a third residence to be constructed in an area serviced by well and septic; there are no schools or hospitals in the close proximity that will require special consideration; and further division of the parcels in question would not be compatible to adjacent uses and uses in the general vicinity.

WHEREAS, the County Board of St. Clair County, Illinois, concur with the aforesaid findings, conditions and recommendations of the Zoning Board of Appeals;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the County Board of St. Clair County, Illinois, that the request for a Special Use Permit for a Planned Building Development be denied.

ST. CLAIR TWP.

RESOLUTION NO. _2438-19-RZ_

A RESOLUTION GRANTING A REQUEST FOR A SPECIAL USE PERMIT BY REHKEMPER PARTNERSHIP TR - THOMAS J. REHKEMPER, OWNER, AND DG ILLINOIS SOLAR, LLC, APPLICANTS, FOR PROPERTY LOCATED AT 5601 CONCORDIA CHURCH ROAD, BELLEVILLE, ILLINOIS, IN ST. CLAIR TOWNSHIP. (CASE 2018-31-SP)

WHEREAS, the Zoning Board of Appeals, after hearing the testimony and evidence presented at previous hearings; after considering all relevant sections of the St. Clair County Zoning Code, and after further consideration of the matter, granted the applicant's a Special Use Permit to allow two, 2-MW Solar Farm Energy Systems on 40-acres in an "A" Agricultural Industry Zone District due to the following facts and findings:

The land in question is located in an "A" Agricultural Industry Zone District, is rural in nature, is adjacent to other farm fields to the east, west, and north, is adjacent to a compost facility to the south, and there are few residential structures in close proximity to the proposed Special Use.

DG Illinois Solar, LLC as owner and operator of the facility, is requesting a special use permit to construct two, 2-megawatt Solar Farm Energy Systems on a footprint of approximately 28.6-acres of the 40-acre parcel in question. Construction will likely begin in the Fall of 2019 with a 14-week construction timeline.

It is anticipated that the proposed facility will supply enough energy to meet the demands of approximately 500 homes annually.

The project will include typical photovoltaic panels on a fixed tilt system, racking, one or more inverters, medium voltage transformers, and control cabinets. The total height of the combined solar energy system will be between 6.5 to 8 feet in height.

All disturbed upland portions of the Project parcel will be permanently seeded with native grass mix of low-growth seeds and wildflowers.

Once the project has been constructed there will be no added traffic on a daily basis. The only traffic will be for periodic inspection and maintenance.

Any sound created by the completed solar farm will be minimal and within the limits as provided by the St. Clair County Zoning Code.

The perimeter of the project site will be fenced with a 7-foot tall chain link fence to surround the perimeter of the property.

There will be one access point off Concordia Church Road to access the solar array, which shall be gated with appropriate signage and emergency access box.

The proposed setbacks of the project area shall meet or exceed the County's requirements, and the facility shall be installed per the plans submitted.

The LESA score for the site is 231 which is a high value for agricultural retention. No portion of the subject parcel is located in the Special Flood Hazard Area as defined by the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

The Applicant further agrees to provide a decommissioning plan as determined and approved by the County before a building permit will be issued.

WHEREAS, the Zoning Board of Appeals further concluded as follows:

The proposed design, location, development and operation of the proposed Special Use will adequately protect the public health, safety, and welfare and the physical environment; there will be a thorough decommissioning plan with financing in place for the decommissioning; little to no glare is expected onto adjacent roadways and properties; the site will be fenced; there will be coordination with emergency personnel; there will be storm and wastewater procedures in place; the site will be seeded and maintained with appropriate grass seed mixtures; and the site will be appropriately maintained.

The proposed Special Use as limited by this motion, will not have an adverse impact on the County's Comprehensive Plan, as the proposed special use is one considered in an Agricultural Industry Zone District.

The proposed Special Use will have a similar impact as the current use of the property in that it will make no more appreciable noise and will be appropriately screened/fenced.

Further, the Board, when previously considering a Special Use Permit for a similar solar farm energy system, received general studies regarding the impact or lack thereof, of such solar developments on neighboring property values. The Applicant in this case also provided testimony regarding the lack of effect on neighboring property values. While the Board recognizes a possible issue, the testimony and evidence that is has received to date demonstrates there is little to no impact on property values. In addition, the proposed Special Use will have a positive impact on the County's overall tax base.

The proposed Special Use will enhance the provision of electric utilities to the area. The proposed Special Use will create no burden on existing utilities and provides a needed clean and renewable energy alternative. The proposed Special Use will not lead to an increase in traffic after it is constructed as the only additional traffic will be vehicles visiting the site for periodic maintenance and inspection.

There are no facilities such as schools or hospitals near the proposed Special Use that require special consideration.

Whether the proposed Special Use is compatible to adjacent uses and uses in the general vicinity, the Board found as follows: The adjacent uses are agricultural and industrial. There are some residential uses in the general vicinity (i.e. sporadic farmhouses), there are few residences that border or are in close proximity to this proposed Special Use that would be affected. However, the proposed Special Use will contain a sufficient vegetative buffer. Other adjacent uses include a dirt bike track and compost facility. Thus, the proposed Special Use, as limited by this motion of the Board, and with certain construction conditions and use limitations is compatible with adjacent uses and uses in the general vicinity.

WHEREAS, the approval of the Special Use Permit is subject to the following additional conditions and restrictions:

No overweight or oversized loads shall be delivered to the site, and the Applicant shall apply to the appropriate highway, road district or other authority regarding any necessary road permits and entrance permits.

The Applicant shall cooperate to the fullest extent possible with the Federal Emergency Management Agency by obtaining the proper permits and meeting the appropriate design requirements necessary to prevent issues from the Special Flood Hazard Area that is present in the subject parcel.

The Applicant shall provide to the Zoning Administrator monthly updates on its progress toward receiving approval under the Illinois Adjustable Block Program and, if approved, on the anticipated start date of construction.

Construction hours shall be limited to Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. No construction work is to be done on Saturdays, Sundays, evenings, or holidays unless written approval is obtained from the St. Clair County Building and Zoning Department Administrator.

During excavation, site prep, or disturbance of soil onsite, any topsoil shall be preserved and returned to its prior condition.

All vegetation, shrubbery or other planting shall be well-maintained and kept free of noxious weeds and invasive plants.

The Applicant and all other subsequent lessees, agents, assigns, persons or entities that have any interest in, control over, or rights to the proposed Solar Farm Energy System shall adhere to all applicable requirements of the St. Clair County Zoning Code, including but not limited to Section 40-5-30, and all conditions and restrictions placed on this Special Use.

The Applicant and Owner prior to either party selling, transferring, sub-leasing, assigning, or transferring any interest or control in this Solar Farm Energy System or the real property it is constructed upon, shall notify, in writing, the St. Clair County Zoning Administrator of any impending transfer at least 30 days prior thereto, supplying the Administrator with the name, address, contact number, and e-mail address of the new owner, purchaser, lessee, assignee, or other new party in interest, and the Applicant and Owner shall provide the Administrator any such additional documents and information requested by the Administrator regarding the transfer, lease, or assignment.

A RESOLUTION GRANTING A REQUEST FOR A SPECIAL USE PERMIT BY FT PROPERTIES, OWNERS & APPLICANTS, FOR PROPERTY LOCATED AT 4380 & 4390 E HWY 161, BELLEVILLE, ILLINOIS, IN SHILOH VALLEY TOWNSHIP. (CASE 2018-38-SP)

WHEREAS, the Zoning Board of Appeals, after hearing the testimony and evidence presented; after considering all relevant sections of the St. Clair County Zoning Code, and after further consideration of the matter, granted the applicant's a Special Use Permit for a modification/expansion of a Planned Building Development (2003-75-SP & 2005-64-SP) pursuant to Section 40-9-3(H)(3) to allow the expansion of an existing Mini-Warehouse Business to include a 3-sided storage building in an "A" Agricultural Industry Zone District due to the following findings and facts:

The land in question is located in an "A" Agricultural Industry Zone District, is rural in nature, is adjacent to other another storage unit, as well as, farm fields and Military housing. The proposed Special Use is in conformance with other adjacent uses.

John Macke, as owner and applicant, is seeking a modification of a current building plan in order to conform to St. Clair County Ordinance prohibiting outdoor storage.

The proposed Special Use will consist of a 3-sided building which will house all of the now existing outdoor storage on the property and will place the property in compliance with St. Clair County Ordinance.

The proposed structure will utilize a gravel floor, will not use asphalt or cement, and will redirect all incidental stormwater runoff from the structure to the current detention pond located on the property.

County Board Member Jana Moll advised the Zoning Administrator that she has no objections to the proposed use.

The perimeter of the project site has a current existing fence with on keypad entry point of ingress and egress.

The LESA score for the site is 173. The current parcel is rocked and not being used for farmland. No farmland will be lost.

WHEREAS, the Zoning Board of Appeals further concluded as follows:

The proposed design, location, development, and the operation of the proposed 3-sided storage facility, as limited by this motion, adequately protects the public's health, safety and welfare, and physical

environment; there will be a thorough drainage plan; the site will be fenced; there will be storm and wastewater management procedures in place; and the site will be appropriately maintained.

While not in conformance with the County's Comprehensive Plan, the proposed Special Use as limited by this motion, will not have an adverse impact on the County's Comprehensive Plan, as the proposed special use is a modification of a current Planned Building Development and is in conformance with and/or complimentary to other adjacent uses.

The proposed Special Use will have a similar impact as the current use of the property. Further, it was noted that the proposed special use may increase the overall county tax base, as it provides a much-needed service to the military housing in the area.

The proposed Special Use will not affect the current traffic circulation as the structure will not induce an increase of traffic flow. The proposed Special Use will not affect public utilities, as it will not utilize any public utilities.

The adjacent uses are agricultural, commercial, and residential. There are some residential uses in the general vicinity (i.e., military housing) to this proposed Special Use that would be not be affected. Other adjacent uses include a similar storage facility that was recently granted a modification of its similar Special Use Permit (2018-33-SP). Thus, the proposed Special Use, as limited by the motion of the Board is compatible with adjacent uses and uses in the general vicinity.

Applicant shall submit a statement regarding a proposed solution that addresses the water run-off from the proposed use that redirects all incidental drainage to the currently existing detention pond on or before April 29, 2019.

9-b-3 ORDINANCE - ESTABLISHING CIVIL FEES AND CRIMINAL AND TRAFFIC ASSESSMENTS TO BE CHARGED BY THE CLERK OF THE CIRCUIT COURT.

ORDINANCE NO. _19-1214_

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING CIVIL FEES AND CRIMINAL AND TRAFFIC ASSESSMENTS TO BE CHARGED BY THE CLERK OF THE CIRCUIT COURT

WHEREAS, Chapter 36, Article XV, of the St. Clair County Code of Ordinances, currently set forth the fees authorized by the County Board to be charged in both civil and criminal cases in St. Clair County; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois General Assembly passed comprehensive legislation in 2018, which completely overhauls the criminal, traffic and civil fee structures in the circuit courts throughout the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the legislation was to consolidate fees into unified schedules for all counties, to realign fees to be constitutional, and to provide for fee waivers for low income individuals; and

WHEREAS, effective July 1, 2019, Section 27.1b of the Clerks of Courts Act, 705 ILCS 105/27.1b, sets out the fees to be charged in all counties in the State of Illinois by the Clerks of the Circuit Court for the filing of pleadings and for other services provided by the Clerks in civil cases; and

WHEREAS, Section 27.1b of the Clerks of Courts Act creates four schedules for civil filing fees, three schedules for civil appearance fees, and establishes various other fees that Clerks of the Circuit Court are authorized to assess in civil cases, all of which are generally classified as "not to exceed" amounts; and

WHEREAS, Section 27.1b provides that, unless otherwise specified, the amount of the fees shall be determined by ordinance or resolution of the County Board and remitted to the County Treasurer to be used for purposes related to the operation of the court system in the County; and

WHEREAS, effective July 1, 2019, the newly-adopted Criminal and Traffic Assessment Act, $705 \ \text{ILCS} \ 105/135$ et seq., sets out minimum fines to be levied and assessments to be charged in criminal and traffic cases by the Clerks of the Circuit Court in all counties in the State of Illinois; and
