INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT FOR THE PROVISION OF MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES AT THE ST. CLAIR COUNTY JAIL

I. Introduction

This Agreement is between the St. Clair County Mental Health Boards, a special unit of St. Clair County Government (hereinafter the "Board") and the St. Clair County Sheriff, hereinafter referred to as the "Sheriff".

II. Purpose

This Agreement is made pursuant to the provisions of the Illinois Compiled Statutes, Chapter 405, Act 20, et seq., the Community Mental Health Act.

III. Board Obligations

The Board agrees to:

- 1. Provide \$360,000 in annual funding for the payment of approved Jail Mental Health service costs as incurred by the Sheriff.
- 2. Maintain complete, accurate, documented, and current accounting of community mental health funds that are provided to be expended by the Sheriff for provision of jail mental health services.

IV. Sheriff Obligations

The Sheriff agrees to:

- 1. Accept \$360,000 of Board funding for the payment of approved Jail Mental Health service costs.
- 2. Provide accurate, current, and complete disclosure to the Board, upon request, of the financial status of Board funds received and expended for the purposes outlined in this Agreement.
- 3. Maintain records which adequately identify the source and use of such funds expended for the purposes outlined in this Agreement.
- 4. On a monthly basis provide the Board with a monthly report summarizing the jail mental health services as provided for each month. At a minimum report to contain:

- 10. Provide the Board with a copy of the executed contract with Wexford that details the provision of mental health services in the jail.

No written or oral agreements, representations, statements, negotiations, understandings, or discussions that are not set out, referenced, or specifically incorporated in the Agreement shall in any way be binding between the Board and Sheriff.

VI. Availability of Funds

Payment under this Agreement is subject to the receipt of necessary and adequate funds as reported in the St. Clair County Ordinance – Levy and Final Extension of 2020 Taxes Payable in 2021.

VII. Term and Termination

The Agreement shall be effective for the Calendar Year beginning January 1, 2021 and ending on December 31, 2021.

Either party, upon thirty (30) days' notice written notice, may terminate this Agreement. If termination is so made, uncommitted funds shall be returned to the control of the Board.

VIII. Confidentially Requirements

- 1. The Board and the Sheriff shall not use any information obtained or viewed in performance of the Agreement in any manner except as necessary for the proper discharge of their respective obligations under the Agreement.
- 2. Both Board and Sheriff will adhere to all state and federal regulations regarding confidentially of patient records, including but not limited to: (1) Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities Confidentiality Act, 740 ILCS 110/1 et seq. and (2) 42 CFR Part 2 ("Confidentiality of Substance Use Disorder Patient Records"), and the Alcoholism and Other Drug Abuse and Dependency Act, 20 ILCS 301/1-1 et seq.

- 3. This AGREEMENT may be terminated by the LPA upon giving notice in writing to the ENGINEER at the ENGINEER's last known post office address. Upon such termination, the ENGINEER shall cause to be delivered to the LPA all drawings, plats, surveys, reports, permits, agreements, soils and foundation analysis, provisions, specifications, partial and completed estimates and data, if any from soil survey and subsurface investigation with the understanding that all such materials becomes the property of the LPA. In addition, upon the resumption of services the LPA shall compensate the ENGINEER, for expenses incurred as a result of the suspension and resumption of its services, and the ENGINEER's schedule and fees for the remainder of the project shall be equitably adjusted.

This AGREEMENT shall continue as an open contract and the obligations created herein shall remain in full force and effect until the completion of construction of any phase of professional services performed by others based upon the service provided herein. All obligations of the ENGINEER accepted under this AGREEMENT shall cease if construction or subsequent professional services are not commenced within 5 years after final payment by the LPA.
- 6. That the ENGINEER shall be responsible for any and all damages to property or persons arising out of an error, omission and/or negligent act in the prosecution of the ENGINEER's work and shall indemnify and have harmless the LPA, the DEPARTMENT, and their officers, employees from all suits, claims, actions or damages liabilities, costs or damages of any nature whatsoever resulting there from. These indemnities shall not be limited by the listing of any insurance policy.
- 7. The ENGINEER and LPA certify that their respective firm or agency:
 - (a) has not employed or retained for commission, percentage, brokerage, contingent fee or other considerations, any firm or person (other than a bona fide employee working solely for the LPA or the ENGINEER) to solicit or secure this AGREEMENT.
 - (b) has not agreed, as an express or implied condition for obtaining this AGREEMENT, to employ or retain the services of any firm or person in connection with carrying out the AGREEMENT or
 - (c) has not paid, or agreed to pay any firm, organization or person (other than a bona fide employee working solely for the LPA or the ENGINEER) any fee, contribution, donation or consideration of any kind for, or in connection with, procuring or carrying out the AGREEMENT.
 - (d) that neither the ENGINEER nor the LPA is/are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Federal department or agency,
 - (e) has not within a three-year period preceding the AGREEMENT been convicted of or had a civil judgment rendered against them for commission of fraud or criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain or performing a public (Federal, State or local) transaction; violation of Federal or State antitrust statutes or commission of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements or receiving stolen property.
 - (f) are not presently indicated for or otherwise criminally or civilly charged by a government entity (Federal, State, or local) with commission of any of the offenses enumerated in paragraph and
 - (g) has not within a three-year period preceding this AGREEMENT had one or more public transaction (Federal, State, local) terminated for cause or default.

Where the ENGINEER or LPA is unable to certify to any of the above statements in this clarification, an explanation shall be attached to this AGREEMENT.

- 8. In the event of delays due to unforeseeable causes beyond the control of and without fault or negligence of the ENGINEER no claim for damages shall be made by either party. Termination of the AGREEMENT or adjustment of the fee for the remaining services may be requested by either party if the overall delay from the unforeseen causes prevents completion of the work within six months after the specified completion date. Examples of unforeseen causes included but are not limited to: acts of God or a public enemy; acts of the LPA, DEPARTMENT, or other approving party not resulting from the ENGINEER's unacceptable services; fire; strikes; and floods.
 - If delays occur due to any cause preventing compliance with the PROJECT SCHEDULE, the ENGINEER shall apply in writing to the LPA for an extension of time. If approved, the PROJECT SCHEDULE shall be revised accordingly.

- (a) That tracing, plans, specifications, estimates, maps and other documents prepared by the ENGINEER in accordance with this AGREEMENT shall be delivered to and become the property of the LPA and that basic survey notes, sketches, charts, CADD files, related electronic files, and other data prepared or obtained in accordance with this AGREEMENT shall be made available, upon request to the LPA or to the DEPARTMENT, without restriction or limitation as to their use. Any re-use of these documents without the ENGINEER involvement shall be at the LPA's sole risk and will not impose liability upon the ENGINEER.
- (b) That all reports, plans, estimates and special provisions furnished by the ENGINEER shall conform to the current Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction, Bureau of Local Roads and Streets Manual or any other applicable requirements of the DEPARTMENT, it being understood that all such furnished documents shall be approved by the LPA and the DEPARTMENT before final acceptance. During the performance of the engineering services herein provided for, the ENGINEER shall be responsible for any loss or damage to the documents herein enumerated while they are in the ENGINEER's possession and any such loss or damage shall be restored at the ENGINEER's expense.


