#### **Public Comment:**

Sheila Ford: While I was out of town for the flood in July, I was wondering because animal control building is prone to flooding. It's not the first time and probably won't be the last time, are there plans moving forward? To move to another building, contingency plans in place? While I was watching his happening and not able to help I was glad to see so many people coming to help.

Mr. Meile: That's only the second time that's flooded like that.

Julie: The building has flooded several times in the past 10 years, but not this bad.

Mr. Simmons: We talked about it today, the county is definitely working on it.

Shelly Korves: Is there an alarm system that could be in place? It was really lucky that the fire department just happened to be there performing a water rescue of a person right in front of the building. They noticed earlier than anyone would have been there. If that didn't happen, I think there would have been deaths.

Cheri: I don't know if there is some type of sensor. When the water comes up. I don't know if there is something that could hook into the fire alarm system.

#### Cheri Report

The July save rate was 100%. The adoption center adopted out 20 animals. We can't thank everyone enough for the assistance. Humane Society, Gateway, Partners for Pets, Stray Rescue, Helping Strays of Monroe County. They all stepped up. Got all of the animals out. 911 brought their bus. The animals we loaded onto buses. Shelly and Jack brought a trailer. The highway department let us use the garage. Animals were picked up from there. Humane Society put out a request for fosters. We were able to send people there as they stopped.

Mr. Trentman: Shelly and Tribouts offered up their trailer. We took a lot of supplies to Gateway to disperse. They had a lot of people down there. They must have put out the call for help.

Shelly: We (BAHS) had 200 foster applications just that day. We were able to adopt out 43 cats and kittens that weekend.

Julie: And we're full again already. It's been 2-3 weeks and we're already filled back up

### Page 3 – St. Clair County Animal Services (August 29th 2022)

Mr. Trentman: That fundraiser we had, can't that be used for things you need?

Ashley: We made a big purchase right before the flood and lost almost everything. We put a donation request out through an amazon wishlist and we had a ton of donations come in. Everything we lost, plus some people have been sending.

Mr. Trentman: If you need anything

Cheri: It's going to be a while still. They're working on the adoption center. Once they're done over there, we're moving animal control over to the adoption center for them to finish on the animal control side. We have laptops now. Once they're done on that side, we'll be able to move back and start putting things back and get back to normal.

Mr. Trentman: There's serious talks about moving the whole facility. It's just in the beginning stages now.

Sheila: What kind of time frame are we looking at with Animal control moving to the adoption center.

Cheri: Just the people are moving. Operations will be the same.

Ashley: We had 110 animals move in July with rescue transfer. A lot of them were during the flood. It was pretty slow up until then. It was awesome to see how everyone came together to help.

Julie: We wish we could keep that up.

Sheila: I have photographed some of them that were moved from the flood. Some of them were there for weeks or months. They are all in foster and doing well. These are some really g animals that are passing through there.

Mr. Trentman: So everyone knows, Sheila takes pictures of the animals once a week and volunteers her free time.
