### ST. CLAIR COUNTY SHERIFF DEPARTMENT

Report for the month of March 1, 2022, ending March 31, 2022, included the following data: Average Daily Population was 482, inmates admitted 507 of those 109 were females, 398 males, 147 misdemeanors, 238 felons, 9 federal, 73 fugitives, Sentence Weekend Bookings 10, Sentence County Bookings 7, D.O.C 17 and Other 6. On the patrol side for the month of March 2022 there were 264 traffic citations, 71 traffic warnings, 45 felony/misdemeanors, 19 warrant arrests, 261 park patrol, 1,113 business checks and 164 courthouse check for a total of 999 points of contact with the public.
