Colonel Thomas Knapp reported the following for the month of November 1, 2023, ending November 30, 2023, which included the following data: Average Daily Population was 367, inmates admitted 480 of those 139 were females, 341 males, 120 misdemeanors, 253 felons, 3 Federal, 81 fugitives, Sentence Weekend Bookings 6, Sentence County Bookings 5, D.O.C 10 and Other 2. There were 140 traffic citations, 110 traffic warnings, 52 felony/misdemeanors, warrant arrests, 360 park patrol, 1075 business checks and 83 courthouse checks, for a total of 905 points of contact with the general public.
