There were no Public Comments made or Questions asked at this Meeting.

Upon a motion by Commissioner Lee and second by Commissioner Effinger, it was unanimously agreed to Approve the Annual Meeting and Regular Monthly Meeting Minutes of January 19,2023.

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Upon a motion by Commissioner Dinges and second by Commissioner Lee it was unanimously agreed to approve the Regular Expense Claims Report with Payroll Ledger Report of February 28, 2023.

Upon a motion by Commissioner Dinges and second by Commissioner Lee, it was unanimously agreed to approve the Airport Expense Claims Report of February 28, 2023.

Commissioner Dinges reviewed the **Monthly Budget Analysis Report for February 2023** and stated the 2023 Budget is in line with the projected percentage of 16.7 % expenditures except for Economic Development due to major capital improvement

Commissioner Dinges reviewed the **Trial Balance Report for January 2023** and it can be available when requested in the Public Building Commission Office.

Upon a motion by Commissioner Effinger and second by Commissioner Bouse, it was agreed to unanimously Approve the purchase of Scott Air-Pak Equipment from Mallory Safety and Supply, LLC at a cost not-to-exceed \$40,000.00

Upon a motion by Commissioner Effinger and second by Commissioner Dinges, it was unanimously agreed to Approve the Sole Source Contract with Nutrien Ag Solutions at a cost not-to-exceed \$12,000.00. The 2 spray applications of insecticide will be conducted in the months of May and July.

Upon a motion by Commissioner Bouse and second by Commissioner Effinger, it was unanimously agreed to Approve Amendment #3 to the Consulting Services Agreement with HOK for a cost not-to-exceed \$285,486.00.

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Upon a motion by Commissioner Effinger and second by Commissioner Bouse, it was unanimously agreed to Approve Amendment #9 to the Engineering Agreement with CMT at a cost not-to-exceed \$968,133.00.

Upon a motion by Commissioner Bouse and second by Commissioner Brown, it was unanimously agreed to Approve Amendment #1 to the agreement with WSP USA, Inc. to perform the Snow Equipment Removal Facility Study for a cost not-to-exceed \$34,300.00.

Upon a motion by Commissioner Brown and second by Commissioner Bouse, it was unanimously agreed to Approve Airport Staff to formulate and implement a project to demolish the old Scott Schools.

1. Scott Air-Pak / Sole Source Approval

As part of the recent ARFF truck purchases, there is a need to purchase the ancillary equipment associated with each truck. The ancillary equipment solicitations were put out to bid in 2022 and included provisions for SCBA. Due to the proprietary nature of the Scott Air-Pak SCBA, the bidders were unable to provide a bid.

<u>Financial Impact</u>: The procurement of the Scott Air-Pak equipment was included in the FY2023 Airport Budget.

Motion: "Move to approve the sole source purchase of Scott Air-Pak equipment from Mallory Safety and Supply, LLC at a cost Not-to-Exceed \$40,000."



2. Nutrien Ag Solutions/ Sole Source Approval

The USDA, as part of their wildlife management duties at Scott AFB, have coordinated applications of insecticides on and around the airfield to mitigate conditions which create wildlife hazards. The USDA is currently under contract with Nutrien Ag Solutions to apply insecticide to the Scott AFB airfield this spring and summer. It would be highly desirable to have a singular, coordinated application of insecticide on the entire airport airfield.

<u>Financial Impact</u>: The insecticide procurement was included in the FY2023 Airport Budget.

Motion: "Move to approve the sole source contract with Nutrien Ag Solutions at a cost Not-to-Exceed \$12,000."



3. Consulting Services / Non-AIP Amendment #3 / HOK

The proposed work would be completed as Amendment #3 to the existing agreement with HOK and would include Construction Phase Services for the remaining packages of Phase 3. Work includes administrative offices, airline offices, tenant offices, furniture, departure lounge seating, etc.

<u>Financial Impact</u>: The Non-AIP Consulting Services Amendment #3 was included in the FY2023 Airport Budget.

Motion: "Move to approve and authorize the Chairman to execute Amendment #3 to the Consulting Services Agreement with HOK at a cost Not-to-Exceed \$285,486."



4. Consulting Services / AIP / Terminal Expansion Phase 4 / Amendment #9

The Airport has been coordinating with Customs and Border Protection (CBP) regarding improvements to the existing CBP General Aviation Facility (GAF) and a new Federal Inspection Station (FIS) to be incorporated into Phase 4 of the terminal construction. This effort is the subject of a recent FAA Airport Terminal Program (ATP) grant application. The proposed design amendment would be Amendment #9 to the engineering agreement with CMT for Design, Documentation, and Bidding Phase services for Phase 4 of the Terminal Modifications project.

<u>Financial Impact</u>: The consulting services / Phase 4 / Amendment #9 was included in the FY2023 Airport Budget.

Motion: "Move to approve and authorize the Chairman to execute Amendment #9 to the engineering agreement with CMT at a cost Not-to-Exceed \$968,133."



5. Consulting Services / AIP / SRE Study - Amendment #1 / WSP

The FAA requires that SRE buildings are to be located on an airport to provide easy responses by snow clearing crews to control snow, slush, and ice conditions, as well as a convenient location for repairing, servicing, and maintaining equipment. Such requirements ensure FAA compliance with the Airport's Snow and Ice Control Plan.

<u>Financial Impact</u>: The Snow Removal Equipment (SRE) Facility Study was included in the FY2023 Airport Budget.

Motion: "Move to approve and authorize the Chairman to execute Amendment #1 to the agreement with WSP USA, Inc. to perform the Snow Equipment Removal (SRE) Facility Study for a cost Not-to-Exceed \$34,300."



6. Authorization / Scott Schools Demolition

The school buildings are currently in severe disrepair and contain multiple environmental hazards (asbestos, PCBs, lead based paint, etc.). The proposed project would include environmental remediation and demolition of the two former Scott Schools and all associated components. After demolition, the land would be returned to its natural state and incorporated into the adjacent agricultural leases.

<u>Financial Impact</u>: The proposed Scott Schools demolition project will be funded by St. Clair County ARPA funds.

Motion: "Move to authorize Airport Staff to formulate and implement a project to demolish the old Scott Schools."
























Boeing Production Facility - 2023






Boeing Production Facility - 2023






Boeing Production Facility - 2023
