ST. CLAIR COUNTY JUVENILE DETENTION CENTER

ST. CLAIR COUNTY EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (EMA)

Per the St. Clair County EMA Report, Ann Barnum presented the following.

2. Monthly tests of the outdoor warning sirens were completed. This included the test of 29 newly installed outdoor warning sirens of which all activated successfully. We received a report of a single siren failing to activate in Swansea and they were notified to have their vendor check the siren.

ST. CLAIR COUNTY SHERIFF DEPARTMENT

Colonel Thomas Knapp reported the following for the month of October 1, 2023, ending October 31, 2023, which included the following data: Average Daily Population was 362, inmates admitted 449 of those 126 were females, 323 males, 117 misdemeanors, 211 felons, 2 Federal, 88 fugitives, Sentence Weekend Bookings 8, Sentence County Bookings 10, D.O.C 7 and Other 5. There were 84 traffic citations, 71 traffic warnings, 53 felony/misdemeanors, warrant arrests, 333 park patrol, 1042 business checks and 89 courthouse checks, for a total of 1005 points of contact with the general public.
