Mr. Cockrell said he is not objecting to anything but needs some clarification. Mr. Cockrell said he sees the years from 2026-2054 with the revised lease rental agreement. Mr. Cockrell said that is the amount that would be levied against properties in St. Clair County. Chairman Kern said that would be the amount that would be paid. Chairman Kern called on Mr. Coyne. Mr. Coyne said yes. Mr. Cockrell said what is rental payment, what is our annual levy that we are going to levy to pay. Mr. Cockrell said is that amount or is there an amount that I am missing here. Mr. Coyne said right now as it says in the levy about \$700,000 less but all this does is continue the management operations of this building. Mr. Coyne said that money over time paid for the improvements in this building. Mr. Coyne said the heating and cooling and the repairs of all these buildings comes out of that lease payment so it does is extend the life of them. Mr. Cockrell said there are revisions in the first fifteen years is that what we are talking about. Mr. Coyne said the first fifteen years is less cause you already had \$12 million a year in management operations. Mr. Cockrell said how much are we levying against the property, what are we levying as a property tax to pay this, the total amount. Mr. Coyne said that is the potential but every year the County levies less. Mr. Cockrell said what are the three properties, I know one of them is the Courthouse. Chairman Kern said Animal Services and is 9-1-1 the third. Mr. Cockrell said is 9-1-1 the building on West Washington, Chairman Kern called upon Monica, Mr. Coyne said the Jail, the Juvenile Detention Center, the Public Service Building on West Main, the building across the street all of those buildings are covered by this. Mr. Cockrell said how much do we collect from the Emergency Telephone System Board in rent on our property. Mr. Coyne said I do not know the answer to that. Chairman Kern said I think there is no lease right now. Chairman Kern said the bonds have been paid off. Mr. Cockrell said I understand that but that is a separate entity from the County taxpayers that is paid by line charges and fees, and I think that they should be paying rent. Mr. Cockrell said they always have paid rent before. Chairman Kern said they got services before, and we don't maintain that building for them currently. Chairman Kern said I'm not opposed to us doing that. Mr. Cockrell said I would like to see that considered anyway.

RESOLUTION approving an Amendment to Lease Agreement by and between the Public Building Commission of St. Clair County, Illinois, as lessor, and The County of St. Clair, Illinois, as lessee, and providing for the levy and collection of a direct annual tax sufficient to pay the rent payable under said Lease Agreement.

WHEREAS, the Public Building Commission of St. Clair County, Illinois (the "Commission"), a municipal corporation heretofore duly organized under the provisions of the Public Building Commission Act of the State of Illinois, as amended (the "Act"), was incorporated for the purpose of making possible the construction, acquisition or enlargement of public improvements, buildings and facilities in The County of St. Clair, Illinois (the "County"); and

Whereas, the Commission and the County have heretofore executed and delivered an Amended and Restated Lease Agreement, dated December 1, 2005 (the "Original Lease"), as amended by an Amendment to Lease Agreement, dated December 28, 2011, an Amendment to Lease Agreement, dated April 18, 2013, and an Amendment to Lease Agreement, dated May 19, 2020 (collectively, the "Prior Amendment" and, together with the Original Lease, the "Lease"), under which the Commission leases certain sites (as described in the Lease) and projects namely, the County Juvenile Detention Center, the County Public Safety Building Site (Jail), the County Courthouse and Garage, the County Office Building, the Animal Control Building, the Annex Building and parking lots, the Emergency Telephone System Building (911 Center) and the office for the Regional Office of Education serving the Educational Service Region for the County (collectively, the "Facilities"), to the County and receives annual rental payments from the County for the use and occupancy of the Sites and the Facilities (the "Rental Payments"); and

WHEREAS, the County Board of the County (the "Board") adopted resolutions on the 31st day of October, 2005, on the 19th day of December, 2011, on the 25th day of March, 2013

and on the 19th day of March, 2020, providing for the levy and collection of a direct annual tax sufficient to pay the Rental Payments; and

WHEREAS, it has heretofore been determined and is now hereby determined that it is necessary and in the best interests of the County, that County facilities be improved by acquiring, constructing, improving, altering, equipping, repairing, maintaining, operating and securing a building to be used as an new animal services facility for the County to be known as the St. Clair County Animal Services-Comwest Parkway (the "Animal Services Facility"); and

WHEREAS, the Commission has heretofore selected, located and designated and does hereby select, locate and designate an area (the "Animal Services Facility Site") lying wholly within the City of Belleville, St. Clair County, Illinois, the same being the county seat of the County (the "County Seat"), as the site on which to provide for the Animal Services Facility for the County, such site being described in Exhibit A hereto; and

WHEREAS, the selection of the Animal Services Facility Site has also been approved by 3/4 of the members of the City Council of the County Seat; all to the extent required by the provisions of Section 14 of the Act; and

WHEREAS, it has heretofore been determined and is now hereby determined that it is necessary and in the best interests of the County, that County facilities be improved by acquiring, constructing, improving, altering, equipping, repairing, maintaining, operating and securing a building to be used as an new public services facility for the County to be known as the St. Clair County Public Services Facility (the "Public Services Facility"); and

WHEREAS, the Commission has heretofore selected, located and designated and does hereby select, locate and designate an area (the "Public Services Facility Site") lying wholly within the County Seat, as the site on which to provide for the Public Services Facility for the County, such site being described in Exhibit A hereto (the "Public Services Facility Site"); and

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WHEREAS, the selection of the Public Services Facility Site has also been or will be approved by a majority vote of the members of the County Board of the County and has been approved by 3/4 of the members of the City Council of the County Seat; all to the extent required by the provisions of Section 14 of the Act; and

WHEREAS, it has heretofore been determined and is now hereby determined that providing for (i) the Animal Services Facility, (ii) the Public Services Facility and (iii) the operation of the Facilities are necessary and in the best interests of the County; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and in the best interests of the County that the Board approve the selection of the Animal Services Facility Site; and

WHEREAS, it has heretofore been determined and is now hereby determined that it is in the best interests of the County and the Commission that the Facilities be improved, altered, equipped, repaired, maintained, operated and secured; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has approved and the County does hereby approve the basic plans for acquiring, constructing, improving, altering, equipping, repairing, maintaining, operating and securing the Animal Services Facility and the Facilities (collectively, the "*Project*"), which plans are now in file in the office of the Secretary of the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has heretofore estimated the cost of undertaking the Project, and all other expenses connected therewith, including architectural, engineering, legal and all financing costs, including bond discount, to be not less than \$15,000,000; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has heretofore issued its Taxable Public Building Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2013, dated April 18, 2013 (the "2013 Bonds") and Taxable Public Building Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2020A, dated May 19, 2020 (the "2020 Bonds" and, together with the 2013 Bonds, the "Prior Bonds"), to refund bonds that were issued to acquire,

construct, improve, alter, equip, repair, maintain and operate the Facilities and refund certain outstanding bonds of the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Prior Bonds are payable from net revenues derived from the operation, management and use of the Facilities, including the rentals received by the Commission from the Lease (the "Rental Payments"); and

WHEREAS, the Prior Bonds are the only outstanding revenue bonds of the Commission payable from the Rental Payments; and

WHEREAS, the repayment of the Bonds shall be secured by the Rental Payments on a parity with the Unrefunded Prior Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Commission has adopted a resolution (the "PBC Bond Resolution"), authorizing the issuance of bonds of the Commission to provide for the Project and to refund all or a portion of the Prior Bonds (the "Refunded Bonds") in order to restructure the debt burden of the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Commission and the County propose to enter into an amendment to the Lease, substantially in the form attached hereto as *Exhibit A* (the "*Amendment*" and, together with the Lease, the "*Revised Lease*"), maintaining and adjusting the schedule of Rental Payments set forth in the Lease, all in accordance with the terms and provisions of the Lease, the Amendment and the Act; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Revised Lease and the Act, the Rental Payments shall be sufficient to provide for the payment of the Cost of Maintenance and Operation (as defined in the PBC Bond Resolution), and principal and interest on the Prior Bonds and the bonds to be issued by the Commission for the Project and the Refunding (the "Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, in and by Section 18 of the Act, if a municipal corporation having taxing powers enters into a lease with a public building commission, the governing body of such municipal

corporation is required to provide by resolution for the levy and collection of a direct annual tax sufficient to pay the rent payable under such lease as and when it becomes due and payable; and

WHEREAS, Section 18 of the Act also requires that a public hearing be held regarding the lease (the "PBC Hearing") before the County Clerk of the County can extend taxes levied to pay the lease payments and that notice of a public hearing to discuss the lease be published in a newspaper published in or of general circulation within the County at least 15 days prior to the date set for the PBC Hearing; and

WHEREAS, notice of the PBC Hearing was given by publication at least once, at least 15 days before the PBC Hearing in the *Belleville News-Democrat*, the same being a newspaper published in the County; and

WHEREAS, the PBC Hearing was held on the 24th day of February, 2025, and at the PBC Hearing all persons residing or owning property in the County had the opportunity to be heard orally, in writing, or both; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of the Bond Issue Notification Act of the State of Illinois, as amended, the County Board adopted a resolution calling a public hearing (the "BINA Hearing") for the 24th day of February, 2025, concerning the intent of the County Board to enter into the Lease; and

WHEREAS, notice of the BINA Hearing was given by publication at least once not less than seven (7) nor more than thirty (30) days before the date of the BINA Hearing in the *Belleville News-Democrat*, the same being a newspaper of general circulation in the County, and said notice was posted at least 72 hours before the BINA Hearing at the principal office of the County Board; and

WHEREAS, the BINA Hearing was held on the 24th day of February, 2025, and at the BINA Hearing, the County Board explained the reasons for the proposed lease and permitted persons

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desiring to be heard an opportunity to present written or oral testimony within reasonable time limits; and

WHEREAS, the BINA Hearing was finally adjourned on the 24th day of February, 2025:

Now, Therefore, Be It and It Is Hereby Resolved by the County Board of The County of St. Clair, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. Incorporation of Preambles. The County Board of the County (the "County Board") hereby finds that all of the recitals contained in the preambles to this Resolution are full, true and correct and does incorporate them into this Resolution by this reference.

Section 2. Approval of the Animal Services Facility Site and the Public Services Facility Site. The County Board hereby approves the selection by the Commission of the Animal Services Facility Site as the location of the Animal Services Facility. The County hereby approves the selection by the Commission of the Public Services Facility Site as the location of the Public Services Facility.

Section 3. Approval of the Amendment. The Amendment and all the terms and provisions thereof, in substantially the form provided hereby, are hereby approved and the Chairman of the County Board (the "Chairman") and County Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute, in the name of the County, the Amendment, without any further authorization or direction from the County Board; provided, however, that the Chairman and the County Clerk shall only execute the Amendment if the Chairman (the "Designated Representative") finds and determines that the Refunding Bonds are sold at such price and bear interest at such rates that the taxes levied in Section 4 hereof are sufficient to pay (i) the principal of and interest due on the Refunding Bonds and the Prior Bonds and (ii) the Cost of Maintenance and Operation. The County hereby requests the Commission to issue the Bonds to provide for the Project and to refund the

Refunded Bonds. The authority of the Chairman and County Clerk to execute the Amendment in accordance with the provisions of this Section shall expire on the 30th day of September, 2025.

Section 4. Tax Levy. For the purpose of paying the annual rent payable under the Revised Lease, there shall be and there is hereby levied a direct annual tax upon all the taxable property in the County, to wit:

To the extent that the taxes levied above exceed the amount necessary to pay the annual rental payable under the Revised Lease, the Designated Representative is hereby authorized to direct the abatement of such taxes to the extent of the excess of such levy in each year over the

amount necessary to pay the annual rental payable under the Revised Lease, in the following bond year. In order to effectuate said abatement, the Designated Representative is hereby authorized to execute a Certificate of Abatement, and said Certificate shall be filed with the County Clerk, in a timely manner to effect such abatement.

Filing of Resolution. The County Clerk, as keeper of the records and files of Section 5. the County, be and is hereby ordered and directed to file a certified copy of this Resolution, having attached certified copy of the Amendment, with the County Clerk, as tax extension officer of the County, which shall constitute the authority for the County Clerk to extend the tax annually, as provided for in and by this Resolution, to pay the annual rent payable under the Revised Lease by the County, as and when it becomes due and payable, and the County Clerk shall ascertain the rate per cent which, upon the value of all property subject to taxation within the County for levy in each of the years 2025 to 2053, inclusive, as that property is assessed or equalized by the Department of Revenue of the State of Illinois, will produce a net amount of not less than the amounts provided for in and by this Resolution and being the annual rent provided for and reserved in the Revised Lease, and it shall be the duty of the County Clerk annually during the term of the Revised Lease to extend said taxes against all the taxable property contained in the County as herein provided, and sufficient to pay the annual rental reserved in the Revised Lease. Such tax shall be levied and collected in like manner with the other taxes of the County, and shall be in addition to all other taxes now or hereafter authorized to be levied by the County, and shall not be included within any statutory limitation of rate or amount, but shall be excluded therefrom and be in addition thereto and in excess thereof.

Section 6. Abatement. The taxes levied in Section 4 hereof may be abated by the County prior to the extension thereof, in the amount of any funds paid to the Commission as advance rent pursuant to the Revised Lease and to be used to pay rent due on the Revised Lease.

Section 7. Official Statement. The use by Oppenheimer & Co., Inc., Chicago, Illinois, of a Preliminary Official Statement and final Official Statement in connection with the sale of the Refunding Bonds is hereby approved and the County does hereby consent to the preparation and use of a Preliminary Official Statement and final Official Statement in connection with the sale of the Bonds. The Chairman is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to execute and deliver a final Official Statement in the name and on behalf of the County; and that from and after the execution and delivery of a final Official Statement, the officers, agents and employees of the County are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to do all such acts and things and to execute all such documents as may be necessary to carry out and comply with the provisions of the Official Statement as executed.

Section 8. Continuing Disclosure Undertaking. The Chairman is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to execute and deliver a Continuing Disclosure Undertaking under Section (b)(5) of Rule 15c2-12 adopted by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended (the "Continuing Disclosure Undertaking"). When the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking is executed and delivered on behalf of the County as herein provided, the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking will be binding on the County and the officers, employees and agents of the County, and the officers, employees and agents of the County are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to do all such acts and things and to execute all such documents as may be necessary to carry out and comply with the provisions of the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking as executed. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Resolution, the sole remedy for failure to comply with the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking shall be the ability of the beneficial owner of any Refunding Bond to seek mandamus or specific performance by court order to cause the County to comply with its obligations under the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking.

Section 9. Municipal Bond Insurance. In the event the payment of principal and interest on the Refunding Bonds is insured pursuant to a municipal bond insurance policy (the "Municipal Bond Insurance Policy") issued by a bond insurer (the "Bond Insurer"), and as long as such Municipal Bond Insurance Policy shall be in full force and effect, the County agrees to comply with such usual and reasonable provisions regarding presentment and payment of the Bonds, subrogation of the rights of the Bondholders to the Bond Insurer upon payment of the Bonds by the Bond Insurer, amendment hereof, or other terms, as approved by the Chairman of the County on advice of counsel, his approval to constitute full and complete acceptance by the County of such terms and provisions under authority of this Section.

Section 10. Ratification. All actions of the officers, agents and employees of the Commission that are in conformity with the purposes and intent of this Resolution, whether taken before or after the adoption hereof, are hereby ratified, confirmed and approved.

Section 11. Severability. If any section, paragraph or provision of this Resolution shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Resolution.

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Section 12. Repealer and Effective Date. All ordinances or resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed and this Resolution shall be in full force and effect forthwith upon its adoption.

WHEREAS, it has heretofore been determined and is now hereby determined that it is necessary and in the best interests of the County, that County facilities be improved by acquiring, constructing, improving, altering, equipping, repairing, maintaining, operating and securing a building to be used as an new public services facility for the County to be known as the St. Clair County Public Services Facility (the "Public Services Facility"); and

WHEREAS, the Commission has heretofore selected, located and designated and does hereby select, locate and designate an area (the "Public Services Facility Site") lying wholly within the County Seat, as the site on which to provide for the Public Services Facility for the County, such site being described in Exhibit A hereto (the "Public Services Facility Site"); and

WHEREAS, the selection of the Public Services Facility Site has also been or will be approved by a majority vote of the members of the County Board of the County and has been approved by 3/4 of the members of the City Council of the County Seat; all to the extent required by the provisions of Section 14 of the Act; and

WHEREAS, it has heretofore been determined and is now hereby determined that providing for (i) the Animal Services Facility, (ii) the Public Services Facility and (iii) the operation of the Facilities are necessary and in the best interests of the County; and

WHEREAS, it has heretofore been determined and is now hereby determined that it is in the best interests of the County and the Commission that the Facilities be improved, altered, equipped, repaired, maintained, operated and secured; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has approved and does hereby approve the basic plans for acquiring, constructing, improving, altering, equipping, repairing, maintaining, operating and securing the Animal Services Facility, the Public Services Facility and the Facilities (collectively, the "Project"), which plans are now in file in the office of the Secretary of the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has heretofore estimated the cost of undertaking the Project, and all other expenses connected therewith, including architectural, engineering, legal and all financing costs, including bond discount, to be not less than \$15,000,000; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has heretofore issued its Taxable Public Building Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2013, dated April 18, 2013 (the "2013 Bonds") and Taxable Public Building Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2020A, dated May 19, 2020 (the "2020 Bonds" and together with the 2013 Bonds, the "Prior Bonds"), to refund bonds that were issued to acquire, construct, improve, alter, equip, repair, maintain and operate the Facilities and refund certain outstanding bonds of the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Prior Bonds and are the only outstanding revenue bonds of the Commission payable from Revenues (as hereinafter defined); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Commission (the "Board") has determined that it is necessary and desirable to refund a portion of the Prior Bonds (the Prior Bonds to be refunded being referred to herein the "Refunded Bonds" and the Prior Bonds not being refunded

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being referred to herein as the "Unrefunded Prior Bonds") in order to restructure the debt burden of the Commission and the Schedule of Rental Payments; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Commission to issue bonds in the amount of \$15,000,000 for the Project and bonds in the amount of \$6,955,000 for refunding the Refunded Bonds (the "Refunding") together as one issue of bonds (the "Bonds") in an aggregate principal amount of \$21,955,000; and

WHEREAS, in order to provide the necessary revenues for the payment of the Bonds, for the payment of any Prior Bonds that are not being refunded, for all interest that may accrue on said bonds and for the costs of administration, operation and maintenance as provided in the Lease, it is necessary for the parties hereto to enter into this Amendment, amending the Lease as hereinafter set forth:

Now Therefore, in consideration of the rents reserved hereunder and the provisions and covenants herein made by each of the parties hereto and for other good and valuable considerations, it is covenanted and agreed by the said parties hereto as follows:

SECTION I — PROJECT AND REFUNDING BONDS

For the purpose of providing for the Project and the Refunding, the following actions will be taken by the Commission:

- A. The Commission shall obtain fee simple title to the Animal Services Facility and the Public Services Facility, with provisions for revenue to the County. The County shall have the right of exclusive possession of the Facilities and all improvements thereto during the full term of the Lease.
- B. The Commission shall, with reasonable promptness, upon the execution of this Amendment and pursuant to the provisions of Section 15 of the Act provide for the authorization, sale, execution and delivery by it of its bonds in the principal amount of

\$15,000,000 to be designated "Public Building Revenue Bonds, Series 2025A" (the "Bonds"), for the purpose of paying the cost of the Project, pursuant to the provisions of the provisions of the resolution adopted by the Board of Commissioners of the Commission on the 20th day of March, 2025, authorizing and providing for the issue of the Bonds (the "Bond Resolution").

- C. The Commission shall, with reasonable promptness, upon the execution of this Amendment and pursuant to the provisions of Section 15 of the Act provide for the authorization, sale, execution and delivery by it of its bonds in the principal amount of \$6,955,000 to be designated "Taxable Public Building Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2025B" (the "Refunding Bonds"), for the purpose of paying the cost of refunding a portion of the Prior Bonds, pursuant to the Bond Resolution, the provisions of which are made a part hereof by reference.
- D. Upon the issuance of the Bonds, the Commission shall immediately apply the proceeds derived from the sale of the Bonds pursuant to and in the manner and as provided by the terms of the Act and the Bond Resolution.

SECTION II — AMENDMENT OF LEASE

A. Paragraph A of Section II of the Lease is amended to read as follows:

In consideration of the rents reserved and the covenants, agreements and other terms and conditions herein provided to be kept, observed and performed by the County, the Commission hereby enters in this Amended and Restated Lease for a term commencing as the date hereof and ending on December 28, 2054, unless sooner terminated as provided in Section VII hereof.

B. Paragraph B of Section II of the Lease is amended to read as follows:

The County covenants and agrees, on or before November I of each of the years hereafter designated, to pay to the Commission for the use and occupancy of the demised premises, the following annual rentals:

Lease on November 1 of each of the years 2026 to 2054, inclusive, will be as shown on Exhibit I attached to this Amendment and made a part hereof.

SECTION III — MISCELLANEOUS

- A. The obligations of the Commission hereunder are subject to the sale, issuance and delivery by the Commission of the Bonds. The Commission agrees to proceed as quickly as reasonably possible with the authorization, sale, delivery and issuance of the Bonds.
- B. In the event any covenant, phrase, clause, paragraph, section, condition or provision herein contained is held to be invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity of any such covenant, phrase, clause, paragraph, section, condition or provision shall in no way affect any other covenant, phrase, clause, paragraph, section, condition or provision herein contained.
- C. This Amendment has been executed in several counterparts, any of which shall be considered as an original.

- 3. <u>Payment/Distribution</u>. The City shall ensure the annual payment/distribution of the District's pro-rata share of surplus revenue to the County under Section 2 above by April 30th of each year of this Intergovernmental Agreement.

- 4. <u>Term.</u> The term of this Intergovernmental Agreement shall be from the date of execution until December 31, 2041 or the expiration or termination of TIF District #2, whichever is sooner.

This Agreement is made and entered into between the above local public agency, hereinafter referred to as the "LPA" and the State of Illinois, acting by and through its Department of Transportation, hereinafter referred to as the "STATE". The STATE and LPA jointly proposes to improve the designated location as described in the Location and Project Description sections of this agreement. The improvement shall be constructed in accordance with plans prepared by, or on behalf of the LPA and approved by the STATE using the STATE's policies and procedures approved and/or required by the Federal Highway Administration, hereby referred to as "FHWA".

I. GENERAL

- 1.1 Availability of Appropriation: Sufficiency of Funds. This Agreement is contingent upon and subject to the availability of sufficient funds. The STATE may terminate or suspend this Agreement, in whole or in part, without penalty or further payment being required, if (i) sufficient funds for this Agreement have not been appropriated or otherwise made available to the LPA by the STATE or the federal funding source, (ii) the Governor or STATE reserves funds, or (iii) the Governor or STATE determines that funds will not or may not be available for payment. The STATE shall provide notice, in writing, to LPA of any such funding failure and its election to terminate or suspend this Agreement as soon as practicable. Any suspension or termination pursuant to this Section will be effective upon the date of the written notice unless otherwise indicated.
- 1.2 <u>Domestic Steel Requirement.</u> Construction of the project will utilize domestic steel as required by Section 106.01 of the current edition of the Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction and federal Build America-Buy America provisions.
- 1.3 Federal Authorization. That this Agreement and the covenants contained herein shall become null and void in the event that the FHWA does not approve the proposed improvement for Federal-aid participation within one (1) year of the date of execution of this agreement.
- 1.4 Severability. If any provision of this Agreement is declared invalid, its other provisions shall not be affected thereby.
- 1.5 <u>Termination</u>. This Agreement may be terminated, in whole or in part, by either Party for any or no reason upon thirty (30) calendar days' prior written notice to the other Party. If terminated by the **STATE** must include the reasons for such termination, the effective date, and, in the case of a partial termination, the portion to be terminated. If the **STATE** determines in the case of a partial termination that the reduced or modified portion of the funding award will not accomplish the purposes for which the funding award was made, the **STATE** may terminate the Agreement in its entirety.

This Agreement may be terminated, in whole or in part, by the STATE without advance notice:

- a. Pursuant to a funding failure as provided under Article 1.1.
- b. If LPA fails to comply with the terms and conditions of this funding award, application or proposal, including any applicable rules or regulations, or has made a false representation in connection with the receipt of this or any award.

II. REQUIRED CERTIFICATIONS

By execution of this Agreement and the LPA's obligations and services hereunder are hereby made and must be performed in compliance with all applicable federal and State laws, including, without limitation, federal regulations, State administrative rules and any and all license requirements or professional certification provisions.

- 2.1 <u>Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards (2 CFR Part 200)</u>. The LPA certifies that it shall adhere to the applicable Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements, which are published in Title 2, Part 200 of the Code of Federal Regulations, and are incorporated herein by reference.
- 2.2 Compliance with Registration Requirements. LPA certifies that it: (i) is registered with the federal SAM system; (ii) is in good standing with the Illinois Secretary of State, if applicable; (iii) have a valid DUNS Number; (iv) have a valid UEI, if applicable. It is LPA's responsibility to remain current with these registrations and requirements.
- 2.3 <u>Bribery</u>. The LPA certifies to the best of it's knowledge that it's officials have not been convicted of bribery or attempting to bribe an officer or employee of the state of Illinois, nor made an admission of guilt of such conduct which is a matter of record (30 ILCS 500/50-5).
- 2.4 <u>Bid Rigging. LPA</u> certifies that it has not been barred from contracting with a unit of state or local government as a result of a violation of Paragraph 33E-3 or 33E-4 of the Criminal Code of 1961 (720 ILCS 5/33E-3 or 720 ILCS 5/33E-4, respectively).
- 2.5 <u>Debt to State.</u> LPA certifies that neither it, nor its affiliate(s), is/are barred from receiving an Award because the LPA, or its affiliate(s), is/are delinquent in the payment of any debt to the STATE, unless the LPA, or its affiliate(s), has/have entered into a deferred payment plan to pay off the debt, and STATE acknowledges the LPA may declare the Agreement void if the certification is false (30 ILCS 500/50-11).
- 2.6 Debarment. The LPA certifies to the best of its knowledge and belief that it's officials:
 - a. are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Federal department or agency;
 - b. have not within a three-year period preceding this agreement been convicted of or had a civil judgment rendered against them for commission of fraud or a criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain, or performing a public (Federal, State or local) transaction or contract under a public transaction; violation of Federal or State anti-trust statutes or

commission of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements receiving stolen property:

- c. are not presently indicated for or otherwise criminally or civilly charged by a governmental entity (Federal, State, Local) with commission of any of the offenses enumerated in item (b) of this certification; and
- d. have not within a three-year period preceding the agreement had one or more public transactions (Federal, State, Local) terminated for cause or default.
- 2.7 Construction of Fixed Works. The LPA certifies that all Programs for the construction of fixed works which are financed in whole or in part with funds provided by this Agreement shall be subject to the Prevailing Wage Act (820 ILCS 130/0.01 et seq.) unless the provisions of that Act exempt its application. In the construction of the Program, the LPA shall comply with the requirements of the Prevailing Wage Act including, but not limited to, inserting into all contracts for such construction a stipulation to the effect that not less than the prevailing rate of wages as applicable to the Program shall be paid to all laborers, workers, and mechanics performing work under the Award and requiring all bonds of contractors to include a provision as will guarantee the faithful performance of such prevailing wage clause as provided by contract.
- 2.8 <u>Criminal Convictions</u>. The LPA certifies that neither it nor any managerial agent of LPA has been convicted of a felony under the Sarbanes-Oxley Act of 2002, nor a Class 3 or Class 2 felony under Illinois Securities Law of 1953, or that at least five (5) years have passed since the date of the conviction. The LPA further certifies that it is not barred from receiving an funding award under 30 ILCS 500/50-10.5 and acknowledges that STATE shall declare the Agreement void if this certification is false (30 ILCS 500/50-10.5).
- 2.9 Improper Influence. The LPA certifies that no funds have been paid or will be paid by or on behalf of the LPA to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any government agency, a member of Congress or Illinois General Assembly, an officer or employee of Congress or Illinois General Assembly in connection with the awarding of any agreement, the making of any grant, the making of any loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, or the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment or modification of any agreement, grant, loan or cooperative agreement. 31 USC 1352. Additionally, the LPA certifies that it has filed the required certification under the Byrd Anti-Lobbying Amendment (31 USC 1352), if applicable.
- 2.10 <u>Telecom Prohibition</u>. The **LPA** certifies that it will comply with Section 889 of the FY 2019 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) that prohibits the use of telecommunications or video surveillance equipment or services produced or provided by the following companies: Dahua Technology Company, Hangzhou Hikvision Digital Technology Company, Huawei Technologies Company, Hytera Communications Corporation, and ZTE Corporation. Covered equipment and services cannot be used as substantial or essential component or any system, or as critical technology as part of any system.
- 2.11 Personal Conflict of Interest (50 ILCS 105/3, 65 ILCS 5/3.1-55-10, 65 ILCS 5/4-8-6) The LPA certifies that it shall maintain a written code or standard of conduct which shall govern the performance of its employees, officers, board members, or agents engaged in the award and administration of contracts supported by state or federal funds. Such code shall provide that no employee, officer, board member or agent of the LPA may participate in the selection, award, or administration of a contract supported by state or federal funds if a conflict of interest, real or apparent would be involved. Such a conflict would arise when any of the parties set forth below has a financial or other interest in the firm selected for award:
 - a. the employee, officer, board member, or agent;
 - b. any member of his or her immediate family;
 - c. his or her partner; or
 - d. an organization which employs, or is about to employ, any of the above.

The conflict of interest restriction for former employees, officers, board members and agents shall apply for one year.

The code shall also provide that LPA's employees, officers, board members, or agents shall neither solicit nor accept gratuities, favors or anything of monetary value from contractors, potential contractors, or parties to subcontracts. The STATE may waive the prohibition contained in this subsection, provided that any such present employee, officer, board member, or agent shall not participate in any action by the LPA relating to such contract, subcontract, or arrangement. The code shall also prohibit the officers, employees, board members, or agents of the LPA from using their positions for a purpose that constitutes or presents the appearance of personal or organizational conflict of interest or personal gain.

- 2.12 <u>Organizational Conflict of Interest</u> The LPA certifies that it will also prevent any real or apparent organizational conflict of interest. An organizational conflict of interest exists when the nature of the work to be performed under a proposed third party contract or subcontract may, without some restriction on future activities, result in an unfair competitive advantage to the third party contractor or LPA or impair the objectivity in performing the contract work.
- 2.13 Accounting System. The LPA certifies that it has an accounting system that provides accurate, current, and complete disclosure of all financial transactions related to each state and federally funded program. Accounting records must contain information

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pertaining to state and federal pass-through awards, authorizations, obligations, unobligated balances, assets, outlays, and income. To comply with 2 CFR 200.305(b)(7)(i), the **LPA** shall use reasonable efforts to ensure that funding streams are delineated within **LPA**'s accounting system. See 2 CFR 200.302.

III. AUDIT AND RECORD RETENTION

3.1 Single Audits: The LPA shall be subject to the audit requirements contained in the Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996 (31 USC 7501-7507) and Subpart F of 2 CFR Part 200.

If, during its fiscal year, LPA expends \$750,000 or more in Federal Awards (direct federal and federal pass-through awards combined), LPA must have a single audit or program-specific audit conducted for that year as required by 2 CFR 200.501 and other applicable sections of Subpart F of 2 CFR Part 200. A copy of the audit report must be submitted to the STATE (IDOT's Financial Review & Investigations Section, Room 126, 2300 South Dirksen Parkway, Springfield, Illinois, 62764) within 30 days after the completion of the audit, but no later than one year after the end of the LPA's fiscal year.

Assistance Listing number (formally known as the Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) number) for all highway planning and construction activities is 20.205.

Federal funds utilized for construction activities on projects let and awarded by the STATE (federal amounts shown as "Participating Construction" on Schedule 2) are not included in a LPA's calculation of federal funds expended by the LPA for Single Audit purposes.

- 3.2 STATE Audits: The STATE may, at its sole discretion and at its own expense, perform a final audit of the Project (30 ILCS 5, the Illinois State Auding Act). Such audit may be used for settlement of the Project expenses and for Project closeout purposes. The LPA agrees to implement any audit findings contained in the STATE's authorized inspection or review, final audit, the STATE's independent audit, or as a result of any duly authorized inspection or review.
- 3.3 <u>Record Retention.</u> The LPA shall maintain for three (3) years from the date of final project closeout by the STATE, adequate books, records, and supporting documents to verify the amounts, recipient, and uses of all disbursements of funds passing in conjunction with this contract, adequate to comply with 2 CFR 200.334. If any litigation, claim or audit is started before the expiration of the retention period, the records must be retained until all litigation, claims or audit exceptions involving the records have been resolved and final action taken.
- 3.4 Accessibility of Records. The LPA shall permit, and shall require its contractors and auditors to permit, the STATE, and any authorized agent of the STATE, to inspect all work, materials, payrolls, audit working papers, and other data and records pertaining to the Project; and to audit the books, records, and accounts of the LPA with regard to the Project. The LPA in compliance with 2 CFR 200.337 shall make books, records, related papers, supporting documentation and personnel relevant to this Agreement available to authorized STATE representatives, the Illinois Auditor General, Illinois Attorney General, any Executive Inspector General, the STATE's Inspector General, federal authorities, any person identified in 2 CFR 200.337, and any other person as may be authorized by the STATE (including auditors), by the state of Illinois or by federal statute. The LPA shall cooperate fully in any such audit or inquiry.
- 3.5 Failure to maintain the books and records. Failure to maintain the books, records and supporting documents required by this section shall establish presumption in favor of the STATE for recovery of any funds paid by the STATE under the terms of this contract.

IV. LPA FISCAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- 4.1 To provide all initial funding and payment for construction engineering, utility, and railroad work
- 4.2 <u>LPA Appropriation Requirement.</u> By execution of this Agreement the **LPA** attests that sufficient moneys have been appropriated or reserved by resolution or ordinance to fund the **LPA** share of project costs. A copy of the authorizing resolution or ordinance is attached as Schedule 5.
- 4.3 <u>Reimbursement Requests</u>: For reimbursement requests the LPA will submit supporting documentation with each invoice. Supporting documentation is defined as verification of payment, certified time sheets or summaries, vendor invoices, vendor receipts, cost plus fix fee invoice, progress report, personnel and direct cost summaries, and other documentation supporting the requested reimbursement amount (Form BLR 05621 should be used for consultant invoicing purposes). LPA invoice requests to the STATE will be submitted with sequential invoice numbers by project.
- 4.4 Financial Integrity Review and Evaluation (FIRE) program: LPA's and the STATE must justify continued federal funding on inactive projects. 23 CFR 630.106(a)(5) defines an inactive project as a project which no expenditures have been charged against Federal funds for the past twelve (12) months. To keep projects active, invoicing must occur a minimum of one time within any given twelve (12) month period. However, to ensure adequate processing time, the first invoice shall be submitted to the STATE within six (6) months of the federal authorization date. Subsequent invoices will be submitted in intervals not to exceed six (6) months.
- 4.5 <u>Final Invoice</u>: The **LPA** will submit to the **STATE** a complete and detailed final invoice with applicable supporting documentation of all incurred costs, less previous payments, no later than twelve (12) months from the date of completion of work or from the date of the previous invoice, whichever occurs first. If a final invoice is not received within this time frame, the most recent invoice

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may be considered the final invoice and the obligation of the funds closed, Form BLR 05613 (Engineering Payment Record) is required to be submitted with the final invoice for engineering projects.

- 4.6 <u>Project Closeout</u>: The LPA shall provide the final report to the appropriate STATE district office within twelve (12) months of the physical completion date of the project so that the report may be audited and approved for payment. If the deadline cannot be met, a written explanation must be provided to the district prior to the end of the twelve (12) months documenting the reason and the new anticipated date of completion. If the extended deadline is not met, this process must be repeated until the project is closed. Failure to follow this process may result in the immediate close-out of the project and loss of further funding.
- 4.7 Project End Date: The period of performance (end date) for state and federal obligation purposes is five (5) years for projects under \$1,000,000 or seven (7) years for projects over \$1,000,000 from the execution date of the agreement. Requests for time extensions and joint agreement amendments must be received and approved prior to expiration of the project end date. Failure to extend the end date may result in the immediate close-out of the project and loss of further funding.

V. THE LPA AGREES

- 5.1 To acquire in its name, or in the name of the STATE if on the STATE highway system, all right-of-way necessary for this project in accordance with the requirements of Titles II and III of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, and established State policies and procedures. Prior to advertising for bids, the LPA shall certify to the STATE that all requirements of Titles II and III of said Uniform Act have been satisfied. The disposition of encroachments, if any, will be cooperatively determined by representatives of the LPA, the STATE, and the FHWA if required.
- 5.2 To provide for all utility adjustments and to regulate the use of the right-of-way of this improvement by utilities, public and private, in accordance with the current Utility Accommodation Policy for Local Public Agency Highway and Street Systems.
- 5,3 To provide on-site engineering supervision and inspection during construction of the proposed improvement.
- 5.4 To retain jurisdiction of the completed improvement unless specified otherwise by schedule (schedule should be accompanied by a location map). If the improvement location is currently under road district jurisdiction, a jurisdictional schedule is required.
- 5.5 To maintain or cause to be maintained the completed improvement (or that portion within its jurisdiction as established by schedule) in a manner satisfactory to the STATE and the FHWA.
- 5.6 To provide if required, for the improvement of any railroad-highway grade crossing and rail crossing protection within the limits of the proposed improvement.
- 5.7 To regulate parking and traffic in accordance with the approved project report.
- 5.8 To regulate encroachments on public rights-of-way in accordance with current Illinois Compiled Statutes.
- 5.9 To regulate the discharge of sanitary sewage into any storm water drainage system constructed with this improvement in accordance with the current Illinois Compiled Statutes.
- 5.10 For contracts awarded by the LPA, the LPA shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin or sex in the award and performance of any USDOT assisted contract or in the administration of its DBE program or the requirements of 49 CFR part 26. The LPA shall take all necessary and reasonable steps under 49 CFR part 26 to ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of USDOT assisted contracts. The LPA's DBE program, as required by 49 CFR part 26 and as approved by USDOT, is incorporated by reference in this agreement. Upon notification to the recipient of its failure to carry out its approved program, the STATE may impose sanctions as provided for under Part 26 and may, in appropriate cases, refer the matter for enforcement under 18 U.S. C 1001 and/or the Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act of 1986 (31 U.S.C 3801 et seq.). In the absence of a USDOT approved LPA DBE Program or on STATE awarded contracts, this agreement shall be administered under the provisions of the STATE'S USDOT approved Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program.
- 5.12 That execution of this agreement constitutes the LPA's concurrence in the award of the construction contract to the responsible low bidder as determined by the STATE.

VI. THE STATE AGREES

- 6.1 To provide such guidance, assistance, and supervision to monitor and perform audits to the extent necessary to assure validity of the LPA's certification of compliance with Title II and III Requirements.
- 6.2 To receive bids for construction of the proposed improvement when the plans have been approved by the STATE (and FHWA, if required) and to award a contract for construction of the proposed improvement after receipt of a satisfactory bid.
- 6.3 To provide all initial funding and payments to the contractor for construction work let by the STATE. The LPA will be invoiced for their share of contract costs per the method of payment selected under Method of Financing based on the Division of Costs shown on Schedule 2.

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- 6.4 For agreements with federal and/or state funds in local let/day labor construction, construction engineering, utility work and/or railroad work:
 - a. To reimburse the LPA for federal and/or state share on the basis of periodic billings, provided said billings contain sufficient cost information and show evidence of payments by the LPA;
 - b. To provide independent assurance sampling and furnish off-site material inspection and testing at sources normally visited by STATE inspectors for steel, cement, aggregate, structural steel, and other materials customarily tested by the STATE.

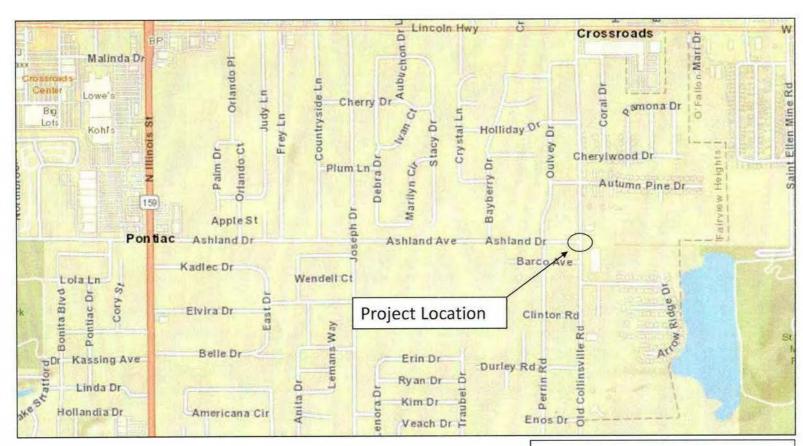
