A RESOLUTION TO ADD TERRITORY TO ST. CLAIR COUNTY MIDAMERICA ENTERPRISE ZONE

WHEREAS, the following Resolution is adopted based upon the following premises, to wit;

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted the "Illinois Enterprise Zone Act of 1982," 20 ILCS 655/1 et seq., as amended (hereinafter referred to as the "Act"), to alleviate distressed economic conditions in certain depressed areas; and

WHEREAS, the Southwestern Illinois Development Authority Act, 70 ILLCS 520/1 et seq., as amended, authorizes Southwestern Illinois Development Authority (hereinafter "SWIDA), by ordinance to designate prior to January 1, 2000, a portion of the territorial jurisdiction of SWIDA located in the townships of O'Fallon, Lebanon, Mascoutah, and Shiloh Valley of the County of St. Clair (hereinafter "County") for certification as an Enterprise Zone under the Act in addition to any other Enterprise Zones which may be created under that Act. The area shall have all the privileges and rights of an Enterprise Zone, under the Illinois Enterprise Zone Act, but shall not be counted in determining the number of Enterprise Zones to be created in any year under that Act; and

WHEREAS, the health, safety and welfare of the residents of St. Clair County, and the Municipalities of Lebanon, Mascoutah, O'Fallon and Shiloh (hereinafter "Municipalities") are dependent, in part, upon a healthy private sector in St. Clair County; and

WHEREAS, the development, growth and expansion of the private sector requires a cooperative and continuous partnership between government and the private sector; and

WHEREAS, there are certain areas in the County that need the particular attention of government, business and labor to attract private sector investment and directly aid the entire County and the residents thereof; and

WHEREAS, a number of residents within the incorporated municipalities of Lebanon, Mascoutah, O'Fallon, Shiloh, and adjacent areas of unincorporated St. Clair County, have for several years suffered pervasive unemployment and economic distress, related to a variety of economic factors negatively affecting the incorporated and unincorporated areas mentioned above; and

WHEREAS, the duly constituted legislative bodies of St. Clair County and the municipalities of Lebanon, Mascoutah, O'Fallon and Shiloh are cognizant of the distressed conditions existing within this area and are desirous of alleviating these distressed conditions; and

WHEREAS, St. Clair County and the municipalities of Lebanon, Mascoutah, O'Fallon and Shiloh have indicated their willingness and desire to cooperate in designating portions of their municipalities and unincorporated area in St. Clair County as an Enterprise Zone; and

WHEREAS, on November 29, 1999, the St. Clair County Board passed a Resolution entitled "A Resolution establishing an Enterprise Zone consisting of adjacent area within the County of St. Clair, City of Lebanon, City of Mascoutah, City of O'Fallon and Village of Shiloh, subject to approval by the Southwestern Illinois Development Authority and Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, and approving and authorizing the execution of an Intergovernmental Agreement" being Resolution No. 268-99-R; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held at 10:00 a.m. November 14, 2024 at Lebanon City Hall where pertinent information was presented; and

WHEREAS, the County Board of St. Clair County has found it appropriate to amend Resolution No. 268-99-R to add territory to the St. Clair County MidAmerica Enterprise Zone program by modifying the boundary to include potential development sites in Lebanon, endorsed by the government units within the St. Clair County MidAmerica Enterprise Zone, all of which has been found to be beneficial to the zone through capital investment and employment opportunities; and

WHEREAS, with the further expansion of the enterprise zone, the new additions will receive all the state and local amenities provided by the present enterprise zone.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF ST CLAIR COUNTY AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. That the County Board of St. Clair County hereby approves, subject to the concurrence of the Municipalities and the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity; the expansion of the St. Clair County MidAmerica Enterprise Zone to include the property identified in Exhibit A hereby incorporated by reference.
- Section 2. That the County Board of St. Clair County, subject to the passage of ordinances by the Municipalities and subject to the approval of the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity hereby approves the new boundary description of the enterprise zone as identified in Exhibit B hereto.
- Section 4. That the City of Lebanon will provide all local benefits and amenities in the expanded territory as is currently being accorded to inhabitants of the St. Clair County MidAmerica Enterprise Zone.
- Section 5. The Chairman, if applicable, is authorized to execute an Amended Enterprise Zone Intergovernmental Agreement.
- Section 6. In the event any section or provision of this Resolution shall be held unconstitutional or invalid by any Court, in whole or in part, such holding shall not affect the validity of this Resolution or any remaining part of this Resolution, other than the part held unconstitutional or invalid.
- <u>Section 7.</u> All ordinances or resolutions, or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Resolution, are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistencies.
- <u>Section 8.</u> Nothing contained herein shall in any manner be deemed or construed to alter, modify, supersede, supplant, or otherwise nullify any other ordinance or resolution of the County or the requirements thereof whether or not relating to or in any manner connected with the subject matter hereof, unless expressly set forth herein.
- Section 9. In all or other respects the original Resolution, adopted on November 29, 1999, and subsequent amendments shall remain in full force and effect.
- Section 10. This Resolution is effective upon its passage by the County Board, approval by the Chairman, and publication according to law.

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EXHIBIT A ENTERPRISE ZONE BOUNDARY MAP

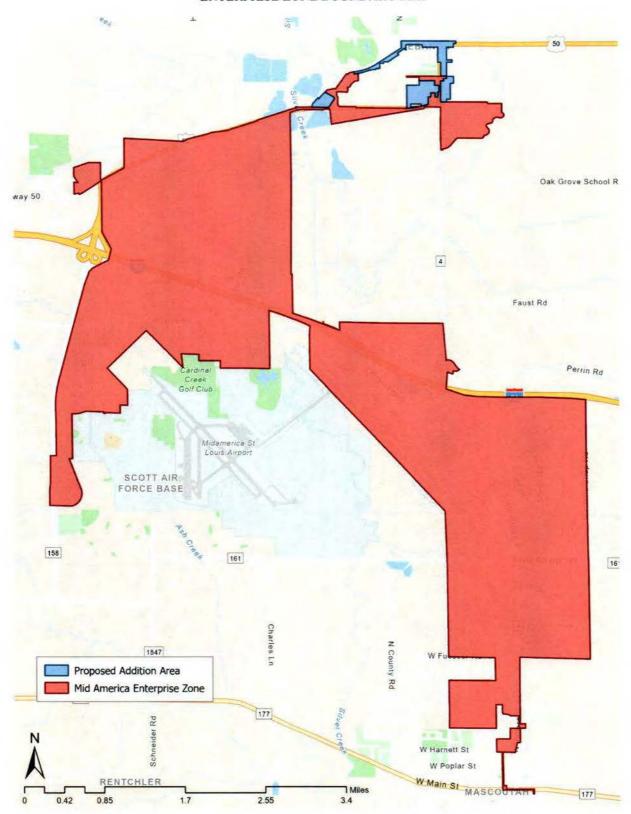

AMENDMENT TO THE ST. CLAIR COUNTY MIDAMERICA ENTERPRISE ZONE INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

An Amending Intergovernmental Agreement by and among the County of St. Clair, Illinois (hereinafter referred to as "St. Clair County"); the City of Lebanon (hereinafter referred to as "Lebanon"); the City of Mascoutah (hereinafter referred to as "Mascoutah"); the City of O'Fallon (hereinafter referred to as "O'Fallon"); the Village of Shiloh (hereinafter referred to as "Shiloh"); and the Southwestern Illinois Development Authority (hereinafter referred to as "SWIDA") in respect to the St. Clair County MidAmerica Enterprise Zone.

WHEREAS, the Southwestern Illinois Development Authority Act, 70 ILCS 520/1 et seq., as amended, authorizes SWIDA by ordinance to designate prior to January 1, 2000 a portion of the territorial jurisdiction of SWIDA located in the townships of O'Fallon, Lebanon, Mascoutah, and Shiloh Valley of the County of St. Clair for certification as an Enterprise Zone under the Illinois Enterprise Zone Act in addition to any other Enterprise Zones which may be created under that Act. The area shall have all the privileges and rights of an Enterprise Zone under the Illinois Enterprise Zone Act, but shall not be counted in determining the number of Enterprise Zones to be created in any year under that Act;

WHEREAS, the Illinois Enterprise Zone Act, 20 ILCS 655/1 et seq., as amended, requires a county or municipality, or any combination thereof, to designate by ordinance and/or resolution an area within its jurisdiction as an enterprise zone;

WHEREAS, St. Clair County, Lebanon, Mascoutah, O'Fallon and Shiloh have by separate ordinances and/or resolution designated an enterprise zone for establishment by SWIDA and have obtained approval of such zone;

WHEREAS, the Illinois Enterprise Zone Act 20 ILCS 655/8.2 new Sec. 8.2 c further requires that the administration of an enterprise zone shall be under the jurisdiction of the designating municipality or county and further provides that a Zone Administrator shall be appointed;

WHEREAS, the parties entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement on December 16, 1999 for the management and operation of the Enterprise Zone;

WHEREAS, the parties have determined that it is in the best interest of the parties and public that the Enterprise Zone be amended to add territory to the St. Clair County MidAmerica Enterprise Zone;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed by the County of St. Clair, Illinois, the City of Lebanon, the City of Mascoutah, the City of O'Fallon, the Village of Shiloh and SWIDA that the Intergovernmental Agreement, as previously amended and agreed to by these parties, shall be further amended in the following respects:

<u>Section 1.</u> Subject to approval by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, the modification of the St. Clair County MidAmerica Enterprise Zone boundary as identified in Exhibit A hereby incorporated by reference.

Subject to approval by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, the St. Clair County MidAmerica Enterprise Zone boundary shall be as described in Exhibit B attached hereto.

<u>Section 3.</u> With the expansion of the enterprise zone, the new property will receive all the state and local amenities provided by the present enterprise zone.

Section 4. In all or other respects the Intergovernmental Agreement filed with St. Clair County in 1999, along with the subsequent amendments, shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. This Amendment may be executed in any number of counterparts and any party hereto may execute any such counterparts, each of which when executed and delivered shall be deemed to be an original and all of which counterparts taken together shall constitute one and the same instrument. This Amendment shall

become binding when one or more counterparts taken together shall have been executed and delivered by the parties. It shall not be necessary in making proof of this Amendment or any counterpart hereof to produce or account for any other counterparts.

ENTERPRISE ZONE BOUNDARY MAP

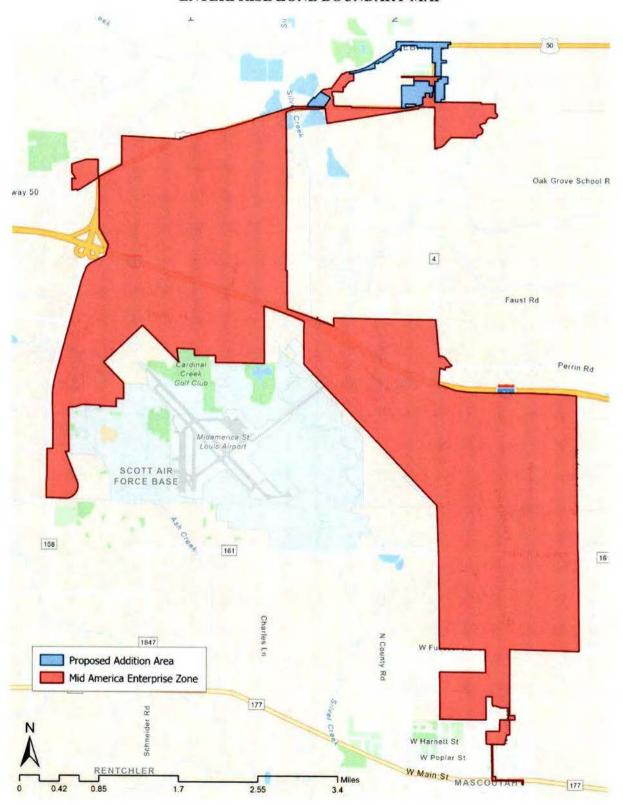

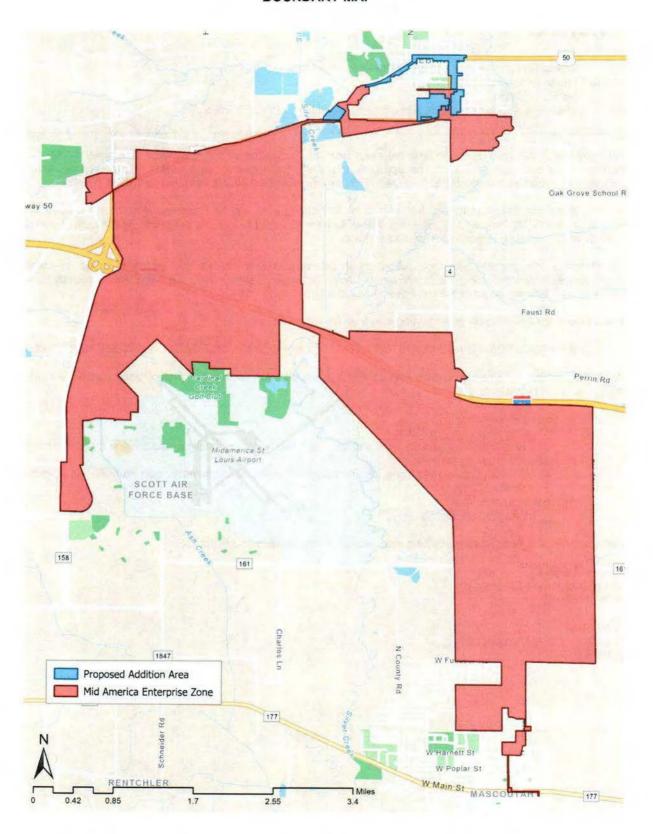

A RESOLUTION GRANTED A REQUEST FOR A SPECIAL USE PERMIT BY CEDAR FARM LLC C/O JERRY FROMME & STEVEN FROMME, OWNERS AND FAYETTEVILLE TWP II SOLAR LLC, APPLICANTS, FOR PROPERTY LOCATED AT XXX LICKENBROCK SCHOOL ROAD, MARISSA, ILLINOIS, IN FAYETTEVILLE TOWNSHIP. (CASE #2025-03-SP)

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held in the County Board Room, 5th Floor, St. Clair County Building, #10 Public Square, Belleville, Illinois, on May 6, 2025 at 6:15 P.M., before the Zoning Board and notice of said hearing was duly given; and,

WHEREAS, on May 6, 2025 the Zoning Board of Appeals after hearing the testimony and evidence presented; after considering all relevant sections of the St. Clair County Zoning Code, and after further consideration of the matter, Granted the applicant's a Special Use Permit to allow a 5 MW Commercial Solar Energy System with an approximate project size of 22-acres on a 37.21 +/- acre parcel in an "A" Agricultural Industry Zone District due to the following:

- 1. The land in question is located in an "A" Agricultural Industry Zone District. The proposed facility is adjacent on the south by an existing tree line, on the west and north by farm fields which are to be developed into a previously permitted solar development, and on the east by Lickenbrock School Road and existing tree line. There are no non-participating residential properties on any property line. The closest non-participated residence is over 400 ft. from the facility. All required setbacks are met or exceeded per the plans submitted.
- 2. The Applicant is requesting a special use permit to construct a 5.0 MW Commercial Solar Energy Facility/Community Solar project on a footprint of approximately 22 acres. Construction will take approximately 12-16 weeks once commenced; anticipated start date will be in the fall of 2025.
- 3. The project will include typical photovoltaic panels placed on a single axis tracking system, with inverters, transformer(s), no battery storage, with interconnection to Ameren power poles with approximately 6 to 7 new power poles being installed near the entrance of the facility.
- 4. Access to the project will come from Lickenbrock School Road on the north-east side of the property via an approved entrance by the appropriate road/highway authority.
- 5. Areas of bare ground will be covered with a pollinator-friendly seed mix and maintained throughout the life of the project by the Applicant/owner of the facility. There will be vegetative screening

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- planted on the north-east corner of the property that is adjacent to Lickenbrock School Road per the plans submitted. Such vegetative screening shall be maintained throughout the life of the project.
- Once the project has been constructed there will be no added traffic on a daily basis. The only additional traffic will be for periodic inspection and maintenance.
- 7. Any sound created by the completed Commercial Solar Energy Facility will be minimal and within the limits as provided by the State of Illinois and the St. Clair County Zoning Code.
- 8. The perimeter of the project site will be fenced with a 7-foot-tall farm-field/agricultural styled fence with metal-galvanized posts with concrete.
- 9. The proposed setbacks of the project area will either meet or exceed County requirements and comply with current State statute regarding non-participating residential properties, occupied community buildings, and property line borders per the site plan.
- 10. The LESA rating for this parcel is 175, which is low for agricultural retention.

WHEREAS, the Zoning Board of Appeals further concluded as follows:

- (1) The proposed design, location, development, and the operation of the proposed Commercial Solar Energy Facility/Community Solar project adequately protects the public's health, safety and welfare, and physical environment. There will be a thorough decommissioning plan in place with financing for the decommissioning of the project, in which the Applicant volunteered to post the full amount at the time of issuance of a building permit; little to no glare is expected onto adjacent roadways and properties; the site will be fenced with a farm-field/agricultural type fence with galvanized metal posts with concrete; there will be coordination with emergency personnel; the site will be seeded with a pollinator-friendly seed mix; and the site will be appropriately and continuously maintained throughout its life.
- (2) The proposed Special Use will not have an adverse impact on the County's Comprehensive Plan as the site is rural in nature, contains agricultural ground, and per the Comprehensive Plan the parcel is slated to remain zoned agricultural for agricultural type uses listed in the St. Clair County Zoning Code, one of which is a Commercial Solar Energy Facility. Additionally, the LESA score—175—is low for agricultural retention, and adjacent parcels to the west and north are being developed for other solar projects. Therefore, the development and transition of this parcel into a Commercial Solar Energy Facility/Community Solar project would be consistent with County Zoning Code, state law, and the development trend in the area includes other commercial solar development.
- (3) The proposed Special Use will have a positive impact on the County's overall tax base. The neighboring properties consist of farm fields, farm fields that have been permitted to be developed into other solar projects, a single-family residence to the south that is owned by one of the members of Cedar Farms LLC, and east across Lickenbrock School Road is another residence over 400 ft away, thus, the proposed project will have minimal impact on the value of neighboring properties.
- (4) The proposed Special Use will enhance the provision of electric utilities to the area and would allow people to subscribe and purchase power at a lower cost. Further, the proposed Special Use will create no burden on existing utilities and provides a needed clean and renewable energy alternative. In addition, the proposed Special Use will not lead to an increase in traffic after it is constructed, as the only additional traffic will consist of vehicles visiting the site for periodic maintenance and inspection, and Lickenbrock School Road is adequate to support the temporary traffic.

- (5) The adjacent uses are agricultural, other solar developments (on two sides), a single-family residence to the south that is owned by one of the members of Cedar Farms LLC, and east across Lickenbrock School Road is another single-family residence over 400 ft away. Thus, the proposed Special Use, based upon the site plan, is compatible with adjacent uses and uses in the general vicinity.
- (6) The Board placed the following additional conditions on the Special Use Permit:
 - (a) The Applicant/operator of the facility will continuously maintain the ground cover and any planting/vegetative screening (including but not limited to mowing and cutting brush and trees and keeping the same free of noxious weeds and invasive plants) throughout the life of the facility. Applicant/operator shall also continuously maintain the fence throughout the life of the facility.
 - (b) No overweight or oversized loads shall be delivered to the site.
 - (c) Construction hours shall be limited to Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. No construction work is to be done on Saturdays, Sundays, evenings, or holidays unless written approval is obtained from the St. Clair County Building and Zoning Department Administrator.
 - (d) During excavation, site prep, or disturbance of soil onsite, any topsoil shall be preserved and returned to its prior condition, and all required and necessary erosion and storm water measures shall be undertaken by the Applicant at all times.
 - (e) The Applicant and all other subsequent owners, agents, assigns, persons or entities that have any interest in, control over, or rights to the proposed Commercial Solar Energy Facility/Community Solar project shall adhere to all applicable requirements of the St. Clair County Zoning Code, including but not limited to Section 40-5-30, and all conditions placed on this Special Use, as well as state law.
 - (f) The Applicant shall post with the County all applicable bond amounts as required by the AIMA and the State of Illinois, and in such acceptable form required by the County; however, Applicant volunteered to post the full amount of the bond, without deduction of salvage value, at the time of requesting/applying for the building permit. Applicant shall submit all finalized documentation and provide the appropriate bond form in the proper agreed upon amount prior to being issued a building permit.

WHEREAS, the County Board of St. Clair, Illinois, concur with the aforesaid findings, conditions and recommendations of the Zoning Board of Appeals;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the County Board of St. Clair County, Illinois, that the request for a SPECIAL USE PERMIT be Granted.

Request: A Special Use Permit to allow a 5.0 MW Commercial Solar Energy Facility (CSEF) with an approximate project size of 22-acres, to be situated on a parcel of 37.21+/- acres in size, in an Agricultural Industry Zone District, on property commonly known as XXXX Lickenbrock School Road, Marissa, Illinois in Fayetteville Township (PPN: 19-15.0-200-017).

Applicant representative and owner of 6 GM, LLC, Peter McAuliffe, presented the application. Mr. McAuliffe advised that the Applicant, Fayetteville Twp. II Solar, LLC ("FTS") is a wholly owned subsidiary of 6 GM, LLC. FTS is the developer, owner, and operator of this project, and would monitor and maintain the same once constructed. The property in question will be leased by FTS from Cedar Farm, LLC, during the life of the project.

The Applicant explained that the project is to be situated on a 37.21 +/- acre parcel on the west side of Lickenbrock School Road. The actual project size/footprint will be situated on approximately 22 acres of land, all of which is zoned agricultural. The adjacent properties and land uses are zoned agricultural and are either being used as farm ground or farm ground that has been previously approved for solar development, and there are a few residential uses nearby.

The Applicant explained that this is a community solar project, which will afford county residents the opportunity to participate in this project and receive a savings on their monthly Ameren bill.

The project will consist of approximately 11,789 solar photovoltaic modules on a single axis tracker system, 40 inverters, 2 transformers, a 20-foot-wide gravel access road, as well as associated electrical equipment and materials necessary to collect the energy produced and transfer to the power grid. The project will interconnect to Ameren via power poles adjacent to Lickenbrock School Road. Additionally, the project will be fenced by a 7 ft. heigh fence, which is of agricultural style fencing. Discussion was had regarding the type of fence posts to utilize—wood posts or galvanized metal with concrete.

Solar panels will not exceed 18 ft. in height at full tilt. The fence line for the project will be over 50 feet from the front, side, and rear property line, and all County and State required setbacks will be met or exceeded. The project is over 400 ft. from the nearest existing residence.

The Applicant advised that the facility once constructed will be planted in pollinator-friendly seed mix. A landscape buffer was discussed and the Applicant explained that the plans provide for a vegetation buffer along the north-east corner of the parcel in question immediately adjacent to Lickenbrock School Road. Applicant agrees to maintain the buffer and ground cover for the life of the project. To the south of the project is a naturally occurring tree line and small patch of woods that

will remain, creating a natural buffer between the project and the residence to the south. The areas adjacent to the west and north of the property have been previously permitted for a large-scale-industry solar project.

If approved the anticipated start of construction is to begin in the fall of 2025, and last approximately 12 to 16 weeks. During the construction period it is anticipated there may be 2 to 15 personal vehicles and 1 to 10 construction trucks traveling to the site per day. Applicant advises that it will conduct regular maintenance visits to the site to ensure vegetative cover is maintained and is to develop a comprehensive landscape plan that will include stormwater management, ground cover and vegetative screening.

After the operational life of the facility, approximately 40 years, the Applicant will decommission the facility and restore the land to its original condition. The Applicant has executed an Agricultural Impact Mitigation Agreement (AIMA) and submitted a proposed decommissioning plan that sets forth the decommissioning cost of the facility. The Applicant advised that it would post a bond with the County, and such bond will not include any deduction for salvage value. Applicant during further discussion of decommissioning and bonding volunteered to post the full amount of the bond at the time the Applicant applies for a building permit. Applicant was advised that, if approved, such would be acceptable to the County.

The Applicant's submittal contained responses from IDNR, IL SPHO, & USFWS, showing no adverse impacts.

No persons appeared for the hearing other than representatives of the owner of the property in question—Cedar Farm LLC—Shannon Fromme, a member of Cedar Farms, LLC, testified in support of the project and voiced that he doesn't believe the solar project would affect the growth of nearby agricultural crops and the project would not affect property values in the area.

County Board Member Ed Cockrell testified and advised that he had no objection to the project and overall was in support of it. County Board Member Bob Trentman inquired of the Applicant about the need for a Project Labor Agreement. Applicant testified that if one is required pursuant to statute then such would be put in place.

The Zoning Board of Appeals discussed at length with the Applicant and those present the development of the project, the selected location, interconnect to Ameren, setbacks, fencing, drainage, approvals from IDNR, SHPO, as well as various other topics pertaining to the operation of the solar facility. It was noted that the LESA score for the property was 175 (low) for agricultural retention.

Witnesses having been sworn, testimony and evidence presented, and the Zoning Board of Appeals being fully advised in the premises, and the Board having considered the following in conjunction therewith, and found:

WHEREAS, on May 6, 2025 the Zoning Board of Appeals after hearing the testimony and evidence presented; after considering all relevant sections of the St. Clair County Zoning Code, and after further consideration of the matter, Granted the applicant's a Special Use Permit to allow a 5 MW Commercial Solar Farm Energy System, with an approximate project size of 18 +/- acres, on a combined 23.27-acres in an "A" Agricultural Industry Zone District due to the following:

- 1. The land in question is located in an "A" Agricultural Industry Zone District. The proposed facility is adjacent to other farm fields to the north and east, with an existing solar development to the north; to the west there is a residential area, but such is buffered by an existing tree line that will not be disturbed; and on the south by St. Clair Avenue, with an existing residence in the south-east corner that has existing trees around its property line. All non-participating residential properties will have a setback distance from the solar panels of at least 150 ft.
 - 2. The Applicant is requesting a special use permit to construct a 5.0 MW Commercial Solar Energy Facility/Community Solar project on three parcels that total 23.3 +/- acres, with a solar footprint of approximately 17-19 acres. Construction will take approximately 24-36 weeks once started; anticipated start date will be in the Fall of 2025 or Spring of 2026.
 - The project will include typical photovoltaic panels placed on a single axis tracking system, with inverters, transformers, with interconnection to Ameren power poles with a total of six (6) new power poles being installed near the entrance of the facility.
 - Access to the project will come from St. Clair Avenue on the south side of the property via an approved road entrance.

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- Areas of bare ground will be covered with a native grass mix including pollinator-friendly and/or native meadow/prairie plantings to minimize erosion and such shall be maintained throughout the life of the project by the Applicant/owner of the facility.

- (3) The proposed Special Use will have a positive impact on the County's overall tax base. The neighboring properties consist of farm fields, a farm field that is permitted to be developed into a solar project, single-family residences to the west but buffered by a natural tree line and one residence in the south-east corner with tree buffer. This area is not experiencing expansion or growth of residential development. Thus, the proposed project will have minimal impact on the value of neighboring properties.

- (4) The proposed Special Use will enhance the provision of electric utilities to the area and would allow people to subscribe and purchase power at a lower cost. Further, the proposed Special Use will create no burden on existing utilities and provides a needed clean and renewable energy alternative. In addition, the proposed Special Use will not lead to an increase in traffic after it is constructed, as the only additional traffic will consist of vehicles visiting the site for periodic maintenance and inspection, and St. Clair Avenue is more than adequate to handle any additional temporary traffic.
- (5) The adjacent uses are agricultural, a previously permitted solar development, and residential uses. The residential uses are nonparticipating; however, the development meets or exceeds the required setbacks. Thus, the proposed Special Use based upon the site plan is compatible with adjacent uses and uses in the general vicinity.
- (6) The Board placed the following additional conditions on the Special Use Permit:
 - (a) The Applicant/operator of the facility will continuously maintain the ground cover and any plantings (including but not limited to mowing and cutting brush and trees and keeping the same free of noxious weeds and invasive plants) throughout the life of the facility. Applicant/operator shall also continuously maintain the fence throughout the life of the facility.
 - (b) No overweight or oversized loads shall be delivered to the site.
 - (c) Construction hours shall be limited to Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. No construction work is to be done on Saturdays, Sundays, evenings, or holidays unless written approval is obtained from the St. Clair County Building and Zoning Department Administrator.
 - (d) During excavation, site prep, or disturbance of soil onsite, any topsoil shall be preserved and returned to its prior condition, and all required and necessary erosion and storm water measures shall be undertaken by the Applicant at all times.
 - (e) The Applicant and all other subsequent owners, agents, assigns, persons or entities that have any interest in, control over, or rights to the proposed Commercial Solar Energy Facility/Community Solar project shall adhere to all applicable requirements of the St. Clair County Zoning Code, including but not limited to Section 40-5-30, and all conditions placed on this Special Use, as well as state law.
 - (f) The Applicant shall post with the County all applicable bond amounts as required by the AIMA and the State of Illinois and in such acceptable form required by the County; however, Applicant volunteered to post the full amount of the bond, without deduction of salvage value, at the time of requesting/applying for the building permit. Applicant shall submit all finalized documentation and provide the appropriate bond form in the proper agreed upon amount prior to being issued a building permit.

WHEREAS, the County Board of St. Clair, Illinois, concur with the aforesaid findings, conditions and recommendations of the Zoning Board of Appeals;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the County Board of St. Clair County, Illinois, that the request for a SPECIAL USE PERMIT be Granted.

Applicant representatives Jacob Van Domelen and Ryan Fulton (Project Developer) of Sunvest Solar, LLC ("Sunvest") presented the application. The Applicant, SV CSG East St. Louis, LLC is a subsidiary of Sunvest. Sunvest has other solar projects in development across Illinois, including St. Clair County.

Mr. Van Domelen and Mr. Fulton went over the application packet, which included a detailed description of the project and its area. The Applicant desires to develop a 5.0 MW Commercial Solar Farm Energy System, single axis tracking ground mounted (approx. 10,000 solar panels), on approximately 23.3-acres of land situated on three parcels (02-23.0-305-001, 002, & 003), however, the project site/footprint will only consist of 17-19 acres being fenced and under solar panels. This development is commonly known as a Community Solar project. Community Solar projects allow persons and businesses who cannot construct similar solar facilities on their property to subscribe to a solar project to purchase power. The project will provide clean power for over 750-800 average homes a year.

The Applicant is a contract purchaser of the property and will purchase the property if approved. Applicant stated it is a low impact project, while some tree clearing is needed (a small patch near St. Clair Avenue), the project won't impact wetlands. The Applicant will secure any necessary flood plain permit(s) for any development in a flood plain. Construction is estimated to start either in the Fall of 2025 or the Spring of 2026, with a total construction timeline of 24-36 weeks.

The Applicant went over the tax implications from the project, energy savings and the positive environmental impact the project will have.

The solar project fence will be setback at least a 50 ft. from the property line, and the solar array will be at least 150+ ft. from all nonparticipating residential uses. The Applicant stated that it will meet or exceed the setbacks as required by County Zoning Code and Illinois State Statute, per the site plans submitted. The fencing that will surround the perimeter of the facility will be 8 ft. tall, woven agricultural "Knot" style fence with a locked gate for security. The fence will be compliant with IDNR requirements and will use galvanized metal posts with concrete. There will be one access point from St. Clair Avenue, a gravel access road, as indicated on the site plan, and as approved by the proper road authority. All project infrastructure including the solar array, equipment pad, transformers, and inverters will be located inside the fenced area. The height of the project equipment will not exceed 20 feet.

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Zoning Board of Appeals' Advisory Report re 2025-04-SP

The project will require an electrical interconnect with Ameren of Illinois, and the Applicant has executed an interconnection agreement with Ameren. On the south side of the property, outside the fence, near the entrance approximately six (6) utility poles will be installed that will provide the interconnection point with Ameren of Illinois. There will be no battery storage on site.

For landscaping, the area disturbed during construction will be replanted with a native grass mix including pollinator-friendly and/or native meadow/prairie plantings to minimize erosion for the life of the project. Said plantings will be maintained appropriately throughout the life of the project. There is no vegetative screening planned for this project as the south abuts St. Clair Avenue, and on the west and north-west corner there is an existing tree line providing a natural buffer and on the south-east corner there are existing trees providing a natural buffer. To the north and north-east such areas contain agricultural fields and a previously permitted solar development.

Additionally, the Applicant's submittal contained responses from IDNR, IL SHPO, & USFWS, showing no adverse impacts; however, IL SHPO requires a Phase I Study (cultural and archaeological survey) to be conducted. The Applicant explained the Phase I process and that it would not build on any areas that were determined sensitive by the study or IL SHPO. Depending on the number and size of the areas that may be deemed sensitive/unable to build upon, if any, the project may be deemed not feasible by the Applicant, however, such will not occur until Phase I is completed.

After the operational life of the facility the Applicant will decommission the facility and restore the land to its original condition. The Applicant has executed an Agricultural Impact Mitigation Agreement (AIMA) and submitted a proposed decommission plan that sets forth the decommissioning cost of the facility. The Applicant advised that it would post a bond with the County as required by the AIMA and state law, and such bond will not include any deduction for salvage value. Applicant during further discussion of decommissioning and bonding volunteered to post the full amount of the bond at the time the Applicant applies for a building permit. Applicant was advised that, if the application is approved, such would be acceptable to the County.

Frank Dorris, III, adjacent landowner to the north-east, appeared and expressed concern about nearby culverts becoming clogged because of the project and that it currently floods in the area where the development is planned. The Applicant provide comment about the effects of storm water from solar developments, how the panels, as well as associated equipment, will be raised above any flooding height (but will still be in compliance with County height requirements), and that overall, the project will not add to flooding issues.

County Board Bob Trentman was present at the hearing. He expressed his concerns with project labor agreements with these types of projects, and that solar companies produce or submit proposals just under 5.0 MW to avoid entering into project labor agreements. The Applicant discussed this issue and indicated that if it was required under the law to enter into a project labor agreement due to megawatt size they would.

The Zoning Board of Appeals discussed at length with the Applicant and those present the development of the project, the selected location, interconnect to Ameren, setbacks, ground cover, fencing, drainage, local area flooding, as well as various other topics pertaining to the operation of the solar facility.

The LESA score for the parcels in question was 133, which is low for agricultural retention.

Witnesses having been sworn, testimony and evidence presented, and the Zoning Board of Appeals being fully advised in the premises, and the Board having considered the following in conjunction therewith, and found:

The Board made the following findings of fact:

- 1. The land in question is located in an "A" Agricultural Industry Zone District. The proposed facility is adjacent to other farm fields to the north and east, with an existing solar development to the north; to the west there is a residential area, but such is buffered by an existing tree line that will not be disturbed; and on the south by St. Clair Avenue, with an existing residence in the south-east corner that has existing trees around its property line. All non-participating residential properties will have a setback distance from the solar panels of at least 150 ft.
- 2. The Applicant is requesting a special use permit to construct a 5.0 MW Commercial Solar Energy Facility/Community Solar project on three parcels that total 23.3 +/- acres, with a solar footprint of approximately 17-19 acres. Construction will take approximately 24-36 weeks once started; anticipated start date will be in the Fall of 2025 or Spring of 2026.
- 3. The project will include typical photovoltaic panels placed on a single axis tracking system, with inverters, transformers, with interconnection to Ameren power poles with a total of six (6) new power poles being installed near the entrance of the facility.
- Access to the project will come from St. Clair Avenue on the south side of the property via an approved road entrance.
- Areas of bare ground will be covered with a native grass mix including pollinator-friendly and/or native meadow/prairie plantings to minimize erosion and such shall be maintained throughout the life of the project by the Applicant/owner of the facility.
- 6. Once the project has been constructed there will be no added traffic on a daily basis. The only additional traffic will be for periodic inspection and maintenance.
- 7. Any sound created by the completed Commercial Solar Energy Facility will be minimal and within the limits as provided by the State of Illinois and the St. Clair County Zoning Code.
- 8. The perimeter of the project site will be fenced with 8 ft. tall, woven agricultural "Knot" style fence with a locked gate for security. The fence will be compliant with IDNR requirements and will use galvanized metal posts with concrete.
- The proposed setbacks of the project area will either meet or exceed County requirements and comply with current State statute regarding non-participating residential properties and occupied community buildings per the site plan.
- 10. The LESA rating for this parcel is 133, which is low for agricultural retention.

The Board found and concluded as follows:

(1) Whether the proposed design, location, development and operation of the proposed Special Use will adequately protect the public health, safety, and welfare and the physical environment. The Board found as follows: The proposed design, location, development, and the operation of the proposed Commercial Solar Energy Facility/Community Solar project adequately protects the public's health, safety and welfare, and physical environment. There will be a thorough decommissioning plan in place with financing for the decommissioning of the project, in which the Applicant volunteered to post the full amount at the time of issuance of a building permit; little to no glare is expected onto adjacent roadways and properties; the site will be fenced with a farm-

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- field/agricultural type fence with galvanized metal posts with concrete; there will be coordination with emergency personnel; the site will be seeded with a pollinator-friendly and/or native meadow/prairie plantings; and the site will be appropriately and continuously maintained throughout its life.
- (2) Whether the proposed Special Use is consistent with the County's Comprehensive Plan. The Board found as follows: The proposed Special Use will not have an adverse impact on the County's Comprehensive Plan as the site is rural in nature, contains agricultural ground, and per the Comprehensive Plan the parcel is slated to remain zoned agricultural for agricultural type uses listed in the St. Clair County Zoning Code, one of which is a Commercial Solar Energy Facility. Additionally, the LESA score—133—is low for agricultural retention, and adjacent parcels to the north are being developed for another solar project. Therefore, the development and transition of this parcel into a Commercial Solar Energy Facility/Community Solar project would be consistent with County Zoning Code, state law, and development in the area is slated for other commercial solar development.
- (3) The effect the proposed Special Use may have on the value of the neighboring property and on the County's overall tax base. The Board found as follows: The proposed Special Use will have a positive impact on the County's overall tax base. The neighboring properties consist of farm fields, a farm field that is permitted to be developed into a solar project, single-family residences to the west but buffered by a natural tree line and one residence in the south-east corner with tree buffer. This area is not experiencing expansion or growth of residential development. Thus, the proposed project will have minimal impact on the value of neighboring properties.
- (4) The availability and the effect the proposed Special Use would have on the public utilities and on traffic circulation on nearby streets. The Board found as follows: The proposed Special Use will enhance the provision of electric utilities to the area and would allow people to subscribe and purchase power at a lower cost. Further, the proposed Special Use will create no burden on existing utilities and provides a needed clean and renewable energy alternative. In addition, the proposed Special Use will not lead to an increase in traffic after it is constructed, as the only additional traffic will consist of vehicles visiting the site for periodic maintenance and inspection, and St. Clair Avenue is more than adequate to handle any additional temporary traffic.
- (5) Whether there are any facilities near the proposed Special Use (such as schools or hospitals) that require special consideration. The Board found as follows: None.
- (6) Whether the proposed Special Use is compatible to adjacent uses and uses in the general vicinity. The Board found as follows: The adjacent uses are agricultural, a previously permitted solar development, and residential uses. The residential uses are nonparticipating; however, the development meets or exceeds the required setbacks. Thus, the proposed Special Use based upon the site plan is compatible with adjacent uses and uses in the general vicinity.
- (7) The time period for which the Special Use Permit should be granted or any special requirements for certification of continued compliance with the terms of approval. The Board found as follows: The Board placed the following additional conditions on the Special Use Permit:
 - (a) The Applicant/operator of the facility will continuously maintain the ground cover and any plantings (including but not limited to mowing and cutting brush and trees and keeping the same free of noxious weeds and invasive plants) throughout the life of the facility. Applicant/operator shall also continuously maintain the fence throughout the life of the facility.
 - (b) No overweight or oversized loads shall be delivered to the site.

- (c) Construction hours shall be limited to Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. No construction work is to be done on Saturdays, Sundays, evenings, or holidays unless written approval is obtained from the St. Clair County Building and Zoning Department Administrator.

Applicant shall submit all finalized documentation and provide the appropriate bond form in the proper agreed upon amount prior to being issued a building permit.

A motion was made by A. Edwards to *GRANT* the request, with the above conditions. The motion was seconded by S. Lindauer. The members of the Board voted as follows: S. Penny-Yes, G. Meister-Yes, A. Edwards-Yes, K. Heberer-Yes, S. Howell-Yes, and S. Lindauer-Yes. The motion carried (6 to 0).

IT IS THEREFORE THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE ST. CLAIR COUNTY ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS THAT THE REQUESTED SPECIAL USE PERMIT BE *GRANTED* FOR THE AFOREMENTIONED REASONS AND WITH THE AFOREMENTIONED CONDITIONS BY A MAJORITY OF ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

REVIEW OF EXECUTIVE SESSION MINUTES

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN ST. CLAIR COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT (SCCSD), AND 375TH SECURITY FORCES SOUADRON (375 SFS), SCOTT AFB, IL

FOR MUTUAL SUPPORT FB4407-22277-121

1. **PURPOSE**: This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) outlines a framework of cooperation and mutually beneficial support activities between St. Clair County Sheriff's Department, hereinafter SCCSD, and the 375th Security Forces Squadron (375 SFS), Scott AFB, Illinois. When referred to collectively, SCCSD and 375 SFS are referred to as the "Parties."

2. AUTHORITIES:

- 2.1. Department of Defense Instruction (DoDI) 3025.21, Defense Support of Civilian Law Enforcement Agencies
- 2.2. Air Force Policy Directive (AFPD) 10-8, Defense Support of Civil Authorities (DSCA)
- 2.3. Air Force Instruction (AFI) 10-801, Defense Support of Civil Authorities
- 2.4. AFI 25-201, Intra-Service, Intra-Agency, and Inter-Agency Support Agreements Procedures
- 2.5. AFI 31-121, Military Working Dog Program
- 2.6. AFI 31-101, Base Defense Operations
- 2.7. AFI 31-103, Law Enforcement Program
- 2.8. AFMAN 71-102, Air Force Criminal Indexing
- 2.9. 10 United States Code (U.S.C.) §§271-284, Military Support to Civilian Law Enforcement Agencies
- 2.10. 18 U.S.C. § 1385, Use of Army and Air Force as Posse Comitatus

3. UNDERSTANDINGS OF THE PARTIES:

3.1. Civilians, to include juveniles, in proprietary jurisdiction will not be cited for criminal activity on Scott AFB by 375 SFS. The 375 SFS will complete law enforcement actions and turn the criminal charging/citation over to the SCCSD to complete the process. If SF has detained a civilian individual and/or has confirmed a wants or warrants hit with the servicing LEA via National Crime Information Center (NCIC), SF will contact said LEA and release detained individual via DD Form 2708, Release of Inmate or Detained Person. Responding agency assumes all criminal indexing responsibilities as required. If servicing agency cannot

respond in a reasonable time, not to exceed 4 hours, SF will contact SCCSD to take custody of suspect and coordinate with servicing agency for extradition. If SCCSD or servicing agency cannot respond within the 4-hour time frame, they will be released on their own accord off of the installation. If civilians commit an offense in exclusive jurisdiction, SF will issue a CVB, U.S. District Court Violation Notice for all assimilated and federal law violations. The notice will be sent to the U.S. Magistrate Office, Central Violations Bureau.:

3.1.1. SCCSD will:

- 3.1.1.1. Notify the 375 SFS, Emergency Communications Center (ECC), if a military member is arrested off base, 256-2224/6000/6485.
- 3.1.1.2. Notify the 375 SFS, when feasible, if SCCSD receives any information that implicates Scott AFB personnel or resources in any criminal plan, drug activity, or indicates a threat to Scott AFB (e.g., terrorist plot).
- 3.1.1.3. Provide assistance when requested by the 375 SFS, as allowed by available resources, in situations such as "officer needs assistance" calls or civil demonstrations at Scott AFB entrance gates.
- 3.1.1.4. Assist in the pursuit/apprehension of any fleeing military inmate from Scott AFB.
- 3.1.1.5. Allow 375 SFS to attend training events on a space-available basis when resources, space, and Air Force mission permit.
- 3.1.1.6. Facilitate pick-up of detained civilian(s) on Scott AFB once notified by 375 SFS.
- 3.1.1.7. Respond and assume control of all time sensitive incidents to include criminal, civil, and domestic responses within proprietary jurisdiction. SCCSD will be notified and will provide 375 SFS an Estimated Time of Arrival (ETA). If ETA exceeds 30 minutes preventing SCCSD from processing the entirety of the emergency response, SCCSD will collect statements/evidence from SF for any preliminary investigative actions (i.e. SFST, Intoxilyzer, etc.). SF are certified through federal and Illinois law enforcement agencies to conduct law enforcement actions. Changeover will occur between SF and SCCSD before disposition.
- 3.1.1.8. When responding to or investigating domestic violence cases (on or off base), the SCCSD will ascertain whether the alleged **offender** is an active-duty service member. If the alleged offender is an active-duty service member, the responding officer(s) will note on the top of the incident/investigation report: "Copy to the Scott AFB, 375 SFS" and the designated Records personnel will ensure the copy is forwarded.
- 3.1.1.9. When responding to or investigating domestic violence cases (on or off base), the SCCSD will ascertain whether the **victim** is an active-duty service member. If the victim is an active-duty service member, the responding officer(s) will seek the victim's

consent to forward a copy of the incident/investigation report to the Scott AFB, 375 SFS so that it can be provided to the victim's commander. If the victim so consents, the responding officer(s) will note on the top of the incident/investigation report "Copy to the Scott AFB, 375 SFS" and the designated records personnel will ensure the copy is forwarded. If the victim does not consent, the responding officer(s) shall note in the body of the incident/investigation report that the victim did not consent to forwarding the report to the Scott AFB, 375 SFS and shall not direct records personnel to forward the report.

- 3.1.1.10. The SCCSD will, when appropriate, conduct joint investigations with the Scott AFB, 375 SFS or AFOSI if incidents of domestic violence involve active-duty service members and their family members.
- 3.1.1.11. When the victim in a domestic violence incident has been identified as an active-duty service member or family member of one, SCCSD responding officer(s) shall provide the victim with basic information, acquired from the Scott AFB, 375 SFS, about installation resources available to domestic violence victims.
- 3.1.1.12. When the SCCSD receives a copy of a temporary or permanent civil protection order (CPO) issued by a court of competent jurisdiction, the responding officer(s) will ascertain whether the alleged **offender** is an active-duty service member. If the alleged offender is an active service member, the responding officer(s) will note on top of the CPO: "Scott AFB, 375 SFS" and the designated Records personnel will ensure the copy is forwarded.
- 3.1.1.13. When the SCCSD receives a copy of a temporary or permanent CPO, the responding officer(s) will ascertain whether the **victim** is an active-duty service member. If the victim is an active-duty service member, the responding officer(s) will seek the victim's consent to forward a copy of the CPO to the Scott AFB, 375 SFS. If the victim so consents, the responding officer(s) will note on the top of the CPO: "Copy to the Scott AFB, 375 SFS" and the designated Records personnel will ensure the copy is forwarded. If the victim does not consent, the responding officer(s) shall not require that a copy of the CPO be forwarded to the Scott AFB, 375 SFS.
- 3.1.1.14. The SCCSD shall designate an employee from Records who will be directly responsible for forwarding copies of incident/investigation reports and CPOs to the Scott AFB, 375 SFS when directed to do so by notations at the top of the reports or CPOs. The employee shall also be responsible for receiving and processing military protective orders (MPOs) forwarded from the Scott AFB, 375 SFS.
- 3.1.1.15. When the SCCSD becomes aware of a violation of a term or provision of an MPO, the responding officer(s) shall notify the ECC from the Scott AFB, 375 SFS of the violation.
- 3.1.1.16. The SCCSD shall provide the Scott AFB, 375 SFS with an area for 375 SFS investigators or Scott AFB, Air Force Office of Special Investigations (AFOSI) to

conduct interviews of active-duty service member and their family members who are involved in domestic violence incidents.

- 3.1.1.17. The SCCSD will, when appropriate, conduct joint investigations with the Scott AFB, 375 SFS or AFOSI if incidents of domestic violence involve active-duty service members and their family members.
- 3.1.1.18. When the victim in a domestic violence incident has been identified as an active-duty service member or family member of one, SCCSD responding officer(s) shall provide the victim with basic information, acquired from the Scott AFB, 375 SFS, about installation resources available to domestic violence victims.
- 3.1.1.19. Civil Process Server. In the event the SCSPD requires access to SAFB to execute civil process duties, they must contact the Emergency Communications Center (ECC) at 618-256-6000/2223/2224 prior to gaining entry to the installation. The need for access will be communicated to the Access Control Point who will verify the need and allow access. A member of the 375 SFS will escort SCCSD to the residence or Dixon Visitor Center (DVC) and then off the installation once the process is complete. **Note:** If the civil process involves a military member, SCCSD will provide 24-hour advance notice to the ECC who will in turn notify the members First Sergeant and the Staff Judge Advocate to facilitate the legal process.
- 3.1.1.20. Respond to civil disturbance/confrontation management situations and provide the following assistance at any installation entry point or any area under SCCSD jurisdiction:
 - 3.1.1.20.1. Identify off-base demonstrators, if possible, to assist investigating possible threats to Scott AFB.
 - 3.1.1.20.2. Provide assistance with crowd control for civilian demonstrators.
 - 3.1.1.20,3. Provide confrontation management teams outside the physical boundaries of Scott AFB, if needed.
 - 3.1.1.20.4. Provide traffic support in routing traffic from the affected gate areas.
 - 3.1.1.20.5. Assist in the administration of issuing a proclamation to demonstrators.
 - 3.1.1.20.6. Assist in containment of incident to jurisdictional boundaries.
 - 3.1.1.20.7. Provide a mobile processing unit capable of expeditiously processing civilian detainees.
 - 3.1.1.20.8. Provide liaison to mass detention facility to assume custody over civilian detainees.
 - 3.1.1.20.9. Assist in quelling or controlling the situation.
- 3.1.1.21. As new law enforcement officers begin duty with the SCCSD, their

immediate supervisor will provide them with copies of this MOU and basic instructions for effectuation of the provisions of the MOU.

3.1.1.21.1. SF is not authorized to conduct criminal indexing for civilian subjects on Scott AFB. If civilians are released to SCCSD for disposition, SCCSD will collect fingerprints, DNA necessary for criminal indexing actions.

3.1.2. 375 SFS will:

- 3.1.2.1. Provide response and assistance to local civilian authorities under emergency authority in accordance with Refence 2.1, in extraordinary emergency circumstances where prior authorization by the President is impossible and duly constituted local authorities are unable to control the situation, to engage temporarily in activities that are necessary to quell large-scale, unexpected civil disturbances because such activities are necessary to prevent significant loss of life or wanton destruction of property and are necessary to restore government function and public order. This response will be limited by 18 U.S.C. § 1385, *Posse Comitatus Act*, and will be terminated when local police authorities arrive at the scene.
- 3.1.2.2. Allow SCCSD to attend training events on a space-available basis when resources, space, and Air Force mission permits.
- 3.1.2.3. Allow SCCSD to use Scott AFB, 375 SFS's Intoximeter EC/IR on Scott AFB premises when SCCSD's equipment is not operable as resources and Air Force mission allows. Under no circumstances will 375 SFS personnel operate such equipment on behalf of SCCSD.
- 3.1.2.4. Notify the appropriate police authorities if a civilian is being temporarily detained on Scott AFB grounds. Local police authorities will pick up civilians in temporary detention as soon as possible, not to exceed 4 hours.
- 3.1.2.5. As referenced in paragraph 3.1., civilian offenders in proprietary jurisdiction must be criminally charged through the SCCSD. When deemed necessary for force protection, for incidents involving civilian offenders within the Scott AFB installation boundary lines, the 375 SFS will initiate and complete all required documentation (e.g. DD FM 1920, AF FM 1176, Intoximeter Report, statements from responding patrolmen, etc.) and deliver to SCCSD prior to departure from SAFB with the offender. From there, SCCSD will criminally charge and process the offender. After the final criminal report is complete, 375 SFS/S5R Reports will forward the report to SCCSD.
- 3.1.2.6. Will support requests by SCCSD for Explosive Detector Dog(s) (EDD) if available. Requests for EDD support are to be made by calling Scott AFB Emergency Communication Center.
- 3.1.2.7. Participate in local community-oriented activities (e.g. parades and other events), as the Air Force mission allows.
- 3.1.2.8. Will allow SCCSD to utilize the firing range upon prior coordination. Coordination must be done 45 days in advance for schedule de-confliction by calling

(618)-256-7851. If this is not possible, range requests will be considered on a case-bycase basis. When a date is scheduled, SCCSD personnel will have use of the classroom, the weapons cleaning area, and the range facility from 0800-1600.

3.2. Counter-small Unmanned Aerial System (C-sUAS)

- 3.2.1. For C-sUAS responses where a sUAS operator can be located outside the Scott Air Force Base boundary but still within the Security Zone, Security Forces may request SCCSD to make contact with the operator and take steps necessary to support Scott AFB with UAS incursions and potential threats to the installation and DoD assets.
 - 3.2.1.1. If SCCSD assists and the operator has no military affiliation, SCCSD should inform the individual they are in violation of FAA regulations and to cease unlawful operation. SCCSD should obtain the operator's name and FAA docket number for commercial operation, if applicable. If the operator refuses to cease operations, SCCSD will control the scene and contact the nearest Federal agency to request a response by LEA with jurisdiction.
 - 3.2.1.2. If operator is a military member who is subject to the UCMJ and within St. Clair County (SAFB Base Security Zone), then a 375 SFS patrol may respond upon request and act appropriately in accordance with their guidance.
 - 3.2.2. If a sUAS is spotted by a LEA and is traveling towards SAFB, the LEA should utilize the FAA DRONE Law Enforcement Response Card and relay the information to SAFB ECC.
 - 3.2.3. If a sUAS is spotted on SAFB and is believed to be a threat to the off-base local community, 375 SFS will contact the appropriate local LEA and relay as much information as possible (I.E: type-fixed wing/multi-rotor/tilt rotor, size, direction of travel, possible payload, and any other notable describers. 375 SFS will not provide support with C-sUAS equipment (i.e. Drone Buster and Skynet) to civilian agencies.
 - 3.2.4. When possible, SCCSD will participate in training exercises for C-sUAS response.
- PERSONNEL: Each Party is responsible for all costs of its personnel, including pay and benefits, support, and travel. Each Party is responsible for supervision and management of its personnel.
- POINTS OF CONTACT: The following points of contact will be used by the Parties to communicate in the implementation of this MOU. Each Party may change its point of contact upon reasonable notice to the other Party.

- 6. **CORRESPONDENCE:** All correspondence to be sent and notices to be given pursuant to this MOU will be addressed to, if to the SCCSD, to—

and, if to the 375 SFS, to-

- 6.1.2. 375 SFS/S5P 832 South Drive Scott AFB, IL 62225
- 7. **FUNDS AND MANPOWER:** This MOU does not provide for reimbursement between the Parties. If reimbursable support is provided pursuant to DoDI 3025.21, any reimbursement will be processed in accordance with the procedures outlined in DoDI 3025.21.
 - 7.1 This MOU does not document the obligation of funds between the Parties. The obligation of funds by the Parties, resulting from this MOU, is subject to the availability of funds pursuant to the DoD Financial Management Regulation. No provision in this MOU will be interpreted to require obligation or payment of funds in violation of the Anti-Deficiency Act, Section 1341 of Title 31, United States Code.
- 8. MODIFICATION OF MOU: This MOU may only be modified by the written agreement of the Parties, duly signed by their authorized representatives. This MOU will be reviewed annually on or around the anniversary of its effective date, and triennially in its entirety.
- 9. **DISPUTES:** Any disputes relating to this MOU will, subject to any applicable law, executive order, directive, or instruction, be resolved by consultation between the Parties or in accordance with DoDI 4000.19.
- 10. **TERMINATION OF UNDERSTANDING:** This MOU may only be terminated unilaterally by providing 180 day written notice to the other party.

This Agreement is made and entered into between the above local public agency, hereinafter referred to as the "LPA" and the State of Illinois, acting by and through its Department of Transportation, hereinafter referred to as the "STATE". The STATE and LPA jointly proposes to improve the designated location as described in the Location and Project Description sections of this agreement. The improvement shall be constructed in accordance with plans prepared by, or on behalf of the LPA and approved by the STATE using the STATE's policies and procedures approved and/or required by the Federal Highway Administration, hereby referred to as "FHWA".

I. GENERAL

- 1.1 Availability of Appropriation; Sufficiency of Funds. This Agreement is contingent upon and subject to the availability of sufficient funds. The STATE may terminate or suspend this Agreement, in whole or in part, without penalty or further payment being required, if (i) sufficient funds for this Agreement have not been appropriated or otherwise made available to the LPA by the STATE or the federal funding source, (ii) the Governor or STATE reserves funds, or (iii) the Governor or STATE determines that funds will not or may not be available for payment. The STATE shall provide notice, in writing, to LPA of any such funding failure and its election to terminate or suspend this Agreement as soon as practicable. Any suspension or termination pursuant to this Section will be effective upon the date of the written notice unless otherwise indicated.
- 1.2 <u>Domestic Steel Requirement.</u> Construction of the project will utilize domestic steel as required by Section 106.01 of the current edition of the Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction and federal Build America-Buy America provisions.
- 1.3 <u>Federal Authorization</u>. That this Agreement and the covenants contained herein shall become null and void in the event that the **FHWA** does not approve the proposed improvement for Federal-aid participation within one (1) year of the date of execution of this agreement.
- 1.4 Severability. If any provision of this Agreement is declared invalid, its other provisions shall not be affected thereby.
- 1.5 Termination. This Agreement may be terminated, in whole or in part, by either Party for any or no reason upon thirty (30) calendar days' prior written notice to the other Party. If terminated by the STATE, the STATE must include the reasons for such termination, the effective date, and, in the case of a partial termination, the portion to be terminated. If the STATE determines in the case of a partial termination that the reduced or modified portion of the funding award will not accomplish the purposes for which the funding award was made, the STATE may terminate the Agreement in its entirety.

This Agreement may be terminated, in whole or in part, by the STATE without advance notice:

- a. Pursuant to a funding failure as provided under Article 1.1.
- b. If LPA fails to comply with the terms and conditions of this funding award, application or proposal, including any applicable rules or regulations, or has made a false representation in connection with the receipt of this or any award.

II. REQUIRED CERTIFICATIONS

By execution of this Agreement and the LPA's obligations and services hereunder are hereby made and must be performed in compliance with all applicable federal and State laws, including, without limitation, federal regulations, State administrative rules and any and all license requirements or professional certification provisions.

- 2.1 <u>Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards (2 CFR Part 200)</u>. The LPA certifies that it shall adhere to the applicable Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements, which are published in Title 2, Part 200 of the Code of Federal Regulations, and are incorporated herein by reference.
- 2.2 Compliance with Registration Requirements. LPA certifies that it: (i) is registered with the federal SAM system; (ii) is in good standing with the Illinois Secretary of State, if applicable; (iii) have a valid DUNS Number; (iv) have a valid UEI, if applicable. It is LPA's responsibility to remain current with these registrations and requirements.
- 2.3 <u>Bribery</u>. The LPA certifies to the best of it's knowledge that it's officials have not been convicted of bribery or attempting to bribe an officer or employee of the state of Illinois, nor made an admission of guilt of such conduct which is a matter of record (30 ILCS 500/50-5).
- 2.4 <u>Bid Rigging. LPA</u> certifies that it has not been barred from contracting with a unit of state or local government as a result of a violation of Paragraph 33E-3 or 33E-4 of the Criminal Code of 1961 (720 ILCS 5/33E-3 or 720 ILCS 5/33E-4, respectively).

In the construction of the Program, the LPA shall comply with the requirements of the Prevailing Wage Act including, but not limited to, inserting into all contracts for such construction a stipulation to the effect that not less than the prevailing rate of wages as applicable to the Program shall be paid to all laborers, workers, and mechanics performing work under the Award and requiring all bonds of contractors to include a provision as will guarantee the faithful performance of such prevailing wage clause as provided by contract.
- 2.8 <u>Criminal Convictions</u>. The LPA certifies that neither it nor any managerial agent of LPA has been convicted of a felony under the Sarbanes-Oxley Act of 2002, nor a Class 3 or Class 2 felony under Illinois Securities Law of 1953, or that at least five (5) years have passed since the date of the conviction. The LPA further certifies that it is not barred from receiving an funding award under 30 ILCS 500/50-10.5 and acknowledges that STATE shall declare the Agreement void if this certification is false (30 ILCS 500/50-10.5).
- 2.9 Improper Influence. The LPA certifies that no funds have been paid or will be paid by or on behalf of the LPA to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any government agency, a member of Congress or Illinois General Assembly, an officer or employee of Congress or Illinois General Assembly, or an employee of a member of Congress or Illinois General Assembly in connection with the awarding of any agreement, the making of any grant, the making of any loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, or the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment or modification of any agreement, grant, loan or cooperative agreement. 31 USC 1352. Additionally, the LPA certifies that it has filed the required certification under the Byrd Anti-Lobbying Amendment (31 USC 1352), if applicable.
- 2.10 <u>Telecom Prohibition</u>. The LPA certifies that it will comply with Section 889 of the FY 2019 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) that prohibits the use of telecommunications or video surveillance equipment or services produced or provided by the following companies: Dahua Technology Company, Hangzhou Hikvision Digital Technology Company, Huawei Technologies Company, Hytera Communications Corporation, and ZTE Corporation. Covered equipment and services cannot be used as substantial or essential component or any system, or as critical technology as part of any system.
- 2.11 Personal Conflict of Interest (50 ILCS 105/3, 65 ILCS 5/3.1-55-10, 65 ILCS 5/4-8-6) The LPA certifies that it shall maintain a written code or standard of conduct which shall govern the performance of its employees, officers, board members, or agents engaged in the award and administration of contracts supported by state or federal funds. Such code shall provide that no employee, officer, board member or agent of the LPA may participate in the selection, award, or administration of a contract supported by state or federal funds if a conflict of interest, real or apparent would be involved. Such a conflict would arise when any of the parties set forth below has a financial or other interest in the firm selected for award:
 - a. the employee, officer, board member, or agent;
 - b. any member of his or her immediate family;
 - c. his or her partner; or

- 2.12 <u>Organizational Conflict of Interest</u> The LPA certifies that it will also prevent any real or apparent organizational conflict of interest. An organizational conflict of interest exists when the nature of the work to be performed under a proposed third party contract or subcontract may, without some restriction on future activities, result in an unfair competitive advantage to the third party contractor or LPA or impair the objectivity in performing the contract work.
- 2.13 <u>Accounting System</u>. The **LPA** certifies that it has an accounting system that provides accurate, current, and complete disclosure of all financial transactions related to each state and federally funded program. Accounting records must contain information

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pertaining to state and federal pass-through awards, authorizations, obligations, unobligated balances, assets, outlays, and income. To comply with 2 CFR 200.305(b)(7)(i), the **LPA** shall use reasonable efforts to ensure that funding streams are delineated within **LPA**'s accounting system. See 2 CFR 200.302.

III. AUDIT AND RECORD RETENTION

3.1 Single Audits: The LPA shall be subject to the audit requirements contained in the Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996 (31 USC 7501-7507) and Subpart F of 2 CFR Part 200.

If, during its fiscal year, LPA expends \$750,000 or more in Federal Awards (direct federal and federal pass-through awards combined), LPA must have a single audit or program-specific audit conducted for that year as required by 2 CFR 200.501 and other applicable sections of Subpart F of 2 CFR Part 200. A copy of the audit report must be submitted to the STATE (IDOT's Financial Review & Investigations Section, Room 126, 2300 South Dirksen Parkway, Springfield, Illinois, 62764) within 30 days after the completion of the audit, but no later than one year after the end of the LPA's fiscal year.

Assistance Listing number (formally known as the Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) number) for all highway planning and construction activities is 20.205.

Federal funds utilized for construction activities on projects let and awarded by the STATE (federal amounts shown as "Participating Construction" on Schedule 2) are not included in a LPA's calculation of federal funds expended by the LPA for Single Audit purposes.

- 3.2 STATE Audits: The STATE may, at its sole discretion and at its own expense, perform a final audit of the Project (30 ILCS 5, the Illinois State Auding Act). Such audit may be used for settlement of the Project expenses and for Project closeout purposes. The LPA agrees to implement any audit findings contained in the STATE's authorized inspection or review, final audit, the STATE's independent audit, or as a result of any duly authorized inspection or review.
- 3.3 Record Retention. The LPA shall maintain for three (3) years from the date of final project closeout by the STATE, adequate books, records, and supporting documents to verify the amounts, recipient, and uses of all disbursements of funds passing in conjunction with this contract, adequate to comply with 2 CFR 200.334. If any litigation, claim or audit is started before the expiration of the retention period, the records must be retained until all litigation, claims or audit exceptions involving the records have been resolved and final action taken.
- 3.4 Accessibility of Records. The LPA shall permit, and shall require its contractors and auditors to permit, the STATE, and any authorized agent of the STATE, to inspect all work, materials, payrolls, audit working papers, and other data and records pertaining to the Project; and to audit the books, records, and accounts of the LPA with regard to the Project. The LPA in compliance with 2 CFR 200.337 shall make books, records, related papers, supporting documentation and personnel relevant to this Agreement available to authorized STATE representatives, the Illinois Auditor General, Illinois Attorney General, any Executive Inspector General, the STATE's Inspector General, federal authorities, any person identified in 2 CFR 200.337, and any other person as may be authorized by the STATE (including auditors), by the state of Illinois or by federal statute. The LPA shall cooperate fully in any such audit or inquiry.
- 3.5 <u>Failure to maintain the books and records.</u> Failure to maintain the books, records and supporting documents required by this section shall establish presumption in favor of the STATE for recovery of any funds paid by the STATE under the terms of this contract.

IV. LPA FISCAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- 4.1 To provide all initial funding and payment for construction engineering, utility, and railroad work
- 4.2 <u>LPA Appropriation Requirement.</u> By execution of this Agreement the **LPA** attests that sufficient moneys have been appropriated or reserved by resolution or ordinance to fund the **LPA** share of project costs. A copy of the authorizing resolution or ordinance is attached as Schedule 5.
- 4.3 <u>Reimbursement Requests</u>: For reimbursement requests the LPA will submit supporting documentation with each invoice. Supporting documentation is defined as verification of payment, certified time sheets or summaries, vendor invoices, vendor receipts, cost plus fix fee invoice, progress report, personnel and direct cost summaries, and other documentation supporting the requested reimbursement amount (Form BLR 05621 should be used for consultant invoicing purposes). LPA invoice requests to the STATE will be submitted with sequential invoice numbers by project.
- 4.4 <u>Financial Integrity Review and Evaluation (FIRE) program: LPA's</u> and the STATE must justify continued federal funding on inactive projects. 23 CFR 630.106(a)(5) defines an inactive project as a project which no expenditures have been charged against Federal funds for the past twelve (12) months. To keep projects active, invoicing must occur a minimum of one time within any given twelve (12) month period. However, to ensure adequate processing time, the first invoice shall be submitted to the STATE within six (6) months of the federal authorization date. Subsequent invoices will be submitted in intervals not to exceed six (6) months.
- 4.5 <u>Final Invoice</u>: The LPA will submit to the STATE a complete and detailed final invoice with applicable supporting documentation of all incurred costs, less previous payments, no later than twelve (12) months from the date of completion of work or from the date of the previous invoice, whichever occurs first. If a final invoice is not received within this time frame, the most recent invoice

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may be considered the final invoice and the obligation of the funds closed. Form BLR 05613 (Engineering Payment Record) is required to be submitted with the final invoice for engineering projects.

- 4.6 Project Closeout: The LPA shall provide the final report to the appropriate STATE district office within twelve (12) months of the physical completion date of the project so that the report may be audited and approved for payment. If the deadline cannot be met, a written explanation must be provided to the district prior to the end of the twelve (12) months documenting the reason and the new anticipated date of completion. If the extended deadline is not met, this process must be repeated until the project is closed. Failure to follow this process may result In the immediate close-out of the project and loss of further funding.
- 4.7 <u>Project End Date</u>: The period of performance (end date) for state and federal obligation purposes is five (5) years for projects under \$1,000,000 or seven (7) years for projects over \$1,000,000 from the execution date of the agreement. Requests for time extensions and joint agreement amendments must be received and approved prior to expiration of the project end date. Failure to extend the end date may result in the immediate close-out of the project and loss of further funding.

V. THE LPA AGREES

- 5.1 To acquire in its name, or in the name of the STATE if on the STATE highway system, all right-of-way necessary for this project in accordance with the requirements of Titles II and III of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, and established State policies and procedures. Prior to advertising for bids, the LPA shall certify to the STATE that all requirements of Titles II and III of said Uniform Act have been satisfied. The disposition of encroachments, if any, will be cooperatively determined by representatives of the LPA, the STATE, and the FHWA if required.
- 5.2 To provide for all utility adjustments and to regulate the use of the right-of-way of this improvement by utilities, public and private, in accordance with the current Utility Accommodation Policy for Local Public Agency Highway and Street Systems.
- 5.3 To provide on-site engineering supervision and inspection during construction of the proposed improvement.
- 5.4 To retain jurisdiction of the completed improvement unless specified otherwise by schedule (schedule should be accompanied by a location map). If the improvement location is currently under road district jurisdiction, a jurisdictional schedule is required.
- 5.5 To maintain or cause to be maintained the completed improvement (or that portion within its jurisdiction as established by schedule) in a manner satisfactory to the STATE and the FHWA.
- 5.6 To provide if required, for the improvement of any railroad-highway grade crossing and rail crossing protection within the limits of the proposed improvement.
- 5.7 To regulate parking and traffic in accordance with the approved project report.
- 5.8 To regulate encroachments on public rights-of-way in accordance with current Illinois Compiled Statutes.
- 5.9 To regulate the discharge of sanitary sewage into any storm water drainage system constructed with this improvement in accordance with the current Illinois Compiled Statutes.
- 5.10 For contracts awarded by the LPA, the LPA shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin or sex in the award and performance of any USDOT assisted contract or in the administration of its DBE program or the requirements of 49 CFR part 26. The LPA shall take all necessary and reasonable steps under 49 CFR part 26 to ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of USDOT assisted contracts. The LPA's DBE program, as required by 49 CFR part 26 and as approved by USDOT, is incorporated by reference in this agreement. Upon notification to the recipient of its failure to carry out its approved program, the STATE may impose sanctions as provided for under Part 26 and may, in appropriate cases, refer the matter for enforcement under 18 U.S. C 1001 and/or the Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act of 1986 (31 U.S.C 3801 et seq.). In the absence of a USDOT approved LPA DBE Program or on STATE awarded contracts, this agreement shall be administered under the provisions of the STATE'S USDOT approved Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program.
- 5.12 That execution of this agreement constitutes the LPA's concurrence in the award of the construction contract to the responsible low bidder as determined by the STATE.

VI. THE STATE AGREES

- 6.1 To provide such guidance, assistance, and supervision to monitor and perform audits to the extent necessary to assure validity of the LPA's certification of compliance with Title II and III Requirements.
- 6.2 To receive bids for construction of the proposed improvement when the plans have been approved by the STATE (and FHWA, if required) and to award a contract for construction of the proposed improvement after receipt of a satisfactory bid.
- 6.3 To provide all initial funding and payments to the contractor for construction work let by the STATE. The LPA will be invoiced for their share of contract costs per the method of payment selected under Method of Financing based on the Division of Costs shown on Schedule 2.

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- 6.4 For agreements with federal and/or state funds in local let/day labor construction, construction engineering, utility work and/or railroad work:
 - To reimburse the LPA for federal and/or state share on the basis of periodic billings, provided said billings contain sufficient cost information and show evidence of payments by the LPA;
 - b. To provide independent assurance sampling and furnish off-site material inspection and testing at sources normally visited by STATE inspectors for steel, cement, aggregate, structural steel, and other materials customarily tested by the STATE.

At your request, SCI Engineering, Inc. (SCI) is providing this geotechnical services proposal for the referenced project. Our services include project planning and subsurface exploration, laboratory testing, and a data transmittal of our findings.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The project includes the planned design and construction of roadway improvements and widening of North Green Mount Road. Based on a January 12, 2025, email from Oates Associates and provided plan and profile drawings, SCI understands that the roadway widening will consist of placing fill along the existing roadway slope embankment and installation of a sheet pile retaining wall. Drawings indicate that the sheet pile retaining wall will be located from approximately STA 295+10 to STA 297+10, comprising approximately 200 lineal feet. Details regarding the depth of planned sheet pile installation is currently unknown; profile drawings indicate sections of retaining wall ranging in height from approximately 5 to 7 feet with top of wall at Elevation (El)¹ 540.

Based on a site visit performed by SCI, it appears that the eastern side of North Green Mount Road near where the proposed retaining wall is planned, is currently supported by multi-tiered gabion structures. Details regarding the history of construction of the roadway are currently unknown; however historical aerial imagery indicates that the roadway was paved and further developed sometime after 1986.

The project site is located just along the east side of North Green Mount Road, just south of its intersection with Caton Run Crossing, in Shiloh, Illinois. Based on Google Earth satellite imagery and the provided drawings, the existing roadway is relatively flat, and slopes gently from the south, downward to the north, with approximately one foot of relief. The roadway is supported on an embankment covered with vegetation on its slopes, dense tree structure line the toe of the embankment.

¹ Elevations herein are in feet, referenced from the North American Vertical Datum 1988 (NAVD 88).

GEOTECHNICAL SCOPE OF SERVICES

SCI will locate the exploration points in the field using a consumer-grade handheld global positioning system (GPS) while referencing existing site features. Elevations will be obtained by interpolating surface elevations at the exploration locations using the most recent topographic plan made available to us. Alternatively, if more accurate location and elevation data is required, we recommend that you retain the project surveyor to obtain the exploration location coordinates and elevations.

SCI will explore the subsurface conditions with either Soil Test Borings or Piezocone Penetration Tests. A description of each is below.

Traffic Control

Due to the limited shoulder area, traffic control will be required in order to safely perform our exploration. Traffic control has been budgeted for set up and take down signs and cone/channelizers for a fee of \$1,900.00 (included in total lump sum). This fee does not include flaggers. If flaggers are determined to be necessary at a later date, then our fee for traffic control will be adjusted accordingly to accommodate for this additional cost.

Soil Test Borings

Two borings will be drilled on the shoulder of North Green Mount Roadway along the planned sheet pile retaining wall alignment. The borings will be drilled at approximately the 1/3 point from each end of the sheet pile retaining wall. The borings will be drilled to depths of approximately 40 feet, or shallower if auger refusal is achieved first. The borings will be sampled with Standard Penetration Test (SPT) and relatively undisturbed Shelby tube samples at 2½-foot intervals in the upper 10 feet and at 5-foot intervals thereafter. SCI will provide a field logger to accompany the drill rig and perform RIMAC test on each cohesive SPT sample. The borings will be backfilled with grout and patched with similar pavement material. Groundwater observations will be recorded at the time of drilling.

Piezocone Penetration Tests

The borings may be substituted with two Piezocone Penetration Test (CPTu) soundings 40 feet or shallower if cone refusal is achieved first. The CPTu soundings are conducted in accordance with ASTM D5778 Standard Test Method for Performing Electronic Friction Cone and Piezocone Penetration Testing of Soils. The CPTu hydraulically pushes an instrumented cone through the soil, while continuous readings of tip and side resistance and porewater pressure are recorded every 1 inch. Direct push borings will be advanced to a minimum depth of 8 feet adjacent to the soundings to provide soil samples for laboratory testing. Core holes would need to be drilled prior to advancing the soundings through the roadway shoulder. The CPTu soundings and direct push borings will be backfilled with grout.

Laboratory Testing

Upon completion of the field exploration, the samples will be transported to our laboratory for classification and characterization. We will determine the moisture content of each cohesive sample. Hand penetrometer values, which provide an indication of strength, will be obtained for each apparently intact cohesive sample. Atterberg limits tests will be performed on selected samples to aid in classification of the subgrade soils.

Boring/CPT logs will be prepared by our project geotechnical engineer after analyzing field exploration logs and laboratory test results. The logs will be prepared and transmitted with a cover letter and a site plan showing the test locations. No geotechnical recommendations will be provided.

COST AND SCHEDULE

SCI will provide the geotechnical services outlined herein for a lump-sum fee of \$8,600.00. We will schedule the fieldwork following your authorization of this proposal. The exploration is subject to scheduling and will take approximately one day, weather permitting. We will not mobilize an exploration rig unless formal authorization has been received. Laboratory testing and boring log preparation will be completed approximately two weeks following completion of the field exploration; however, verbal findings should be available within a few days after completion of the drilling.

CONDITIONS

- The above fee is based on a maximum of 80 lineal feet of exploration. If the encountered subsurface
 conditions indicate that more than the planned total of exploration footage would be beneficial, and
 you authorize such additional exploration, it will be provided at a rate of \$45.00 per foot.
- Our fee, which is valid for up to 30 days from the date of this proposal, does not include
 out-of-scope services that might be added during the course of our work; nor does it include
 additional services that might be requested following completion of our report, such as attendance
 at project meetings; subsequent consultation; or review, signing, and sealing of project plans.
 Such services will be provided in accordance with the enclosed Acceptance of Proposal for
 Professional Services, and billed at our then-current hourly rates, or as otherwise agreed.
- Our fees do not include the additional cost of union operators or laborers. Should they be required
 by the local jurisdiction, you will be immediately advised of any additional cost.
- This proposal assumes that you will provide site access authorization, including access to the proposed exploration locations for a conventional, rubber-tired, all-terrain drill or CPTu rig. No clearing, grading, or other removal of site obstacles, has been included in this proposal. It also assumes that you will provide marked locations of privately owned, below-grade, utility lines within the project area, prior to mobilization of the drill rig.
- We routinely contact the Illinois JULIE system to have the locations of public utilities marked; however, we will only be responsible for utilities brought to our attention prior to drilling.
- Construction phase engineering support and material testing services are excluded from this
 proposal. SCI can work with you to provide a proposal for these services once the project design
 and schedule are solidified.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- ACCEPTANCE OF AGREEMENT The terms and conditions of the agreement between the client and SCI ENGINEERING, INC. (hereinafter called SCI) are detailed below and have been established to allocate risks between both. For the purposes of convenience, the client may choose to orally authorize our service, in which case the client agrees that the verbal agreement constitutes formal acceptance of the terms and conditions detailed below. Subsequent to an agreement by both parties to perform the services, modifications to the terms and conditions are prohibited.
- 2. SITE ENTRY You, the Client, will provide for right of entry of SCI or employees of firms working under the direction of SCI, and all necessary equipment, in order to perform the work. Although SCI will exercise reasonable care in performing its services, the Client understands that use of testing or other equipment may unavoidably cause some damage, the correction of which is not part of this agreement. The client agrees, to the fullest extent permitted by law, to indemnify and hold harmless SCI and its subconsultants against any damages, habilities, or costs, arising or allegedly orising from procedures associated with testing or investigative activities to the fullest extent permitted by law. If you desire or require us to restore the site to its former condition, upon written request, we will perform such additional work as is necessary and you agree to pay all costs incurred.
- 3. SUBSURFACE STRUCTURES OR UTILITIES The Client will furnish to SCI information identifying the type and location of utility lines and other man-made objects beneath the site's surface. SCI will take reasonable precautions to avoid damaging these man-made objects. You agree to waive any claim against SCI, and to defend, indemnify and hold SCI harmless-from any claim or liability for injury or loss allegedly arising from SCI's damaging underground utilities or other man-made objects that were not called to SCI's attention, or which were not properly located on plans furnished to SCI.
- 4. SAMPLES Soil, rock, water, or other samples obtained from the project site are your property. SCI shall preserve such samples for no longer than thirty (30) calendar days after the issuance of any document that includes the data obtained from them, unless other mutually agreed arrangements are documented.

Concrete test specimens will be discarded after testing. If project specification strengths are met, "hold" cylinders will be discarded at that time.

If in SCI's opinion any of the samples collected may be affected by regulated contaminants, SCI shall package such samples in accordance with applicable law and client shall arrange for lawful disposal procedures. SCI shall not, under this agreement, arrange for or be responsible for the disposal of substances affected by regulated contaminants. Furthermore, unless detailed in a specific work scope, SCI is not responsible for any soil cuttings or produced groundwater generated for the purpose of sample collection that may be affected by regulated contaminants that are left at a job site and were generated for the collection of soil and groundwater samples. SCI will, at the client's request, help the client identify appropriate alternatives for the off-site treatment, storage, or disposal of these materials, for additional fees.

5. GENERAL LIABILITY AND LIMITATION

SCI agrees to hold you harmless and to indemnify you on account of any liability due to bodily injury or property damage to the extent directly caused by our negligent operational acts, but such hold harmless and indemnity will be limited to that covered by our comprehensive general liability insurance. At your request, SCI will provide certificates evidencing such coverage and will purchase additional limits of liability that you may require as a separate cost item to be borne by you.

You shall not be liable to SCI and SCI shall not be liable to you for any consequential damages incurred by either due to the fault of the other, regardless of the nature of this fault, or whether it was committed by you or SCI, their employees, agents, or subcontractors. Consequential damages include, but are not limited to, loss of use, loss of profit, loss of business, loss of income, loss of reputation or any other consequential damage that any party may have incurred from any cause of action, including, but not limited to negligence, strict liability, breach of contract, or breach of warranty.

6. SHARED RISK ALLOCATION The Client and SCI agree to allocate certain of the risks so that, to the fullest extent permitted by law, SCI's total aggregate liability to the Client is limited to \$50,000.00 for any and all injuries, damages, claims, losses, expenses, or claim expenses (including attorney's and expert witness' fees) arising out of this AGREEMENT from any cause or causes. Such causes include, but are not limited to, SCI's negligence, errors, omissions, strict liability, statutory liability, breach of contract, breach of warranty, negligent, misrepresentation, or other acts giving rise to liability based upon contract, tort, or statute. Higher limits may be available upon request and additional negotiated fee:

Limitations on liability, waivers and indemnities in this Agreement are business understandings between the parties and shall apply to all legal theories of recovery, including breach of contract or warranty; breach of fiduciary duty, tort (including negligence), strict or statutory liability, or any other cause of action. You agree that you will not seek damages in excess of the contractually agreed-upon limitation directly or indirectly through suits against other parties who may join the Consultant as third-party defendant. None of the insurance or indemnity obligations under this agreement shall be deemed to be with a waiver of this limitation of liability provision.

- 7. INVOICES You will make all payments in accordance with SCI's invoices, and payment is due upon receipt of invoice. A fee of 1½ percent per month will be payable on any amounts not paid within thirty (30) days, payment thereafter to be applied first to accrued interest and then to your unpaid amount. You agree to pay invoices under these terms and to bear collection fees, court costs, or any other reasonable expense involved in the collection of amounts not paid.
- 8. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS; NOTIFICATION OF AND DISCOVERY OF When hazardous materials are known, assumed, or suspected to exist at a site, SCI is required to take appropriate precautions to protect the health and safety of its personnel, to comply with applicable laws and regulations, and to follow procedures that SCI deems prudent to help minimize physical risks to employees and the public. You warrant that you have provided to SCI all available information about type and location of known and suspected hazardous materials on, under, or adjacent to the project site.

The discovery of unanticipated hazardous or suspected hazardous materials will constitute a changed condition mandating termination of services if SCI and you are unable to renegotiate the scope of service in a timely manner. SCI will notify you as soon as practically possible should SCI encounter unanticipated hazardous or suspected hazardous materials.

The discovery of unanticipated hazardous or suspected hazardous materials may make it necessary for SCI to take measures that in SCI's professional opinton are needed to help preserve and protect the health and safety of SCI's personnel and of the public, and/or to preserve and protect the environment. As a condition precedent to the provision of service for this project, you agree to

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compensate SCI for the additional fees and costs associated with any such measures and further agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless from any claim or liability for injury or loss arising from SGI's encountering unanticipated hazardous or suspected hazardous

- CONTAMINATION OF AN AQUIFER Unavoidable contamination of soil or groundwater may occur during-subsurface exploration, as when drilling or sampling tools penetrate a contaminated area, linking it to an aquifer, underground stream, or other hydrous body not previously contaminated and eapable of spreading contaminants. Because subsurface exploration is an essential aspect of the services that SCI will provide on your behalf, you shall indemnify defend, and hold SCI barmless from any claim or liability for injury or loss which may arise as a result of contamination allegedly eaused by subsurface exploration to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- SITE SAFETY With respect to project site safety, SCI shall be responsible only for the on-site activities of its employees and subcontractors, and this responsibility shall not be construed to relieve you or the general contractor from your obligation to maintain a safe project site. Neither the professional activities of SCI, nor the presence of SCI's employees or subcontractors shall be construed to imply that SCI has any responsibility for any methods of work performance, procedures, superintendence, sequencing of operations, or safety in, on, or about the project site other than SCI's and SCI's subconsultants. You agree that the general contractor is responsible for project site safety and warrant that this intent shall be made evident in your agreement with the general contractor.
- CONSTRUCTION COST ESTIMATES An opinion of construction cost prepared by SCI represents our judgment as a design professional and is supplied for your general guidance only. Since we have no control over the cost of labor and material, nor over competitive bidding or market conditions, we do not guarantee the accuracy of our opinion as compared to other sources, such as, contractor bids of actual cost to the owner.
- DEFECTS IN SERVICE You and your personnel, contractors, and subcontractors shall promptly report to SCI any defects or suspected defects in SCI's work, in order that SCI may take prompt effective measures which in SCI's opinion will minimize the consequences of any such defect.
- TERMINATION Any or all services being provided for you by SCI under these General Terms and Conditions or under separate contract may be terminated by either party upon seven (7) days prior written notice. In the event of termination, SCI shall be compensated by you for all services performed up to and including the termination date, including reimbursable expenses.
- FORCE MAJEURE Any delays or failure of performance by SCI shall not constitute a default under this Agreement, if such delays or failures of performance are caused by occurrences beyond the reasonable control of SCI. Performance under this Agreement shall resume promptly once the cause or delay or failure ceases and SCI's schedule for performance shall be extended to the extent of such delay. Each party shall take reasonable steps to mitigate the impact of any such delay or failure.
- ENVIRONMENTAL SITE An Environmental Site Assessment is conducted to render an opinion about the possibility of regulated contaminants being present on, in, or beneath the site specifically at the time services were conducted. Client understands that no matter how thorough an Environmental Site Assessment is, SCI cannot know or state factually that a site is unaffected by reportable quantities of regulated contaminants. Furthermore, even if SCI believes that reportable quantities are not present, the client bears the risk that such contaminants may be present or may migrate to the site after the study is complete. Likewise, the client agrees to hold SCI harmless from any claim or liability for injury or loss arising from the unanticipated discovery of hazardous materials or suspected hazardous materials to the fullest extent permitted by law.

- FAILURE TO FOLLOW RECOMMENDATIONS SCI disclaims any and all responsibility and liability for problems that may occur during implementation of SCI's plans, specifications, or recommendations when SCI is not retained to observe such Implementation.
- ALTERATION OF INSTRUMENTS OF SERVICE Client agrees that designs, plans, specifications, reports, proposals, and similar documents prepared by SCI are instruments of professional service, and as such, they may not under any circumstances be altered by any party except SCI. Client warrants that SCI's instruments of service will be used only and exactly as submitted by SCI. Accordingly, Client shall waive any claim against SCI and shall, to the fullest extent permitted by law, indemnify, defend, and hold SCI harmless of any claim or liability DPN for injury or loss arising from unauthorized alteration of SCI's instruments of service.



- MOLD DISCLAIMER The services performed by SCI, unless specifically addressed in our scope of services, are not intended to take into account indoor amplification of mold. SCI's services may comment on depth to groundwater and site drainage, but in no instance is this to be interpreted that we were specifically intending to reduce moisture contents and/or humidity measurements within the structure as they may relate to mold. Citent understands our services, unless specifically expressed in our work scope, are in no way intended to address the potential for mold infestation, and, as such, agrees to indemnify and hold SCI harmless from any claim alleging that SCI's services caused or aggravated a mold infestation to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- OTHER PROVISIONS You agree that this contract is entered into by the parties for the sole benefit of the parties to the contract, and that nothing in the contract shall be construed to create a right or benefit for any third party.
- a. You agree that any and all limitations of SCI's liability and indenmifications by you shall include and extend to those individuals and entities SCI retains for performance of the services under this Agreement, including but not limited to SCI's officers, directors, and employees and their heirs and assigns, and SCI's subconsultants.
- b. In an effort to resolve any conflicts that arise during or following completion of the project, you and SCI agree that all disputes between us arising out of or related to this Agreement shall be submitted to non-binding mediation as a condition precedent to institution of any formal legal proceeding, unless the parties mutually agree otherwise in writing.
 c. THE PARTIES TO THIS CONTRACT HEREBY

AGREE TO SUBMIT ANY SUCH DISPUTE TO THE CIRCUIT COURT OF ST. CHARLES COUNTY, STATE OF MISSOURI.

- d. Test borings and test pits are an accepted and informative means of subsurface exploration. However, in the nature of things, they cannot indicate with absolute certainty the nature of the subsurface conditions between and sample locations of the exploration and below the termination of the borings or pits. Therefore, a report based on test borings, test pits, or other exploration method cannot ascertain the nature of the subsurface conditions between and beyond the specific sample locations. If conditions different than are indicated in our report come to your attention after you receive the report, it is recommended that you contact SCI immediately to inform SCI completely of what you have discovered and to authorize further evaluation, if appropriate.
- e. Any recommendations provided in correspondence, reports, plans, etc. from SCI are for the exclusive use of our client and are specific to the project covered by this contract. Recommendations provided by SCI are not meant to supersede more stringent requirements of local ordinances.

f. You may not assign this agreement to any other person or entity without the prior written consent of SCI. Any transfer of fifty percent or more of your equity interest or voting interest shall be deemed to be an assignment for this purpose.

g. SCI will perform all services under this agreement using the standard of care ordinarily used by firms performing such services in the locale where the services are being rendered. However, many factors influence the results from those services. As such, SCI expressly disclaims any warranty or guaranty as to the accuracy of such results. SCI's performance shall be solely judged against the foregoing standard of care

Important Information about This

Geotechnical Engineering Proposal

Subsurface problems are a principal cause of construction delays, cost overruns, claims, and disputes.

While you cannot eliminate all such risks, you can manage them. The following information is provided to help.

Participate in Development of the Subsurface Exploration Plan

Geotechnical engineering begins with the creation of an effective subsurface exploration plan. This proposal starts the process by presenting an initial plan. While that plan may consider the unique physical attributes of the site and the improvements you have in mind, it probably does not consider your unique goals, objectives, and risk management preferences. Subsurface exploration plans that are finalized without considering such factors presuppose that clients' needs are unimportant, or that all clients have the same needs. Avoid the problems that can stem from such assumptions by finalizing the plan and other scope elements directly with the geotechnical engineer you feel is best qualified for the project, along with the other project professionals whose plans are affected by the geotechnical engineer's findings and recommendations. If you have been told that this step is unnecessary; that client preferences do not influence the scope of geotechnical engineering service or that someone else can articulate your needs as well as you, you have been told wrong. No one else can discuss your geotechnical options better than an experienced geotechnical engineer, and no one else can provide the input you can. Thus, while you certainly are at liberty to accept a proposed scope "as is," recognize that it could be a unilateral scope developed without direct client/engineer discussion; that authorizing a unilateral scope will force the geotechnical engineer to accept all assumptions it contains; that assumptions create risk. Manage your risk. Get involved.

Expect the Unexpected

The nature of geotechnical engineering is such that planning needs to anticipate the unexpected. During the design phase of a project, more or deeper borings may be required, additional tests may become necessary, or someone associated with your organization may request a service that was not included in the final scope. During the construction phase, additional services may be needed to respond quickly to unanticipated conditions. In the past, geotechnical engineers commonly did whatever was required to oblige their clients' representatives and safeguard their clients' interests, taking it on faith that their clients wanted them to do so. But some, evidently, did not, and refused to pay for legitimate extras on the ground that the engineer proceeded without proper authorization, or failed to submit notice in a timely manner, or failed to provide proper documentation. What are your preferences? Who is permitted to authorize additional geotechnical services on your project? What type of documentation do you require? To whom should it be sent? When? How? By addressing these and similar issues sooner rather than later, you and your geotechnical engineer will be prepared for the unexpected, to help prevent molehills from growing into mountains.

Have Realistic Expectations; Apply Appropriate Preventives

The recommendations included in a geotechnical engineering report are not final, because they are based on opinions that can be verified only during construction. For that reason, most geotechnical engineering proposals offer the construction observation services that permit the geotechnical engineer of record to confirm that subsurface conditions are what they were expected to be, or to modify recommendations when actual conditions were not anticipated. An offer to provide construction observation

is an offer to better manage your risk. Clients who do not take advantage of such an offer; clients who retain a second firm to observe construction, can create a high-risk "Catch-22" situation for themselves. The geotechnical engineer of record cannot assume responsibility or liability for a report's recommendations when another firm performs the services needed to evaluate the recommendations' adequacy. The second firm is also likely to disavow liability for the recommendations, because of the substantial and possibly uninsurable risk of assuming responsibility for services it did not perform. Recognize, too, that no firm other than the geotechnical engineer of record can possibly have as intimate an understanding of your project's geotechnical issues. As such, reliance on a second firm to perform construction observation can elevate risk still more, because its personnel may not have the wherewithal to recognize subtle, but sometimes critically important unanticipated conditions, or to respond to them in a manner consistent with your goals, objectives, and risk management preferences.

Realize That Geoenvironmental Issues Have Not Been Covered

The equipment, techniques, and personnel used to perform a geoenvironmental study differ significantly from those used to perform a geotechnical study. Geoenvironmental services are not being offered in this proposal. The report that results will not relate any geoenvironmental findings, conclusions, or recommendations. Unanticipated environmental problems have led to numerous project failures. If you have not yet obtained your own geoenvironmental information, ask your geotechnical consultant for risk management guidance. Do not rely on an environmental report prepared for someone else.

Obtain Professional Assistance To Deal with Mold

Diverse strategies can be applied during building design, construction, operation, and maintenance to prevent significant amounts of mold from growing on indoor surfaces. To be effective, all such strategies should be devised for the express purpose of mold prevention, integrated into a comprehensive plan, and executed with diligent oversight by a professional mold prevention consultant. Because just a small amount of water or moisture can lead to the development of severe mold infestations, a number of mold prevention strategies focus on keeping building surfaces dry. While groundwater, water infiltration, and similar issues may be addressed as part of the geotechnical engineering study described in this proposal, the geotechnical engineer who would lead this project is not a mold prevention consultant; none of the services being offered have been designed or proposed for the purpose of mold prevention.

Have the Geotechnical Engineer Work with Other Design Professionals and Constructors Other design team members' misinterpretation of a geotechnical engineering report has resulted in costly problems. Manage that risk by having your geotechnical engineer confer with appropriate members of the design team before finalizing the scope of geotechnical service (as suggested above), and, again, after submitting the report. Also retain your geotechnical engineer to review pertinent elements of the design team members' plans and specifications.

Reduce the risk of unanticipated conditions claims that can occur when constructors misinterpret or misunderstand the purposes of a geotechnical engineering report. Use appropriate language in your contract documents, Retain your geotechnical engineer to participate in prebid and preconstruction conferences, and to perform construction observation.

Read Responsibility Provisions Closely

Clients, design professionals, and constructors who do not recognize that geotechnical engineering is far less exact than other engineering disciplines can develop unrealistic expectations. Unrealistic expectations can lead to disappointments, claims, and disputes. To help reduce the risk of such outcomes, geotechnical engineers commonly include a variety of explanatory provisions in their proposals. Sometimes labeled "limitations," many of these provisions indicate where geotechnical engineers' responsibilities begin and end, to help others recognize their own responsibilities and risks, thus to encourage more effective scopes of service. Read this proposal's provisions closely. Ask questions. Your geotechnical engineer should respond fully and frankly.

Rely on Your Geotechnical Engineer for Additional Assistance

AGREEMENT (Highway Construction & Maintenance)

THIS "AGREEMENT" is entered into to be effective as of the ______, 2025, by and among the COUNTY OF ST. CLAIR, hereafter "County" or "St. Clair County" and Calvary Pentecostal Church, hereafter "Developer/Owner" (each a "Party" and collectively referred to herein as the "Parties").

WITNESSETH

Whereas, the record owner of certain undeveloped land located in the City of O'Fallon, Illinois, St. Clair County, Illinois (the "Property"), which is legally described in Exhibit "A", attached to this Agreement and incorporated herein by reference.

WHEREAS, Developer intends to develop, and the Owner intends to operate the Property as a place of Religious Worship, as generally depicted on the site plan (the "Site Plan"), attached to this Agreement as Exhibit "B", and incorporated herein by reference (the "Development"); and

WHEREAS, the Parties, to facilitate the free flow of traffic, ensure safety to the motoring public, and foster economic development of the area, seek to complete the improvement work described in this Agreement in connection with the Owner's development of the Property.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

Description of the Improvements. The "Improvements" shall generally consist of: (i) parking facility entrance modifications according to the Calvary Church civil plan prepared by Millennia Professional Services dated the ______ day_of ______ 2025, attached hereto as Exhibit "C" and incorporated herein by reference (the "Construction Plans").

2. Construction/Installation of the Improvements.

- 2.1. <u>Developer's Work.</u> Any work that is to be performed on St. Clair County right-of-way, which is to be maintained by St. Clair County in the future, shall be done following the Illinois Department of Transportation ("IDOT") Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction in effect at the time of the letting for the Improvements and/or as shown on the Construction Plans and/or as directed by the County Engineer. This work must be performed by a contractor who is prequalified with the Illinois Department of Transportation in those categories relevant to the work being done.
- 2.2. Review of Construction Plans. The Developer agrees to prepare, or cause to be prepared, the plans and specifications for the Improvements. The County shall cooperate in good faith to provide its approval for roadway access in a reasonably prompt manner, for the Improvements. The Developer agrees not to award the contract for the Improvements until said approval is granted and notice to proceed is obtained. The developer shall obtain any permits, licenses, and approvals required for

- the performance of the Improvements work (collectively, the "Approvals"). The County shall cooperate with the Developer in its efforts to obtain the Approvals to the extent such Party's involvement is required in connection with issuing the Approvals.
- 2.3. <u>Material Testing.</u> Any material that is incorporated into areas that are to be maintained by St. Clair County must be tested following procedures set forth by IDOT by a consultant prequalified with IDOT under Special Services-Construction Inspection. The results of said testing shall be made available to the County upon request. The cost of said testing shall be borne solely by the Developer. Only those materials meeting the standards of IDOT are to be incorporated into the Improvements.
- 2.4. Temporary Construction Easements. The County agrees to grant and convey and does hereby grant and convey, to the Developer/Owner, its employees, agents, contractors, and representatives, a temporary, non-exclusive easement(s) over, upon, across, and under those portions of the public rights-of-way and other real property owned or controlled by such Party which are necessary for the construction and completion of the Development for purposes of (a) ingress and egress to and from the Property and the location where the Development work is ongoing; (b) the installation and construction of any portion of the materials, equipment, or other improvements constituting a part of the Development, as applicable and otherwise facilitating the construction of the Improvements and the completion of the Development, as contemplated herein. Upon request, any such temporary easements between the Developer/Owner and another Party shall be evidenced according to a written temporary construction easement executed by the Developer/Owner and such Party and in a form reasonably agreeable to the Parties, which may be recorded in the St. Clair County Records upon request of either Party.
- 2.5. <u>Construction Inspector.</u> Developer shall provide a professional engineer registered in the State of Illinois or a consultant prequalified with IDOT under Special Services Construction Inspection, to oversee any work being done on St. Clair County right-of-way, which will be the maintenance responsibility of the County when completed. The inspections must be in accordance with IDOT's "Criteria for Outsource Inspector". The developer must provide the name of the individual or firm performing the work, along with documentation of his/her/their experience, for County approval.

3. Maintenance of the Project.

- 3.1. <u>County's Maintenance.</u> The County shall maintain permanently all improvements lying within the right-of-way of Hartman Lane with the exceptions set forth below. The degree of maintenance required will be at the sole direction of the County Engineer.
- 3.2. <u>Developer's Maintenance.</u> The Developer agrees to maintain, or cause to be maintained, 1) The commercial entrance up to the westerly edge-of-pavement of Hartman Lane. 2) Curb and /or gutter along commercial entrance up to the point where it ties into the combination curb and gutter along Hartman Lane; 3) Pavement striping on the commercial entrance.

- 3.3. <u>Dedication: No Obligation of Developer/Owner.</u> Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, maintenance, repair, and replacement of any and all improvements constructed or installed as part of the Improvements which are not located on the Property shall be the obligation of (a) the Party owning the property on which such improvements are located, or (b) the County, as part of the public roadway system.
- 4. Insurance. The Developer agrees to cause its contractor to provide both property damage and liability insurance for the project. In order to protect the interest of St. Clair County and the Public Building Commission of St. Clair County, the Developer agrees that such policies of insurance shall name each of St. Clair County and the Public Building Commission of St. Clair County, IL, as additional insured with all costs to be paid by the Developer. The Developer agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the County for any acts or omissions made by their officers, agents, and/or employees in the construction of the project. The Developer shall cause its contractor/s to comply with the St. Clair County Standard Insurance Certificate Requirements as described on Exhibit "D", attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The Developer shall cause and require continuous workers compensation insurance coverage in amounts no less than required by law by any contractor working or otherwise using the County right-of-way under the temporary construction easement granted herein. Proof of coverage shall be submitted to St. Clair County in like manner to other required certificates of insurance.
- 5. <u>Irrevocable Letter of Credit</u>. The developer or its contractor must provide a performance surety, in the form of an Irrevocable line of credit payable to St. Clair County, equal to 115% of the value of the proposed work that is to be done on St. Clair County right-of-way for the improvements which will become the responsibility of St. Clair County upon completion and approval of the project. The amount shall be based on the Estimate of Cost as shown in Exhibit "E". This surety is a prerequisite to receiving a Notice to Proceed Authorization from St. Clair County. This surety shall be terminated thirty (30) days after written notice for a request for a final inspection has been provided to the county engineer by the developer. This surety shall only be extended provided by a detailed written report of corrections issued to the surety principal within thirty days of the request for final inspection.

- 7. <u>Default and Remedies.</u> Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, if a Party breaches any provision of this Agreement and fails to remedy such breach within twenty (20) days of notice thereof (unless such cure is not reasonably possible within such 20-day period and the breaching Party has commenced and is pursuing with reasonable diligence such cure), a non-breaching Party may institute legal action against the defaulting Party for specific performance, injunctive or declaratory relief, damages, and/or any other remedy provided by law or in equity. All remedies hereunder shall be deemed cumulative and not exclusive.
- 8. <u>Assignment.</u> No Party may assign this Agreement in whole or in part, nor any right or duty created herein without obtaining express, written consent from the other Parties prior to assignment; provided, however that Owner may assign this Agreement without the consent of any other Party in connection with the sale of all or a portion of the Property to a successor Owner. This Agreement embodies the entire understanding of the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and shall be binding upon and inure to the Parties, their respective successors and assigns.
- Governing Law/Venue. Any controversy or claim, whether based upon contract, statute, tort, fraud, misrepresentation or other legal theory, related directly or indirectly to this Agreement whether between Parties, or any of the Parties' employees, agents or affiliated businesses, or assignees will be resolved under the laws of the State of Illinois, in any court of competent jurisdiction in St. Clair County, IL.
- 10. Interpretation of Agreement. The terms hereof shall not be construed in favor of or against any Party, but shall be construed as if jointly prepared by the Parties, it being understood and agreed that each Party hereto had sufficient opportunity to participate in the drafting of this Agreement and to seek legal advice in relation hereto.

- 11. <u>Complete Agreement.</u> This writing constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof. It supersedes all prior oral and written understandings, agreements, representations, and negotiations.
- 12. Non-Waiver. No waiver by either Party of any default in performance on the part of the other Party, or of any breach or series of breaches, or any of any term, covenant, or condition of this Agreement will constitute a waiver of any subsequent breach or waiver of any term, covenant or condition of this Agreement.
- 13. Severability. If any provision of this Agreement shall be held to be void or unenforceable for any reason, said provision shall be deemed modified so as to constitute a provision conforming as nearly as possible to said void or unenforceable provision while still remaining valid and enforceable, and the remaining terms or provisions hereof shall not be affected thereby.
- 14. Modification of Agreement. No modification of this Agreement shall be effective unless in writing and signed by the Parties hereto. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall constitute or be construed to be a partnership or joint venture between the Parties or their respective successors and assigns.
- 15. Execution. This Agreement may be executed by facsimile, electronic or original signature of the Parties and in counterparts which, assuming no modification or alteration, shall constitute an original and when taken together, shall constitute one and the same instrument. This Agreement shall be deemed executed on the date of signature by the final counterpart.
- Survivability. The terms and provisions shall survive the expiration, termination or completion of this Agreement.
